Songs stick with me. Here's one from VBS I learned as a child:

Love, love, love, that's what it's all about!

'Cuz God loves us we love each other,

I see love all around! Thank you for all the ways you are giving and receiving love!!



After one of our big summer storms a woman was trying to clean up and move a broken tree branch that was bigger than she. She took a tumble. The neighbor who saw her fall came to her rescue. He called for help. Turns out she had broken a bone. She was so glad for the assistance of the black man with broken English that happened to be passing by when she fell.

A man who has some time on his hands took another man whose health is failing for a summertime drive to his home town. They both had a great day!

The Bethany woman prepared BB's and homemade doughnuts for the farm sale of one of the church families.

We do so many things at church. We maintain property, we share meals, we sing and pray, we teach and preach the faith, but to quote the Apostle Paul, without love it's all a "noisy gong and a clanging symbol." 1 Corinthians 13.1

Even God's commandments are about love. God shows us how to be in a loving relationship with him, (Commandants 1-3) and then how to best live with our neighbors (Commandments 4-10). We need the second set because God loves your neighbor as much as God loves you (that can be a little hard to swallow!) and asks you to do the same. In fact the purpose of the church centers not just on each of us knowing the love of God in our lives, but that our neighbor knows that too! "So who is my neighbor?" To answer that question, Jesus told the story of the man going down to Jericho who was beaten, robbed and left for dead, and the only one who would help him was the "good" Samaritan, of the ethnic group that everybody loved to hate! We may just need a helping hand from someone that we may not have felt any connection to in the past. Can we learn to receive love in new ways?

September means a whole new school year of activities. Let us do all things in love. As we go about our business ask "Where is love in this?" If you can't find it, it may be time to re-evaluate, and try something new J That brings again a song to my mind:

"Love be our song and love our prayer and love our endless story; may God fill every day we share and bring us at last into glory." ELW 242 Awake! Awake and Greet the New Morn verse 4.

Noisy Offering This Month: Prayer Shawls

The Prayer Shawl Ministry was created to help those who suffer in body, mind, and spirit. Prayer shawls help individuals know that someone has been and continues to pray for them. It also encourages them to know that God is with them every step of the way, every day. Each Prayer Shawl costs about \$15 to make. Please consider donating to this great Ministry.

Recommendation from the Ad Hoc Committee on Ministry with Same Sex Couple and their Families to the ALC Council: What does this mean?

The recommendation leaves the question of marriage to the discretion of pastors, as it is within the call of the pastor to "offer instruction, confirm, marry, visit the sick and distressed, and bury the dead." ALC Constitution C9.03b.1. The recommendation suggests that the congregation trust its pastors with the blessing and burden of fulfilling the pastoral role of officiating at legal marriage ceremonies for all couples regardless of gender makeup, and that they be supported in their pastoral care decisions.

This means that a pastor may choose to marry or not to marry a same sex couple, in the same way that he or she may choose to marry or not to marry a heterosexual couple.

The Council has tabled the recommendation until its September 10th meeting to allow the congregation time to gain knowledge of the recommendation, and provide feedback to the Council. Please contact your Council members with feedback. Contact the Church office for contact information.




