Pastors Message

Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing

—Malachi 3:10

One of the most important verses of the Bible for me is the first commandment: you shall have no other gods before me (Exodus 20:3) and just as important for me is Luther's explanation in the Small Catechism: we are to fear, love, and trust God above all things.

For Lutherans faith is extremely important. It is faith, the trust that Jesus died for our sins so that we are made sinless and are able to be holy enough to enter into eternal life. However, faith does so much more than just grant eternal life.

Faith is trusting that God watches out for you and that God provides what you need. Faith makes it possible to give away what we feel we may need to survive in order to serve God, trusting that God will give us what we need when we need it.

Throughout scripture people offer sacrifices to God. Sacrificing to God is an act of faith. It is a way for us to say to God, "Even though I feel I need this money to survive, I trust that you will not only use this for something great, but that you will also provide me with what I need when I need it." What Malachi says to us is to test it out and see if that's true.

Fifty percent of our members don't give an offering. For those of you who don't, try giving \$5 a week. Start low. What I want for you as your pastor is for you to trust God with your money. I want you to experience what Malachi says in that God does provide.

Now, I'll tell you what's going to happen as soon as you start: something will break down. Your car will need repairs or there will be a medical emergency, that's almost a guarantee. That's Satan's way of trying to prevent you from even starting. But listen to Malachi who says to trust God. Start with \$5 a week and go from there and see if God doesn't come through for you in the long run.

I was at a stewardship seminar and the 60 year old presenter said that he had never met an ex-tither. What he was saying was that once a person starts giving and experiencing that God watches out for them that nobody stops tithing because knowing that God watches over every aspect of our lives is worth more than the extra couple of bucks in our pocket. As God says in Malachi, "See if I will not open the windows of heaven for you."

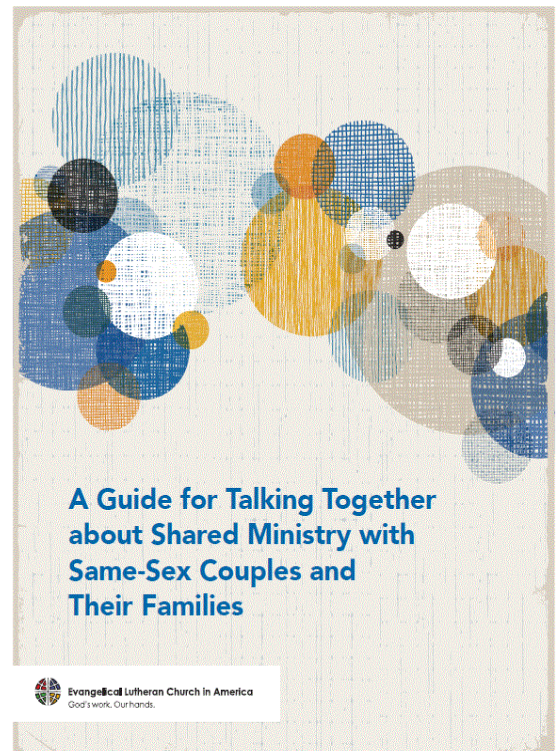

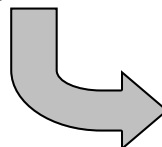


SHARING CENTER

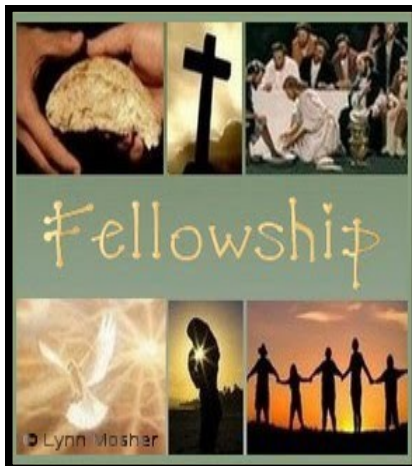

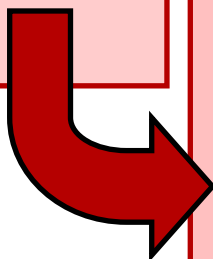

Summary of Minutes from ALC Council



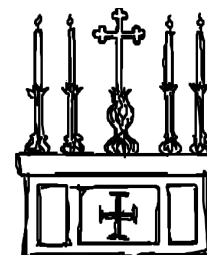
Tuesday, January 8th, 2019

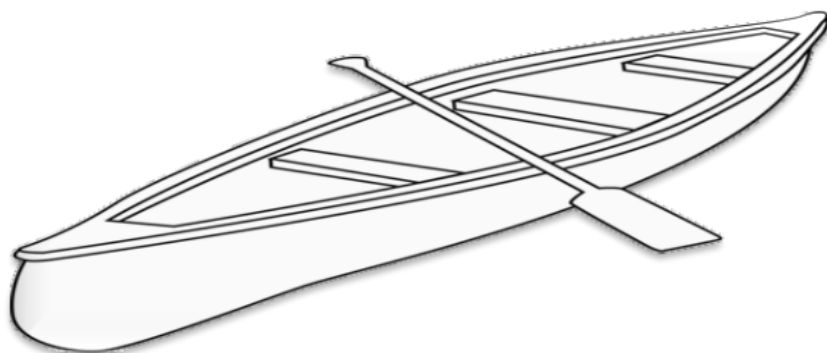
