



Don't doubt. Don't be angry. Grieve in secret. Fear those who are

different. These are the unwritten "rules" of modern Christianity that Dr. Jacqueline A. Bussie calls out in her award-winning book *Outlaw Christian*. For Dr. Bussie, a faith governed by these rules was stifling, unsustainable, and dishonest and the only way to keep her faith in God that she loved was to start breaking the rules.

During this conference, Dr. Bussie shares insights from Scripture and real-life stories and testimonies of finding faith through authentic engagement. She calls for a faith that laments, loves, laughs, longs, and lives, but never lies. She offers hope and practical advice for how to love across difference in these troubled and broken times of division.

Bishop Emeritus Dr. Munib Younan, from the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land will also speak at the Faith Conference. Through his experiences in an area marked by deep differences, Dr. Younan has seen firsthand the positive transformations that can happen when people of good will come together for heart-to-heart dialogue even when the issues are complex and the sense of divisions are great. He offers hope and relevant insights from his leadership experience in numerous faith organization's such as the Middle East Council of Churches, The Lutheran World Federation, and the Fellowship of the Middle East Evangelical Churches.



Holy Happy Hour Returns - Walking in the Light of Easter

Some time ago several of us enjoyed gathering at a local eating establishment for some good fellowship, a little Bible study, and perhaps something to eat. It's time to return to that opportunity for everyone – including you. And, friends of yours are always welcome whether members of ALC or not.

We called it "Holy Happy Hour." And it returns on **April 4 at 5:15**. We promise that each session will last no more than 40 minutes.

Our Bible study will be "Walking in the Light of Easter." We will pretend that Easter was not a one-day event, but, a continuing experience as we leave the brilliant light of Easter morning that was Christ's resurrection. The events of Holy Week and Easter are God's gracious and free gifts born out of God's great love for us. Discover what it means to walk in the light of God's love.

The lessons come from a series of Bible studies called Daily Faith Practices that are found on the ELCA website. Your facilitator will provide the lessons for you. April Noisy Offering; The Banquet:

The Banquet meal ministry was founded in 1985 starting with just one meal per week. We now serve 13 meals per week at two locations. The Banquet is a volunteer-based ministry, which means our meals are paid for, prepared by, and served by volunteer groups who come from Sioux Falls and the surrounding area.

In 2017 The Banquet served 196,000 meals, and at least 25,000 of those meals were served to children under 12.
