Worship and life at ALC during the Pandemic: October Edition

Thank you to all who have been working together to be the Church, together and apart during this time! We are the Body of Christ in this place. *In all things, may our faith be active in love.*

Lots happened in September. School began! Hats off to everyone working in our schools and to parents who are making the best of the time we are in, and keep our kids learning. At ALC we are doing the same! Confirmation began with about 40 8th and 9th graders, along with their Small Group Guides split between the Sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall. Our Christian Education program Bible and Me (BAM) along with the 5th & 6th grade program began on ZOOM as



most of our rooms do not allow our children to be spaced 6 feet apart. 7th grade "A Case for Christ" is meeting in our comfortable youth room. Yay! We are grateful to have been able to hold the funerals for many of our people in the sanctuary.

October brings colder weather and we will have to move gatherings like Worship at the Lake, Women's and Men's Bible study inside. The principals are:

Keep a six-foot distance from those not in your family.

Wear a face covering. (these are available in the church if you did not bring your own.)

If you are sick or have been exposed to someone with the COVID-19 virus, please stay home.

Please know that our ability to continue to meet in the church depends on each one of us adhering to these guidelines. We have been blessed to far. Thanks be to God! If the COVID positivity rate in Cottonwood County changes, we may have to implement changes here at church as well.

Weekly worship is available virtually! (Facebook/ YouTube) and on the radio and on cable TV. Technology has been a huge help when we can't all gather in person. Please tune in when you cannot be here in person.

Financial Contributions in support of the ministry of this congregation are received at the rear of the sanctuary at the close of each worship service. You may also mail in your contributions or contribute online through our webpage https://www.alcofwindom.com/ Thank you for your faithful support. We give because God gives to us. Our ministries share God's love!

Music in Worship: Since COVID-19 is an air borne disease, singing is a liability. This makes us sad, but we continue to have music! Piano and organ, song leaders, and videos will provide music while the rest of us hum along, tap our toes, and worship in our hearts and minds.

Seating in the sanctuary: Use the side aisles. An usher in the middle aisle will show you where to sit. Seating will be from the front to the back with social distancing. Those of the same household can sit together. Please follow the direction of the usher, even if it is not where you "normally" sit. When worship is over, you will be ushered out from back to front.



Pastor's Message

Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

-Romans 12:16-18

I remember being about eleven at my uncle's house one day and my uncle and my dad were talking politics. One argued vehemently for the Democrats, the other for the Republicans. They used logic, news articles, and history and it got heated. They were so passionate that if I didn't know any better I thought fists might start flying.

End of the day though we went home and nobody's mind was changed and to this day the one only votes Democrat and the other only votes Republican.

Christians are called to live in harmony with one another and called to live peaceably and I think we need to all work harder on that, especially me, especially in political seasons.

Saying mean things about a candidate (or anyone), even when true, in order to hurt them in any way, is not only something a Christian should not do, but it also doesn't change how a person is going to vote, but instead builds walls. Spreading Trump's locker room talk or posting videos of Biden being creepy with girls will not change voters' minds.

By all means, if justice needs to be had, we pray for that. But to simply drag a person's name through the mud to show others how terrible they are is not Christian nor helpful. Yes, morality ought to play a role in how we vote and if you find a candidate immoral enough that you can't vote for them then express your opinions in a non-inflammatory and kind manner if you are asked.

Also, lumping people into a generalized derogatory category based on how they vote also isn't Christian. To say all Republicans hate immigrant babies and want them caged and to say all Democrats are baby killers is not true nor helpful. No party is perfect, we know that, we do the best we can with the choices we have.

So how do we live in harmony and peace? There's about a 50% chance whom you want for president won't get elected. Do we just give up and wait another 4-8 years? No, we strive for harmony and peace. We talk about the issues and try to find solutions. Do both candidates seem to have some things in their past that creep people out? They sure do, but one of them will get elected and the question is how do we serve Christ under that president?

We focus on the issues, what works, and we compromise. I would say just about everyone wants to see abortion rates decrease to zero, so how do we get there? Sure, make laws the majority agree on, but research shows sex education and access to contraception significantly decrease abortion rates too. How can we work together bringing the best of both parties?

I would say almost everyone does not like seeing families torn apart at the border and that our immigration system needs extensive work, so how do we work in harmony to make this situation better?

We're not going to agree on everything, we're not going to fully get our way, but we can make things better through God's ways of peace and harmony, not by the ways of villainizing, mudslinging, and/or name calling. We Christians need to work a lot harder at that (myself being #1 in that department) and may God

bless us in that endeavor.

American Lutheran Church has stepped into the busy weeks of connecting with Jesus. Bibles are being blessed and placed in the hands of youngsters, Youth are participating in BAM/Confirmation, and teens will step into the next phase of participating in the community of faith as they renew their baptismal vows and share their faith statements.

There are a variety of services scheduled for October. American Lutheran Church will have 24 young adults who will participate in their Affirmation of Baptism this fall. With the larger class size and current COVID-19 guidelines, it has been decided to split the group into two groups.

Group 1 (Last names A-J) will be Confirmed on Saturday, October 10th at 11:00 AM.

Group 2 (Last names N-Z) will be Confirmed on Saturday, October 24th at 11:00 AM. In order to provide enough social distancing in the sanctuary, with the current guidelines, we ask that congregational members please acknowledge these individuals with a card in the mail, rather than attending the service. Further information regarding these services will be announced over the next few weeks.

On Sunday, October 11th, the Worship and Music Board and GLOW will highlight the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination of Women. This service will highlight several Ordained Women from our Shetek Conference. November 22, 1970, became a significant day with the ordination of Elizabeth Platz. She was the first woman of European descent ordained in a Lutheran church body in North America. Ten years later, April 13-16, 1980, female pastors from AELC, LCA, and ALC gathered for the first time. It was reported that people were uncertain if women's ordination would last. August 14, 2013, Elizabeth Eaton is the first woman of European descent elected as presiding bishop of the ELCA. Statistics from 1975 - 2015 indicate that the Cumulative Number of Women Pastors increased from 53 to 4,694.

Women's 50th Banners, Data from ELCA Research and Evaluation Reformation Sunday is the last Sunday of October. It is a time to remember events that guided Martin Luther in writing 'The 95 Theses'. One of his important statements was that faith alone, and not deeds would lead to salvation.

October seems to be the month of historic timelines. I have been known in my family as the 'Keeper of the Documents'. Recently, I came across my Certificate of Baptism, dated October 12, 1958. It was placed inside my Confirmation Certificate, from May, 1973. I have several favorite Bible verses, but the one I selected for that day was Romans 8:1; There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Spend time this month to reflect upon your history. Can you find your Baptismal and Confirmation dates? What are your favorite verses from the Bible?

Noisy Offering This Month: Winfair Backpack Program

This program provides weekend meals to Winfair elementary students in Kindergarten - Fifth Grade. Last year the program served around 75 students and is expected to expand this year. Generous donations from the community make this independent program possible, as it receives no school funding.



CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM September 8th, 2020 MEETING





- Other Jean Johnson questioned the church's status on returning fellowship with food. Discussion provided input on the state's documents on COVID and how to control the setting in a healthy manner. The subject will be returned to the ad-hoc committee.
- Approval of New Members with the correction of the spelling of Quintin Teitz and the addition of Cindy Clark, MM/S/C to approve the new members.
- Burger Bash Discussion John Shamp and Melanie Shamp shared plans for the event, asking for discussion by the council on thoughts of providing an outdoor event at this time. It was agreed that with an outdoor event, following the state's mandates, the event could be provided. Date set for September 20, a 6pm. MM/S/C

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright shared that Carol and Ronny Vought have an organ they would like to donate to the chapel. Thank you to the Vought's!

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Sharon Thompson updated the council on the cancelling of the Lutefisk supper. With many attendees being of the mature generation they felt it best to cancel for one year for health safety reasons.

Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship - Steve Johnson reviewed the boards information on the social media review numbers, with 1209 visitors to ALC's website in the last 30 days resulting in 6,580 visits and 8,644 referrals from Google. They will be contacting the youth to assist with the hand written notes being sent; continue to work on the Legacy Planning with a presentation on November 15; discussing ways to provide a New Member Welcome; studying the issue of how to do outreach in a digital world.

Properties - Linda Jaakola presented portions of the boards repair list, with the handicapped doors and parking lot being prioritized. Also noted was a review of the Fire and Building Code Occupancy Load is needed.

Budget and Finance - Keith Pohlman reported all bills paid and reminded the council that the budget forms will be sent out next month.

Planning Ahead

This is just a follow-up to the article written by Rev. Keith Pearson in September's Messenger. He is the ELCA Regional Gift Planner and was referring to different thoughts on planned giving and its impact.

As a retired financial planner, an often overlooked strategy is the use of beneficiaries on your investment accounts. You can name charitable (church, school, Red Cross...) beneficiaries on any accounts that you own and can designate from 1-100% of that named account to be paid our to the charities upon your death. Keep in mind, you always own the account during your lifetime and the beneficiaries have no control or knowledge of your account. As the owner, you also have the power to change the beneficiaries at any time.

Charitable beneficiaries work on any type of account that you own, whether they are bank CD's, mutual funds, stocks or retirement plans (IRAs, etc.). Accounts set up with beneficiaries also avoid probate. Another benefit is that the charities don't pay any income taxes on the dollars received from any account because they are considered non-profits.

There is no cost to set up or change beneficiaries, so it is easy and economical. If you have any questions on charitable giving via the use of beneficiaries, you should consult with your banker, financial advisor or lawyer. Feel free to ask me as well.
