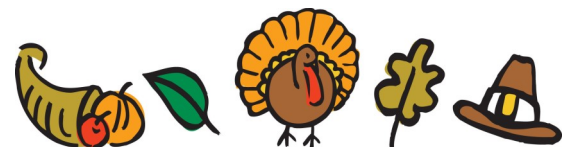

If you don't know this about me, I'm going to tell you now: my aspirations are always greater than my accomplishments. I never get done what I want to! I imagine myself beginning each day with a brisk what with my dog to greet the rising sun. I rarely do that. I subscribe to daily emails from writers that I don't manage to read. But sometimes times I do! One is by the writer Frederick Buechner. A bible camp director at Christion in the mountains of Montana used to read aloud from Buechner. It shaped me. Still does. Here's a little Buechner to get your November starter. We begin the month with All Saints' Day on Sunday, November 1. We remember those who have gone before us in death, along with our own place as sinners made saints not because we are so good, but because we have put on Christ, and he is good! *The best.* We are saints and sinners wrapped into one. Nobody better or worse than anyone else. All hungry, and looking to be fed.

Have an excellent November. Be sure to vote – its our civic duty, and what we each do *for our neighbor*. Take good care, and God keep us all.

Saint

IN HIS HOLY FLIRTATION WITH THE WORLD, God occasionally drops a pocket handkerchief. These handkerchiefs are called saints.

Many people think of saints as plaster saints, men and women of such paralyzing virtue that they never thought a nasty thought or did an evil deed their whole lives long. As far as I know, real saints never even come close to characterizing themselves that way. On the contrary, no less a saint than Saint Paul wrote to Timothy, "I am foremost among sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15), and Jesus himself prayed God to forgive him his trespasses, and when the rich young man addressed him as "good Teacher," answered, "No one is good but God alone" (Mark 10:18).

In other words, the feet of saints are as much of clay as everybody else's, and their sainthood consists less of what they have done than of what God has for some reason chosen to do through them. When you consider that Saint Mary Magdalene was possessed by seven devils, that Saint Augustine prayed, "Give me chastity and continence, but not now," that Saint Francis started out as a high-living young dude in downtown Assisi, and that Saint Simeon Stylites spent years on top of a sixty-foot pillar, you figure that maybe there's nobody God can't use as a means of grace, including even ourselves.

The Holy Spirit has been called "the Lord, the giver of life" and, drawing their power from that source, saints are essentially life-givers. To be with them is to become more alive.

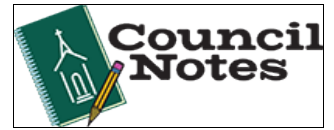

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM October 13th, 2020 MEETING



- Wedding Booklet Update - Sarah Tailowright and Jane Cartwright presented the updates to the wedding booklet, making it more comprehensive. Steve Johnson noted a need for information on the liability of any party plugging in their equipment to ours as in the past this caused damage to our system. Jane noted Worship and Music will address that issue. MM/S/C to accept the current update.
- Living Nativity - Current plans are to have a drive by event. Discussion involved concerns with the youth sharing costumes and social distancing, the number of community people that would be interested in a simple drive by, and supporting the food drive. Ideas of having food trucks or prepared pick up meals, coordinating with the Windom Chamber's holiday event, and supporting the food drive. Page Kern will contact the Windom Chamber to obtain information on their holiday event. Dr. Mary Olson may provide a virtual bake sale.
- Nominating Committee - calls are currently being made to fill this committee according to the Constitution.
- Reopening Committee Report - please see attachment in October agenda. Jane Cartwright reviewed the discussion the committee had and shared the agenda attachment. The provided information pertains to the future serving of food and not current practice. Dr. Mary Olson has recommended to "stay the course". Pastor Sarah has visited with a number of area churches and the majority are not serving food at this time.
- Donation to Lakeview Nursing Home - Keith Pohlman brought a motion to allow the Venture Fund to provide a gift of \$600 to Lakeview to update items such as large print hymnals, and other items to better serve their clients. Currently ALC does have members that reside at Lakeview. MM/S/C
- Racquetball Fundraiser - Page K updated the council on a mini-racquetball event to be held November 1, 2020.

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright shared information W&M prepared for the Thanksgiving and Christmas services. They recommend the Thanksgiving service by held Nov. 25, at 6pm; overflow in Fellowship Hall with live streaming provided there and to the community; the live streaming will be advertised to the congregation and the community. MM/S/C The recommendation for the Christmas services would be holding 3 services: Wednesday the 23 at 7pm, Thursday the 24th at 3pm which will be live streamed, and 10pm. Attendees will need to contact the church office for RSVP tickets to the service they want to attend so seating may be planned; if additional services are needed to accommodate the numbers they would be held at 7pm on Monday and Tuesday of Christmas week. Discussion included the challenges of seating, walk ins, the challenge this creates for ushers, use of the Fellowship Hall for additional overflow, the importance of advertising the services, and reminding people Bethany will have a service that can be attended. W&M has created a survey for the congregation to obtain information on Christmas service attendance. MM/S/C

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Betty Thompson noted there will be no pie social after the Thanksgiving service.

D/M/S - Steve Johnson provided updates on Stewardship Sunday, Nov 15. A guest speaker will be at the service, videos will be shown to the congregation, and a pledge letter will go out. The board is all addressing the updating of an ALC handout.

Properties - Linda Jaakola reviewed the ordering of the handicapped doors and opener, the repair of the bus instrument panel and asked that the parking lot repair be placed on the annual meeting agenda.

Budget/Finance - Keith Pohlman asked that the council okay the payment of the current bills as they did not have a quorum. Keith provided a review of the bills noting quarterly insurance billing was due, the bus repair bill, and the carpets had been cleaned. MM/S/C By recommendation from Wendy and B/F, the council also approved the benefit package of Portico Gold for full time employees. This is the package ALC has consistently provided . MM/S/C

Christian Education - Vanessa Tjentland reviewed BAM, using Zoom, and the Shamp Bible study. Currently there are approximately 40 students in BAM.

Youth and Family - John Shamp shared information on attending DARE2SHARE, the youth Bible study, and a city wide youth ministry program Nov 13-15.

Church In Society - Betty Olson shared the success of the clean-up event and the planning of the Thanksgiving Boxes (50 will be provided).

GLOW - Jean Johnson updated the council on the sewing days, the donations made to Shetek Quilt auction 2.0, the Christmas Cheer Box donation, and the bible study.

You may still use on-line giving on our website alcofwindom.com, mail in your offering to PO Box 188, Windom, drop it off at the church or simply place it in the offering plate. Planning Ahead

As a retired financial planner, an often overlooked strategy is the use of beneficiaries on your investment accounts. You can name charitable (church, school, Red Cross...) beneficiaries on any accounts that you own and can designate from 1-100% of that named account to be paid out to the charities upon your death. Keep in mind, you always own the account during your lifetime and the beneficiaries have no control or knowledge of your account. As the owner, you also have the power to change the beneficiaries at any time.

Charitable beneficiaries work on any type of account that you own, whether they are bank CD's, mutual funds, stocks or retirement plans (IRAs, etc.). Accounts set up with beneficiaries also avoid probate. Another benefit is that the charities don't pay any income taxes on the dollars received from any account because they are considered non-profits.

There is no cost to set up or change beneficiaries, so it is easy and economical. If you have any questions on charitable giving via the use of beneficiaries, you should consult with your banker, financial advisor or lawyer. Feel free to ask me as well.
