#### Returning to Worship during the Pandemic:

We look forward to welcoming individuals back to worship in the sanctuary the last week in June! We will offer two similar services: 5:30 PM on Wednesdays or 9:00 AM on Sundays, beginning June 24th and June 28th. Please know our concern is to provide a safe worshipping environment for those who chose to return to worship during the COVID-19 pandemic, while caring for and protecting the most vulnerable among us. In order to make a smooth transition, these are a few helpful items to remember:

**Entering the building:** Doors will be propped open for easy building access. You may use these entrances: Parking Lot: Try to leave a space between cars.

Skylight Court and Main Sanctuary: Suggested for those with mobility concerns.

Whichever one you select, please use the hand sanitizer. Wearing a facemask here and at all public gathering places is highly recommended. If you have a face mask, bring your own. There will be a few extras at the door.

Making your way to the sanctuary: Social Distancing within the building is a must: keep a 6-foot distance from others who are not in your family group. Please be aware of spacing between yourself/group and others in the hall/stairways. The service will not start until all have been seated.

**Making your way into the sanctuary:** Use the side aisles and walk down to where the usher is waiting, Seating will start in the front and with social distancing, the spacing and number of individuals per pew will be monitored. Those of the same household can sit together. Please follow the direction of the usher, even if it is not where you "normally" sit.

**Worship setting**: There will be adjustments to the worship. Congregational responses and singing will be limited. Instead of visiting with those around, consider using "wait" time for prayerful devotion, or viewing slide announcements. Everything for worship will be up on the screens. Please do not "sing along", but you are able to hum along, tap your toes, snap fingers or quietly speak the lyrics. The worship team is aware of your longing for what is familiar.

**Exiting the sanctuary**: Ushers will dismiss pews beginning in the back. Please exit using the side aisle, and once again be aware of distancing between individuals. Please do not linger in the church building. There will be no coffee hour or food served during this time.

**Other details**: If you are sick, have a fever, cough or any other symptoms of COVID-19, or have been in contact with a sick person please consult your health professional and stay home. Restrooms are available in the Skylight Court and in the office hallway. Water fountains will not be accessible. Stay only in the worship area of the building. Do not circulate into other areas.

Weekly worship is available: Online (Facebook/ Youtube) and on the radio. Any and all are encouraged to continue worshipping in this way during the pandemic.

#### Holy Communion beginning in July: Sundays July 5 and 26 and Wednesdays July 15 and 22

Due to the pandemic, we have not shared in the sacrament of Holy Communion since mid-March. We are hungry for this food, for this assurance of forgiveness, and for the presence of Christ in the bread and the wine! We have done a lot of thinking among pastors, staff, Worship and Music and the Altar Guild on how to share Holy Communion as safely as possible, as the pandemic is not over. Here are some of the principles that we are holding in mind:

- 1. keeping a 6-foot distance between people not of the same family.
- 2. not having unnecessary touching of the elements (touching only the bread or the wine that you will consume and not somebody else's etc.)
- 3. not having people move around during the worship service as that stirs up the air, and has you breathing the air of the people in front of you.

Here is what we have settled on:

The pastor will speak the Words of Institution as usual during the worship service.

Holy Communion will be served as you leave the sanctuary. An usher will direct you. The bread and wine will be set out on long tables, one in the narthex, and one in the Sky Light Court. You will pick up the wine and the wafer, while a person behind the table says, "The Body of Christ, given for you." "The Blood of Christ, shed for you."

It won't feel the same as kneeling together around the altar. Things cannot be like they were, yet you have shown amazing flexibility and resilience as a congregation and the ability to learn to do things in new ways, while still being the church together. Thank you! We will continue to learn as we go and change what we need to, as we learn.

#### **Ondini Circuit Letter**



A Letter from our Partners in the Ondini Circuit of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Southern Africa addressed to Dale Holmes, the chair of the partnership Committee of the Shetek Conference.

Dear Dale, Brothers and Sisters

We greet you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Worldwide we face the challenges of the Covid 19 corona pandemic. We have to avoid all close signs of comfort and encouragement. There are no services in church, no meetings of the groups and leagues, no hugs or handshakes and many more signs of close Christian fellowship, and we see the longer the lockdown lasts that people are suffering because the whole public life is in a real crisis people cannot go to work, lose jobs they don't earn enough money for covering their monthly expenses etc.

We as partners from Ondini Circuit see bad situation of many people and especially our pastor's families at the moment there are no salaries for the Pastors because of no collections or membership payments to fulfil the budget. A real crisis we are very touched about that because the strict regulations of lockdown does not allow us to go to church and collect offering so that we can able to contribute to our pastors salaries and we don't know how long this situation is going to last. Our pastors are going to suffer from starvation.

Above all this hardship we are going through we thank God who protects us and keeps us alive till now.

In Zamani Agriculture garden we cultivated brown beans which are ready now to be packed in bags and seek for market to sell it.

We were very shocked and sad about the incident happened in Minneapolis resulting in the death of Georg Floyd at the hands of police.

We wish you all in Shetek enough strength compassion and faith to overcome this hard time. We are with you in prayer. On behalf of our partnership committee and Dean S.D Xaba and all Pastors.

## **Pastor's Message**

When I was a junior in college, I enrolled in an urban studies program in Chicago. I lived on the north side on Lawrence Ave in Uptown, but a couple times a week I took the El train downtown to the Loop, then transferred, and headed west until I got to Cicero Avenue where I had an internship with a faith-based community organization working in recycling. I don't remember how many stops there were between the Loop and the edge of the city on Cicero, but I do remember with each stop there were fewer and fewer white people on the train, until by the time I got off I was the only one. It gave me a new perspective to be "other" watching my step at all times to not do the wrong thing and be safe.

For ten years I lived as a missionary among Africans who welcomed me as a sister, a friend, a teacher and a pastor. Many there called me Daa Sarah, "Big sister Sarah" It was a term of respect, but also endearment. They considered me like family. Over time I came to call many women "mother". Race does not need to separate. The Central Africans got use to me. Until I would go somewhere new. I remember traveling once when I was pregnant with Isaac or Eliana. I got out of my truck to buy some street food, and some one shouted from across the way "Bui baa zang!" The white woman is pregnant! Yes, white women get pregnant too. People are people. We are a sea of humanity. Black, white, brown. Young and old. Gay and straight. All wanting the same thing – to love and be loved. Good things for our families. Laughter and happy times. Enough food and clean water. A roof over our heads. Health. Friendship. To know God. Jesus came to help us find all of that: "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." John 10.10

During my seminary internship, I lived in East Boston, serving at Our Savior's Lutheran Church. The year was 1990. One of my projects was working with a group of Cambodian and Vietnamese women, newly arrived refugees, many with small children. I helped them learn English. They taught me how to eat their amazing food on a mat on the floor, and what it is like to be a survivor of war, and a newcomer in a strange land. They were happy to have made it to the United States. We in the church were trying to help them find fair housing, and help them not be taken advantage of, as so many landlords in East Boston were corrupt. Sometimes you must take a stand against injustice. "Justice is what love looks like in public." Cornel West, quoted in the Gather Women's Bible study, p. 20 June 2020

There is an amazing story in Matthew 15.21-28 where a Canaanite woman convinces Jesus that what he came to give to his own people was for her too! My hope for our congregation is that we be a community that models what that woman proved: *The grace of God is for everybody*.

"There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3.28

"He is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is the hostility between us." Ephesians 2.14

Yesterday I talked with a friend to check on him. We had first met sometime after I came to Windom. He came to the US from Mexico around the year 2000, when I was still living in the Central African Republic. Last time I talked with him, he said he had relatives in Ohio that were sick with COVID. Now they are OK. Praise God! But now, he told me, his wife just tested positive. She works in a meat processing plant. Her symptoms aren't too bad now. She's staying in another part of the house. Hopefully, the family won't get it.

COVID knows no race, but brown and black people are affected in much higher numbers because of where they work, and other health related factors. God help them, and everyone working in manufacturing lines, or on the front lines of distributing goods and services, caring for the sick, providing transportation, and styling hair! We sure need you all!

I was raised in rural white communities. It was a wonderful way to grow up. At the same time, I enjoy travel, learning languages, culture, many different kinds of food and music, and many different kinds of people because it makes life interesting, and shows what an imagination our Creator has to make us all so different, yet at the core, so very much alike! I continue to live in this community, because you called me here, and I love you! We need each other. Me, and my mixed-race family need a home and a community like anyone else, and you have welcomed us with open arms. You have shown the love of God to us in so many ways over and over again. We thank you. I thank you.

We are living in a tense time. We come at things each from our own set of experiences, and our own world view, whether it be on how seriously to take COVID-19, the question of race in America, or which set of politicians are trust worthy, if any. None of that is what brings us together. What unites us is a life-giving relationship with God that has knit us together as one body in Christ, so that others may know and experience the goodness and the saving grace of the love of God, in Christ Jesus. We will press on in this ministry, won't we? It is not always comfortable. The woodcuts around the cross in the ALC sanctuary remind me of that. Jesus shared these words with his disciples: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14.27



# CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM June 9th, 2020 MEETING

• Re-opening Team Recommendations and Survey Results - Bill T, Jane C and Pastor Sarah reviewed the document provided by the Re-opening Team, along



- with the results of the survey asking members about their concerns with returning to worship in the church building (see attached document). Motion by John Shamp to provide the opportunity to begin services at 50% capacity, beginning June 24, at 5:30, and June 28, at 9:00am, with the Wednesday service being recorded for the online service. Second by Steve Johnson. MM/S/C. Steve Johnson also provided a thank-you to those that gave their time and talents to the re-opening team.
- Commitments to Cultivating Community; Engagements Toward Racial Justice Pastor Sarah spoke on the power of our Mission Statement with cultivating community to love and serve, and shared the ELCA position of commitments of equality for all and inclusion. Discussion on how we react to people that are different than ourselves, how we hear narratives, and how we need to engage with people that are different than ourselves. Ideas to create programs and activities to include diversity were asked for; kickball, attending ethnic religious services, ALC's outreach, Holy Trinity Lutheran in Minneapolis and their work, taking a group to Holy Trinity to spend a day working with them, self-study and reflection with a book study, and a Celebration of Culture like Worthington, MN does, etc.) Send additional ideas to the pastors.
- Boards and Council Will Convene at the Church on July 7 and July 14 With Boards Back to Normal Times The Fellowship Hall is available for larger board meetings and the council meeting; Zoom is still available for those preferring its use.
- Tentative Worship at the Lake Church Service, July 12, at Cottonwood Lake since the city is not yet taking reservations for the parks, the date is tentative. Suggested that rather than root beer floats the purchase of prepackaged ice cream treats be done.
- Approval of Mid-Year Meeting July 19th Lindsey C shared his experience at an Arizona church service where their meeting was held during the service itself. Motion by Sarah Tailowright and seconded by John Shamp to hold our mid-year meeting during the 9:00am service on July 19.
- Approval of Bills Budget and Finance completed this task.
- Other Pastor Sarah provided information on the staff discussion concerning non-members utilizing the church during the pandemic. As our current emphasis is on the safe re-entering of worship, and performing it safely for those who desire to return to worship, events that are not related to worship will be declined at this time.

#### **Board Reports:**

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright reported that they held a meeting on the church lawn and discussed reopening.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Sharon Thompson updated the council on their lake service questions.

Discipleship, Marketing and Stewardship - Steve Johnson reported they did not meet as a board in May, but they are in discussion with the Synod and the ALC Trust Fund pertaining to gifting/estate planning.
