Pastor's Message

A Note from Pastor Adam

New Year's has come and gone and probably the majority of the resolutions made have been dropped weeks ago. To me New Years doesn't have any teeth. January first arrives and it's just another day in another year as life moves on; nothing really different than the other days before it.

Ash Wednesday though, that day has some teeth.

New Year's comes as a joyful party and you're flying high, Ash Wednesday comes like Death.

We get our forehead smeared with ashes as we're told that one day we're going to die. We don't know when. It could be forty years from now, it could be thirty seconds from now. As that day approaches, as I'm reminded that I'm going to die someday, the question that always comes is: looking at my life right now would I be fine with dying?

That question spawns a whole lot of other questions. What are the things I currently do that I don't like and know I need to stop? What are the things that I know are important that need more attention than I'm giving? And as that ash gets ground on my forehead, and as I look at everyone else's ash crosses on theirs, everywhere I turn to look I am reminded that I am only alive for so long and I need to quit wasting the time that I have been given and start making the most of it.

As Ash Wednesday approaches I encourage you to spend time in discernment and prayer. Ask yourself what things you need to stop doing. Are you doing anything unhealthy in excess? Are you judgmental, selfish, mean, gossipy, impatient? If so either try to give that up or take on the opposite. If you gamble excessively make it a point to save or invest. Take on being generous, take on giving more compliments, take on saying only nice things about everyone (including politicians), etc.

Ask yourself what you've been neglecting in your life that is important? How's your relationship with God? How's your relationship with your family? Try taking on reading a chapter of the New Testament every day, or making it a point to worship more, or to intentionally make time every day to pray. Try taking a more active interest in your family and listening more closely to what they say; ask questions and be engaged. Spend time doing what they find fun.

Ash Wednesday is coming and it ought to make us think about what we will be remembered for if we were to die right now. It ought to make us wonder about what we'll tell Jesus about our lives. If you have faith you will get into Heaven regardless, as Lutherans that's one thing we don't have to worry about, therefore we see this day as an opportunity to reflect on how we're living. With prayer and God's strength we figure out whom God wants us to be and try and make changes, not to get into Heaven, that's already paid for, but in order to live a life we're happy to have lived and a life that others are happy that we lived.

Blessings on your Lenten journey this year.

Remember to share God's love with one another. I encourage everyone to complete an act of kindness. A simple phone call or short visit can make someone's day much brighter.

In this month's scripture readings, hearts are overjoyed with healing, saddened with death, broken by evil doing, and mixed with fear and amazement at what was seen. The question that comes to mind is, "How would today's communities respond to these same passages?" Come, find a spot in the pews and hear the stories shared from the Gospel of Mark.

At the end of the month, our attention is focused on Lent. For six weeks, Lent provides a time for personal reflection. The selected themes, this year during the Lenten services, will focus on how people are connected to "God's Word" through worship and daily life. 





CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM January 14th, 2020 MEETING

- Windom Area High School Seniors Brigitte Beall and Jesus Cazares-Reyes presented details of their Windom Eagle Achievement/Senior Project, a goal of raising \$22,000 and packaging 100,000 meals through Feed My Starving Children. The project will involve over 500 volunteers (middle and high school students). The ALC Trust Fund has designated \$1,000 towards this project. The students were invited to present a Temple Talk/free-will offering for select services in February (Wed, Sat, and Sun services).
- Treasurer's Report Keith Pohlman provided an update. The church ended in the black in 2019 with \$6,345 carried over. The 2020 proposed budget was reviewed. The 2020 budget will be presented at the Annual Meeting. While discussing the budget, the church bus was discussed. Properties will review. MM/S/C (L. Jaakola & K. Pohlman).
- Nominating Committee Update The Nominating Committee has done an excellent job of filling nominations. A few open spots remain. Special thanks to all outgoing members for their service.
- Approval of Job Descriptions The council reviewed updated job descriptions.
- Boy Scout Update Pastor Sarah provided an update. ALC is no longer a charter organization. The council voted to withdraw via email proxy. The Boy Scouts have signed off on this effective January 9, 2020. The Windom Kiwanis will be the charter organization moving forward.

Board Reports:

Worship and Music Board – Kathy Hiley provided an update for the W & M Board. Lenten theme will be The Seven Wonders of the Word. Altar Guild has new members.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship Board – Judy Trotter provided an update. The Lutefisk Supper raised over \$980. \$500 will be gifted to the youth program. 114 people attended.

Discipleship/Marketing & Stewardship Board – No report/did not meet this month.

Properties Board – Linda Jaakola provided an update. Properties board made recommendation to go with Bargen on parking lot (bid of \$17K). The board will bring this back to the council this summer. A quote for cleaning the carpets was \$1,551.75, but additional rooms will need to be added/and an updated quote will be required. Eventually, some new carpet will be needed.

Budget and Finance – K. Pohlman provided an update. Bills are paid. Budget is set.

Christian Education Board – J. Shamp provided an update. Donuts with Dad is coming up & family days are coming for both Wednesday & Sunday BAM. Seeking different BAM curriculum for 6th grade.

Youth and Family Board – J. Shamp provided an update. A tubing trip is planned for Feb 23 & a youth trip is planned for March 28/29.

Church in Society – Dorothy Fundahn provided an update. Living Nativity was a success. 229 lbs of food & \$440 was taken to the local food shelf.

GLOW – Kathy Hiley provided an update. Successful Christmas party at the Sogge Campus. Sewing is going well & Bible studies continue.





Entering the Bible with Heart, Mind, and Soul

Lutherans eagerly affirm that Scripture is the Word of God. But what do we mean when we say that? 
