Dear Friends,

Around our house we have the saying that, “Not having a plan is a plan.” Do you know what I mean? Have you ever aimlessly lost a whole Saturday not knowing what to do? Have you ever been hip deep in 9 projects unable to clear your head enough to make a next step? Waiting to make a plan while the timing for whatever you want to do slips by. Not having a plan IS a plan. And before you know it, your non-plan took you all day and you have nothing to show for it.

But sometimes the time for reflection and quiet IS the plan. In Psalm 46:10 we are reminded to “be still” and know that God is God. These days I am doing my best to center myself on the “be still” side reminding myself the stillness is an important part of a larger plan.

The Master Plan...

You have heard me say that *God’s Mission has a Church* and each congregation is invited to participate uniquely in God’s mission. I believe and I am excited by all of the potential this congregation holds. I am prayerfully listening for God to call us into a new reality. With great potential, we also have shortcomings that need to be addressed as well. As Lead Pastor, I need to remind myself to be a realist as we address growth areas and hope-filled as it is true that through Christ we can do anything.

This master plan takes into account several different strategies. First there comes a time to understand our context, a stillness, a time for asking questions.

Who are we? What does it mean to be a large congregation in this community? Who is missing? What have we always done? And what have we never done before? What are our gifts and what are our challenges?

This discernment takes time and even in the midst of this, ministry continues; we still worship together, study and celebrate. There are baptisms, funerals, meetings and weddings.

This master plan rests on Biblical and Lutheran foundations and much reading on successful and mission minded churches. It seems that there are nine strong marks of these healthy growing churches. They are:

1. Bible study
2. Discernment
3. Worship
4. Mission in daily life
5. Hospitality and Service
6. Stewardship
7. Education
8. Multicultural ministry
9. Evangelism.

The Small Steps....

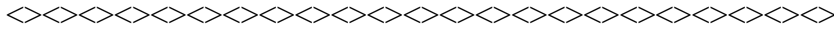
So, in the midst of the master plan comes the small step-times of quiet and discernment. Some of these steps all happen at the same time, many happening at the same time. While I continue to evaluate our context, I will continue to ask lots of questions. I will do this during our visits and maybe even in systematic ways like a survey or questionnaire. I will continue to collect information and learn more about our strengths and growth areas. At the same time, I will continue to minister, preach, teach and administer our sacraments. And as we enter into a new year of ministry with newly elected council members, we as a congregation will continue to engage these 9 marks.

The reality is that there isn't an easy list of do's and don'ts that fits every congregation. The reality is that with growth there often comes change and pain. But the GOOD NEWS, the Gospel, is that God's mission has a church and that even as we take these small

steps together God is there with us, equipping and encouraging us along the way.

It is my intent to focus on each of these 9 marks in my newsletter articles, each month reflecting on one of them. Sometimes there may be steps for us to take and other times there will only be questions. All the while, know we are on this adventure together living into reality God's preferred future for our own lives and the life of The American Lutheran Church of Windom.

Greetings,

In February we begin our Lenten Journey, which is traditionally a time in which we as Christians observe a time of fasting and repentance as we approach Easter. We do this as a way to re-orient ourselves toward God. As a way to continue in this tradition, some people will decide to “give up” something for lent.

This item which we “give up” is traditionally a personal vice, something that tempts you into a destructive behavior. When I was in college, this was a time when people around campus would try to give up smoking cigarettes. Now this could also have been due to the fact that Lent often begins in the coldest part of winter and they were tired of standing in the cold. Some of them were able to keep their fast throughout Lent, but for most of them, their Lenten journey stopped as soon as they slipped.

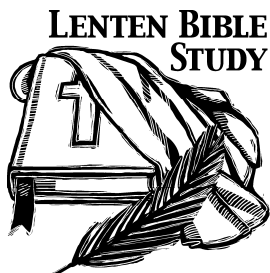
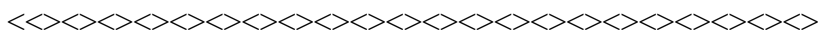
Now when I asked them why they didn't just forget about the slip up and keep up with the commitment they made, often I would hear, “Well what's the point now? I didn't make it.”

If this Lenten season you find yourself motivated to abstain or fast from a vice of yours—whether it be fast food, chocolate, or smoking—keep a few things in mind; we do these actions to grow closer to God, not necessarily to help us recognize the areas of our life we seek to improve, as a race or a contest. If we treat it like a race and then fail, it makes it harder to be gracious to ourselves, to get back up and continue on the Lenten journey.

While Lenten journeys are helpful to re-orient ourselves to God, we must remember to keep God’s grace always in mind throughout the journey. The point then of the journey does not become kicking a bad habit or being a better person but focusing on the true end of the Lenten journey: Easter. An end where we find redemption, even with all of our brokenness and vices; an end that changes the world and who we are in it.

I leave you with these words from the book of Hebrews, *“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.”* (Hebrews 12: 1-2)

LENTEN PLAN....

So often we ask questions of God. What next? Why me? How can that be? and many others. During this season of Lent, we are going to focus instead on the questions God asks. Particularly the questions God asks the first family in the book of Genesis.

Our Lenten Season begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22. We have two services at ALC that day, at 12 noon including the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion and again that evening at 6:30 pm.

A noon meal will be served on Ash Wednesday. Throughout the Lenten season, a Wednesday evening meal will be served from 5 – 6:15 pm in the Fellowship Hall. The Scholarship Committee and youth will take turns serving the meals.

Each Wednesday evening in Lent our worship will start at 6:30 pm following the theme of God's questions for us. We will be asked these questions:

Where are you?

Who told you this?

What have you done?

Why are you angry?

Where is your brother?

As we hear the questions in light of the stories of Genesis and of our own life, we will be better prepared for darkness of Holy Week and the Celebration on Easter Sunday, April 8th.

WHAT IS PASTOR JAY UP TO???

Did you know that Pastor Jay is working on his Doctorate in Ministry? It is true. Luther Seminary offers a distance learning program in Congregational Mission and Leadership. The program is 5 years long and every year Pastor Jay and 9 other pastors from around the country spend one week in January and another in July at Luther Seminary listening to lectures and working on group projects. For the 3 months before and the 3 months after each class, Pastor Jay completes his reading and other assignments from the comfort of his own home.

The main text book is the life of this very congregation. Each of the assignments focuses on one aspect or another of the American Lutheran Church in Windom and its ministry. Homework assignments and papers are directly related to our Church mission and future.

Pastor Jay pays for most of this Doctorate himself and it is quite expensive. Every three months he makes a payment of \$1000 and that doesn't include his books or travel expenses. Thankfully the ALC congregation allows Pastor Jay \$700 a year for continuing education. This is a blessing.

At this point, Pastor Jay is working on Quantitative Research Methodology for Congregational Revitalization which means that he is using survey questionnaires to gather information and then mathematically analyze the results. He is using this method to think about how we might better study the Bible as a congregation.

If the Good Lord is willing, Pastor Jay will graduate with his D.Min in May of 2014.
