

Pastor's Message

Noel and I have been enjoying the Dave Ramsey course Financial Peace University which teaches you how to get out of debt and live wisely with money, and even accumulate wealth. When you have money you can also share money in really great ways! This doesn't happen overnight, but by making following a set of principles, and time after time, not spending money you don't have, so that the money you do have works for you. It's about having a plan, sticking to the plan, and in your marriage or household making this a team effort. Money doesn't have to divide! Working toward a common goal and sharing resolve has a uniting effect. It is exciting to watch your situation begin to change through your own behaviors.

Here is my learning from last night's session: You can't buy happiness. You can buy fun. That is fine, if you have the money and it's in your budget. You can have fun with your money. Just don't expect it to make you happy.

Happiness is wanting what you have.

"I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me." Philippians 4.13

Paul is writing about a kind of spiritual maturity that I for one could use a little more of! Learning to be content with what we have would solve a lot of problems. The "secret" is what Paul says next: *I can do all things through him (Christ) who strengthens me.*

Lenae Bulthuis a Minnesota newspaper columnist writes about blessing, under the title "Harvest is a blessing when it bring you closer to God" (Thanks to Gary Natterstad from Bethany Lutheran who clipped this article for me from November 3, 2017)

Is blessing good health, great commodity prices, and everything harvested before Thanksgiving? Yes, no maybe so. Is it sickness, \$250 corn, and most of the crop harvested by Christmas? Yes, no, maybe so.

What is it to be blessed?

A blessing is anything that draws you closer to God. Blessing may be health, but it could be sickness. Blessing may be wealth, but it could be bankruptcy. Blessing may be ideal harvest conditions, but it could be battling the mud for every bushel.

May you have a blessed November!

Greetings Church Family!



Christians and Politics


