## **Pastors Message**



"ALC is a fully inclusive church." This was a claim made by one of our church leaders this past month. I love that statement, and I hope and pray it is so. If Jesus could call the tax collector Matthew to be his disciple, is there anyone who is beyond the reach of who can be welcomed and received by us, Jesus' followers?

I am amazed and overjoyed by the diversity of people who are a part of our faith community. This is God's doing. It is the story told in the book of Acts how more and more people from varied backgrounds and identities came to believe.

Then Peter began to speak to them "Truly I perceive that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him." Acts 10.34.

Monday of Holy Week, the People First group had its monthly potluck in the Fellowship Hall. The wheel chairs got unloaded, and the participants came walking in excited to share food and be with friends again this month. A group of these people come every month from the DAC to refill the children's bags that we have in the narthex. Many of these worship with us. One of these joins the crew of volunteers at our Wednesday suppers.

We have a family where the husband and wife are both deaf. On Thanksgiving we bring in an American Sign Language interpreter so they can participate fully. On Easter we were not able to have an interpreter, but we provided written transcripts of most parts of the service, so the family could follow. I wish we could have a signer, or closed caption script on a screen for them every week!

We have been a congregation that welcomes all. That is why we have a ramp leading to the sanctuary, and an elevator to facilitate accessibility. We have devises to facilitate hearing. People have been welcomed, regardless of income, race, or sexual orientation. I thank you for the

welcome you have extended! We continue to be stretched and grow as a congregation to know how far that welcome will reach. Is a person really welcome if he or she cannot be married in this church to his or her intended partner? Then what the congregation offers is not for all, but only for those who are heterosexual. That is not welcoming or inclusive.

Easter Sunday was a glorious celebration of new life in Christ! God raised Jesus from the dead, and we too, get a new start. Our hope is renewed! For me, one of the most beautiful things is distributing the bread of Holy Communion. Hands are outstretched. No two sets of hands are the same. Yet, behind the hands are hearts and bodies that are hungry for Jesus. We all need what He offers: forgiveness of sin and new life. We are all equals at the table. Thank you, Jesus.

On the first weekend in May, we will be observing "Care of Creation Day." At these worship services, we will honor God for the gift of creation and pray for the land and those who care for the land. Individual




We will honor our graduating high school seniors at worship on Sunday, May 19.

To schedule your photography session, follow these steps:

- 1. **Select number in your group.** Using the drop down to the left, select the number in your group (larger families may require more time).
- 2. **Select day.** A calendar will now display showing the month and day of our photography sessions. If multiple months are available, an arrow next to the month will be displayed. Click on the arrow to advance to the next month.



- 3. **Select your session time.** A list of available session times will be displayed. Click the Book it button next to the desired time. You will then be prompted to register for your session.
- 4. **To complete your registration**, enter the information below (First name, Last name, phone, email, create login and password), then click on the Finalize Photography Session Button. (You must create a login and password to confirm your session. This will also allow you to return and change your session, if necessary.)

When your session has been confirmed!

A confirmation e-mail will be sent to you. You will get another reminder e-mail three days prior to your session. You may log in at any time to see your existing session.

## Contribution Analys

Hi, my name is Steve Johnson. I serve on the Discipleship, Marketing and Stewardship Board. At our last meeting we reviewed the 2017 annual report to 2018 report in contribution analysis. There was very good news in comparisons. I think many of us are concerned about the direction of our church in membership and giving. Below are some of the comparisons we drew out of our reports. One highlight being the number of contributors increased by 2%. Our overall giving rose by 12%, very good in light of a poor farm economy. We still have 55% who do not contribute in a way that we can track, but that has held steady for many years. Our ranges of giving have increased, especially from \$500 to \$20,000!! Our board and church thank you gratefully and God Bless!




