

Pastors Message

Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly...

-Romans 12:13-16a

A group of us made our way to Equipping Congregations where we learned quite a bit. The first presenter spoke about the way we talk about our towns and our congregations. He noted that people have a tendency to talk negatively to new residents saying things like, "Why would you ever move here?" Or, "Our town used to be thriving but now it's a dying," etc.

The fact is that research shows that about 60+% of Americans want to live in a small town. Some of the reasons include a higher quality of life, a loving community, slower pace, and small towns are safer. Yet for some reason we feel this need to put a negative spin on a place where we all choose to live.

The same goes for our congregation. Now to be honest, ALC and Bethany are very impressive congregations. The buildings are well-kept, we are well-staffed, we have a wonderful abundance of artists from music to crafting, and as many people as we have worshipping here people still seem to know most of the people they worship with. That's something to not only be proud of, but to brag about; don't downplay our towns or congregations!

Share the stories you have of the Holy Spirit working in this place and through the people around town. Here's a personal sample story: as new homeowners Beth and I don't have many tools yet. We went to Runnings to get a roof shovel and it turns out they're not only out, but so are many stores in the area with a backorder of who knows how long. So I ask a neighbor if I could borrow theirs and next thing I know there's this thumping on my roof. That's right, the kids came right over, got up on the roof, and started shoveling snow. You know what they were doing the next day? Shoveling another neighbor's roof! (Thanks Clay and Chance!)

Since I've been here I have heard stories of people giving rides to people without cars, new people driving in from out of town because the people at worship are so friendly, I've seen people stopping in businesses to check on people who are struggling and/or ill, people chipping in money for kids who can't afford the youth trips, driveways being plowed out for those who are unable to shovel and on and on and none of these people are doing it because they have to or to get anything out of it, they just do it! You know what that is? The Holy Spirit acting through them!

We have the Holy Spirit active in our congregation and also in our town. We have a great place to worship and a great town to live in. People who worship with us and live here are blessed and we are blessed that they are here. So keep on being the blessing that you are while also being a little less humble so that you can brag things up and spread that good news about what God is doing here.

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM MARCH 2019 MEETING

- Constitution Ad-Hoc Committee MM by Cartwright and S by Michalski to add Michael Wojahn to the committee. Council approved
- Motion made by L..Jaakola 2nd by J.Shamp to approve Rhonda Haglund as Marketing, Steward-ship, and Discipleship Board Member.
- Spring ALC Campus Work Day L. Jaakola provided an update for a spring clean up day.
- Pastor Adam provided an update on constitution (from Annual Meeting). MM by Steve Johnson and 2nd by Keith Pohlman to accept proposed changes. Council approved.
- Pastor Adam and Lindsey Cartwright reviewed proposed constitutional changes/amendments to the ALC Constitution. MM by Steve Johnson/2nd by John Shamp to accept proposed changes according to document "Proposed Constitutional Changes". Council approved. Looking ahead, communicating the proposed changes to members ahead of the next congregational meeting will be important.
- Lindsey Cartwright provided an update on ALC's pledge to support Equipping God's People. This
 is a SW MN Synod initiative to boost synod ministries in a number of ways. ALC pledged \$7,500
 over 3 years. Two years have been funded

Constitution Update

An ad hoc committee was made to update the constitution. A new model constitution was put out by the synod in 2016 and one of the big changes was that the bylaws are now put underneath the amendments to which they correspond as opposed to the bylaws being a separate section. The new constitution doesn't change the way the congregation operates it is simply set up differently. If you'd like a copy please contact the office. At the next congregational meeting it needs a majority vote to become effective immediately.

We also worked on changing the constitution and those changes are listed below. If there is a line through anything that means those parts are being asked to be deleted. If anything is in parenthesis it means we want it to be added.

Amendments need a majority vote at a congregational meeting, then a 2/3 vote at the next annual meeting, and then the synod needs to ok them for them to come into effect. Bylaws need a majority vote at a congregational meeting and the synod's approval for them to come into effect.

Amendments:

C11.03. No officer shall hold more than one office at a time. No elected officer shall be eligible to serve more than $\frac{\text{two}}{\text{chree}}$ consecutive terms in the same office except that the treasurer will be eligible to serve more than $\frac{2}{\text{chree}}$ consecutive terms as treasurer.

(C13.11 **TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE** A technology committee of five voting members will be comprised of the audio visual coordinator, the media coordinator, and the remaining three will be appointed by the congregation council. The term limit for those appointed by the congregation council will be three years with at least one member being appointed each year. The Technology Committee will administer the technology of the church including, but not limited to: sound systems, video systems, presentation systems, office technology, website coordination, and volunteers to operate said technology.)

(C13.12. Committee terms are for a specified time period. Once the term is completed, a person may be reappointed unless specifically stated in the Constitution.)

BYLAWS:

- C9.06.01 In the event there is a vacancy in the office of the lead pastor, the incumbent pastor may continue service until the vacancy has been filled. The possibility exists that the incumbent pastor may be called to the position of lead pastor. In any event, the incumbent pastor shall submit resignation through the Congregation Council to the congregation within six (6) months after the new lead pastor has taken office. If the Congregation Council in consultation with the pastoral staff decides to accept such resignation, then the incumbent pastor shall then vacate the office. If it is the decision of the Congregation Council in consultation with the pastoral staff to retain the incumbent pastor, a new Letter of Call shall then be issued defining the responsibilities in the new pastoral relationship.
- C21.01.06. DISCIPLESHIP, AND-MARKETING, (AND) STEWARDSHIP BOARD (The Discipleship, and Marketing, Board and Stewardship Board will combine to make one board that shall) promote faith in Christ and the Good News of our Savior by welcoming all, and through our work together within the church, the community and beyond. Duties shall include but not be limited to: new members, promote and market the church, and work with the missions both locally and globally. They shall also lead the congregation to be Biblical stewards through the proportionate giving of their time, abilities, and money as they have been given. It shall be made up of seven persons elected by the congregation.
- C21.01.03. YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY BOARD shall consist of seven persons elected by the congregation for two-year staggered terms with a maximum of three consecutive terms. The Youth Coordinator will serve as an ex-officio member of the board. (The Youth and Family Board shall also be responsible for directing and assisting the youth coordinator in implementing programs and events for the youth organization and family organization of the church.)
- C21.02.01 b) is absent from three consecutive regular meetings of that board without cause. (The board member must be contacted by the Board Chair and/or the Pastor before the position is declared vacant.)

A Message from the Ondini Circuit, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa

The following was posted on Facebook on March 14th by our friend, Pastor Nkosi of the Ondini Circuit of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa. He served as host during our Partnership

Well I'm not trying to be theologically sound or eloquent. But...The season of Lent sometimes makes me feel like Jesus needs me more than I need Jesus.

At times I look at my life and I see so many faces at Ephangweni Community. Faces of people who love and support me. Whilst on the same time I read a passage of a lonely, crying, in pain, betrayed and tortured Jesus.

Yet when I drive around the community I see hands waving at me. Some are even shouting "hello Pastor". I see so many people who are willing to go an extra mile for me and with me.

Whilst Jesus is more vulnerable, meek, disarmed and a great crowd

that is screening on top of their voices "crucify him" or "Free Barnabers"

I feel like I wanna be there for him. Share some wavings and love with him.

I wanna be there with him praying on the mountain when his three disciples had fallen asleep. I want to be there when Judas gives him that poisonous kiss and politely say "may I have one too".

When the disciples fled the scene (including Peter who said "where you die i will die") and left him to be taken by the centurion i wanna say "i am as guilty take me as well".

When Peter denies him three times, I wanna shout and say "YES I Know Him! He is my Lord and Savior." When they handed him to Pilate, I want to join Pilate and wash my hands together with him and say "in deed we found no sin in this man"

When he is taken to the Cross and beaten, I wanna give my back and chin as well. Because he can do with some love. I wanna join Simon who helped Jesus with the Cross, I want to take turns until the summit of Calvary.

On the Cross can they get the fourth one for me because "I am by nature sinful and unclean."

Sometimes Lent calls us to be there for Jesus. Be there through this painful journey of the Cross. Be there with our sufferings. Mostly be there with love.

We can be there for Jesus through the poor, the vulnerable, the meek, the tired, the abused, the betrayed. Be there for Jesus through them and through yourself. The journey of the Cross is self giving. Being there for Jesus is being there for one another.


