Pastors Message

When they had brought them (the apostles), they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them. –Acts 5:27-33

When Jesus was killed the disciples ran away and hid. Even after Jesus came back to life they laid low for fear of those who killed Jesus. In this reading we are told that something has changed. Somewhere along the line they have been teaching people about Jesus and they had been threatened by the same people who killed Jesus to stop what they were doing. Yet in this reading we hear that they did not listen to the authorities and that the same people who had killed before were enraged enough to kill again. What is wrong with the apostles that they would tempt fate and gamble with their lives?

The Holy Spirit is what's wrong with them, or, what's right with them. The Holy Spirit is the part of the Trinity that transforms our hearts and fills them with a love to serve Jesus no matter what the cost. It's that part of God that shows us how great God is and how much God has undeservedly blessed us with, so much so that there's no cost too high for us when it comes to serving God.


Kendrick Castillo is a recent example of this. Kendrick had three days until he graduated high school when a person entered his school and started shooting. Everyone's first instinct was to run or hide, Kendrick's first instinct was to charge the shooter. Kendrick tackled him so that his classmates could get safely away while he ended up losing his life in the process. What is wrong with an eighteen year old that he would tempt fate and gamble with his life?

The Holy Spirit.

The write-up on Kendrick paints a picture of a devout Catholic who loved and served Jesus; a person who knew where they would end up if they died, a person who followed Jesus' example of giving up everything to save others because he was filled with God's love; so much so, that there was no hesitation, just action, to serve Christ.

What does it look like to have so much faith in God that a person can risk their life for others knowing that God will ultimately take care of everything? It looks like Kendrick, an 18 year old martyr of a school shooting. May his trust in God inspire our own faith.


Christian Education & Youth News: JUNE


Summer greetings to everyone! I hope you had an aMAYzing May!

3. **Select your session time.** A list of available session times will be displayed. Click the Book it button next to the desired time. You will then be prompted to register for your session.
4. **To complete your registration**, enter the information below (First name, Last name, phone, email, create login and password), then click on the Finalize Photography Session Button. (You must create a login and password to confirm your session. This will also allow you to return and change your session, if necessary.)







CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM May 2019 MEETING



- Pastor Adam provided an update on the final class held regarding ministering to same-sex couples and their families. An ad-hoc committee is being formed to review ALC's marriage policy.
- Church constitution updates are on pace for the July 21st semi-annual meeting (continuation from annual meeting). All specifics were in the April Church Messenger, are available online, and copies will be made available in the church office.
- Approval of New Members– MM/S/C to approve new members Maria Ellingson, Charles “Moe” and Carol Lehman.
- ALC Youth and Family Coordinator Job Description– The Youth & Family Board has updated the job description of the Youth Coordinator to become the Youth and Family Coordinator. The mutual ministry team has refined the position to more closely align with church activities. MM/S/C to approve the updated Youth and Family Coordinator job description.
- The council discussed the need to look at personnel policies and review them.
- Judy Trotter provided an update on the Holiday Fair. 50% of the proceeds from Holiday Fair are suggested to be designated to the building project at Shetek Lutheran Ministries. The Holiday Fair committee is looking for additional ideas for the remaining 50%.

Worship and Music Board - Kathy Hiley provided an update. Denise Houston has resigned from the board.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship Board – Judy Trotter provided an update on the church directory/pictorial.

Discipleship/Marketing & Stewardship Board – no report

Trust Fund Makes Gift to LSS

Earlier this year American Lutheran hosted Pastor Kathryn Tiede from Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota (LSS). Pastor Tiede spoke at our Sunday morning worship and presented at a forum following worship. She described many of the services provided through LSS in all parts of our state. At the forum she gave emphasis to the huge number of at-risk children and teens in all areas of Minnesota for which LSS provides services. The needs of this segment arise from a number of issues including homelessness, sex trafficking, opioid crisis, and a lack of safe and sufficient parental support. Many of these young people rely on foster care. Many are awaiting adoption to provide them with secure and stable homes. The challenge is immense.

At the last meeting of American Lutheran Trust Fund committee the trust fund authorized a gift of \$2500.00 to LSS to augment the congregations budgeted amount of \$100.00. We thank the Trust Fund for this generous gift on behalf of ALC.



Worship at St. Dysmas

Plans are being made once again for ALC to attend worship at St. Dysmas with the inmates at the South Dakota State Penitentiary in Sioux Falls. **Our visit this year is scheduled for June 27th. Visitor information sheets need to be sent to St. Dysmas by June 10th** in order for the South Dakota Department of Corrections to grant us permission to enter the prison. Contact LaVern Christianson (831-4549) for the visitor forms you will need to complete. LaVern will send all the forms to St. Dysmas, so, make sure to return them to him prior to June 10th.

St. Dysmas is a congregation of the ELCA. **When visiting St. Dysmas you can expect a hospitable welcome and a dynamic worship experience.** Worship is the only place the men are called by their Christian names. Everywhere else they are known by their surname or number. Members (inmates) serve as ushers, lectors, musicians, and communion assistants. The men take pride in their congregation.

Because many of them do not receive visitors this is the only place they can enjoy conversation with someone other than those who are paid to be there or other inmates. The men hear the gospel from their Pastor but also experience the gospel through visitors to their worship.

Maria Ellingson, the bride to be of Dustin Thom, comes to us from her home congregation of Faith Lutheran Church of Wolverton, MN.

The following is from a correspondence from March 1 from the Partnership Chair in Ondini, Lee Mazibuko.

"I greet you in the precious Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and from God's word: "Be merciful, just as our Father is merciful" This reminds me of the foundations of our faith and more than that of Ondini Shetek Conference partnership. It is true that our partnership has existed for so many years because of this great teaching of Jesus Christ to have mercy on one another. A lot has been achieved in this partnership through the mercy that is grounded in the love of Jesus Christ."

He also communicated extensive rains that had caused flooding in some areas, gave a short report on their agricultural projects, and asked for our continued prayers for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa (ELCSA). Parishes and Pastors are working to keep their ministries going but issues between the circuits, diocese and the ELCSA as a whole are at a standstill.


