Pastor's Message

Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. "Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

1 Corinthians 8:7a-13

In 2015 Dylann Roof entered a church and murdered nine people. In the following months there was a push from pastors at synod assembly to ban guns in congregations.

Many clergy spoke in favor and then one pastor said, "If there is a woman who has escaped an abusive relationship and is terrified of her ex, and the only thing that makes her feel safe is having a gun on her, well, I would hope she'd be welcome in the congregation I serve."

That statement turned everything upside down for me and I changed my vote.

We clergy came to that assembly firm in our faith and unafraid of dying. We came with hope for people like Dylann Roof, a hope that says if we die we know where we're going, but we want you to live so that you may have time to repent even if you're serving life in prison. We clergy were of the same mind, that if a gunman comes in then we do what it takes to subdue them even if that means taking bullets and therefore, we concluded, there is no need for guns in church. But what I eventually realized was that we were neglecting those whose faith was fragile.

I believe that this is the same situation we find ourselves in now with the mandates concerning gatherings and masks. There are some who have no fear of getting Covid, no fear of dying, and some who

believe God will keep them from getting it and I applaud your faith and courage. But, as a pastor who ministers to all people, maskers and anti-maskers, conservatives and liberals, courageous and fearful, bottom line there are people who are afraid of this virus. These same people feel comforted not only by wearing a mask themselves, but feel even more so when others do too.

I personally do not believe that guns should be in churches, yet, for the woman who is afraid and whose faith is fragile, for the opportunity that our congregation can strengthen her faith so that she does not need the gun to feel safe, then, I will let go of my opinions in order to strengthen another in faith.

So too with masks and gatherings. If I do not want to wear a mask and want to gather, for my sisters and brothers in Christ whom my choices make afraid, then, as Paul says, I give up my special knowledge and liberty so that I may not cause anyone to fall, or, in other words, I suffer inconvenience so that my siblings in Christ may be supported.

our King Jesus. May we suffer hardship for the opportunity to minister to those whose faith may not be as strong as ours so that it may grow strong.

May God's will be done. May we be humble servants of Pastor Adam



CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM November 10th, 2020 MEETING



• KLW Enterprises Stewardship Program - Steve J and Pastor Adam provided a review of the services and costs of this gifting/tithing program. MM/S/C to use their services for 4 months,

beginning January 1, 2020, at \$70 per month; to be funded from the Venture Fund. It was noted that upon discontinuing with KLW there is a requirement to pay the \$70 for the month following the last month of participation.

- Annual Meeting will be January 24, 2021, with the snow date being January 31, 2021. The Mid-year meeting will be July 25, 2021.
- Living Nativity Melanie has communicated with the chamber and city on our participation with the chamber's winter celebration, on December 17, 5-8:00pm. The city has approved placing the manager stage on the square; Mari Harries, with youth assistance, will provide 20% of her food proceeds to the youth fund; Melanie will contact parents for youth participation. Church In Society will do a food collection. The chamber will provide advertising, and we will do our own advertising.
- Nominating Committee MM/S/C to approve the committee members Kay Evers, Tammy Holtz, Sandi Bartosh, and Nancy M, (Pastor Sarah, Pastor Adam).
- Custodial Positions/Cleaning Service, Youth and Family Coordinator position and Christian Education Coordinator position Discussion on the budget and cleaning services option were discussed at length. While MMC has an upcoming interview for the custodial position, it was decided to create an ad-hoc committee to review church needs and budget abilities related to this position. The committee will be made up of Bill T from MMC, Linda J from Properties, Pastor Sarah, and Keith P of Budget/ Finance. In the short term, the DAC will be hired to vacuum and clean bathrooms on Tuesdays and Fridays.
- Strategic Planning/Council Retreat tabled
- New Members Approval MM/S/C to approve the list of incoming new members, with the addition of Luke and Alyce Hansen. New members include Jordan & Danielle Bunting with children Brody and Blaire, Jim Turner, and Rozanne Nelson with children Harlan, Ruby, and James Erickson.
- COVID-19 Concerns/Worship Services Sarah Tailowright and Pastor Sarah updated the council on the Thanksgiving and Christmas service plans. Thanksgiving service will be Wednesday, November 25, with a first come, first seated process. Per the Christmas survey results, it was determined it would be impossible to provide safe, in-person services. The board decided to create an online service entitled "Musical Journey To Bethlehem" which will have congregation members provide musical pieces. Plans to put the service online December 24. Pastor Sarah shared that this process will eliminate the challenge the ushers may have in dealing with large crowds and attempting to keep a head count; it will allow families to sing Christmas hymns while taking in the service; and the timing will also place it on the Windom cable TV. As in the past, there will be no Christmas day service. Services resume December 26.

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright shared information on Covid-19 concerns/ worship services moving forward. They are also discussing their budget.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Sharon Thompson had no report as the board had not met.

D/M/S - Steve Johnson updated the council on the church's brochure changes, adding photos with statements, doing member features, and KLW.

Properties - Linda Jaakola reported their discussion on the DAC cleaning services, updated the custodial job description, and handling the manger scene for the Christmas celebration with the chamber.

Budget/Finance - In Keith Pohlman's absence treasurer Lindsey C reviewed the bills that need to be paid. MM/S/C to pay bills as discussed.

Christian Education - Gina Freiwald shared the discussions on the Living Nativity, youth skits which will replace the youth events of Thanksgiving and Christmas, and their coordinators position.

Youth and Family - John Shamp updated the boards discussion on the coordinator's position and is looking to provide new board member names to the Nominating Committee.

Church In Society - Betty Olson reviewed the board's projects of food collection, and Thanksgiving Boxes.

GLOW - Jean Johnson provided a list of successful projects GLOW completed.

Planning Ahead


As a retired financial planner, an often overlooked strategy is the use of beneficiaries on your investment accounts. You can name charitable (church, school, Red Cross...) beneficiaries on any accounts that you own and can designate from 1-100% of that named account to be paid out to the charities upon your death. Keep in mind, you always own the account during your lifetime and the beneficiaries have no control or knowledge of your account. As the owner, you also have the power to change the beneficiaries at any time.

Charitable beneficiaries work on any type of account that you own, whether they are bank CD's, mutual funds, stocks or retirement plans (IRAs, etc.). Accounts set up with beneficiaries also avoid probate. Another benefit is that the charities don't pay any income taxes on the dollars received from any account because they are considered non-profits.

There is no cost to set up or change beneficiaries, so it is easy and economical. If you have any questions on charitable giving via the use of beneficiaries, you should consult with your banker, financial advisor or lawyer. Feel free to ask me as well. Any questions will be held in strict confidence.
