Christ by faith and in whom the Holy Spirit is at work to make them


holy.

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM December 8th, 2020 MEETING

- Melanie Shamp has given her resignation for both the Christian Education and Youth and Family Coordinator positions effective December 31, 2020.
- Council
- Annual Meeting will be January 24, 2021 at 10 am; January 31 will be the snow day meeting date.
- Mid-Year Meeting will be July 25, 2021.
- Living Nativity John Shamp and Betty Olson provided an update on the event, which will be outdoors and combined with the Chamber of Commerce's city event on December 17. ALC will have the manger scene for people to drive by to view. Dr Mary Olson will provide a virtual bake sale with orders being picked up that evening via drive by. Betty Olson there will be a food collection for the Food Shelf.
- Proposed 2021 Budget Treasurer Cartwright reviewed and answered questions pertaining to the projections and proposal. He noted that in the last 2 years the budget has been reduced by approximately \$30,000. Noted items were a 3% salary increase for hourly staff; an hourly increase for the Worship and Music Coordinator from 10 to 15 hours per week; Pastors to receive Synod Guideline salaries; Christian Education position will be for 10 hours per week; Youth and Family position will be for 8 hours per week and may be adjusted at the mid-year meeting if needed; Custodial hours will be 20 hours per week with the DAC providing 3 hours per week; it was noted contractual needs may also be needed at times for custodial services. Also noted was the financial challenge of budgeting during a pandemic, which affects the special services that receive extra gifts. During the discussion Linda Jaakola, of Properties, asked how the financing of the parking lot repair fits into the budget. It was suggested we pay off the current renovation loan and then apply for a new renovation loan specified for the parking lot. Pastor Sarah shared that this information should be presented to the congregation so they are aware of the need and funds needed. It was decided the parking lot should be on the January Annual Meeting agenda. The final budget will be presented to the congregation at the January Annual Meeting.
- Mutual Ministry recommends revised Custodian job description after review of the revised Custodian job description MM/S/C. Also approved was the hiring of Don Crowell as part time custodian, with the passing of a back ground check. MM/S/C

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright updated the board on the recording of the Christmas service and that they will be providing wax candles to households for their use.

Spiritual Life - Sharon Thompson reported they did not meet.

Discipleship/Marketing & Stewardship - Steve Johnson reported on the number of volunteer forms and pledges received, along with updating the household numbers using the electronic giving, which has increased. Pastor Adam is researching a small group app for devotions and discussion.

Properties - Linda Jaakola updated the council on the Living Nativity and the manger scene; the situation with the dead flies in the front of the church which for now will be swept up; a quote for treatment for the flies from Plunkets was received (\$300) which was for the fall of 2021. Also noted was Properties has decreased their budget for 2021 by \$6,000.

Budget and Finance - since there was no quorum, the council voted to pay the outstanding bills of \$3,096.49. MM/S/C

Christian Education - Jamie Frank updated the council on BAM. Proposed by the board was a motion to allow Melanie Shamp to continue as Christian Education Coordinator until a replacement is hired. While the board is willing to assist the position in any manner possible, they are working and helping children with distance learning, and will need Melanie's help. The ad-hoc committee recommended 10 hours per week for the position. MM/S/C to allow Melanie to serve as long term sub until the position is filled.

Youth and Family - John Shamp let the council know that Melanie has created a manual of Youth and Family events, activities, forms, etc., for the next coordinator. He also reported they will need to fill 3 places on the board.

Church In Society - Betty Olson reviewed the 50 Thanksgiving meals they delivered; since the local Lions Club also delivered meal, next year they will discuss with them the possibility of coordinating with them. It was noted that the confidentiality of income creates a challenge to obtain household names for the meals. It was noted the Living Nativity food collection will be done this year again and that the Food Shelf is in need of personal care items.

GLOW - Jean Johnson updated the council on the 36 Scripture Survival Kits they prepared and delivered to ALC members at Sogge, Remick, Mikkelsen, Hillside Manor, Heron Lake nursing home and Good Sam in Mt. Lake.

Planning Ahead

As a retired financial planner, an often overlooked strategy is the use of beneficiaries on your investment accounts. You can name charitable (church, school, Red Cross...) beneficiaries on any accounts that you own and can designate from 1-100% of that named account to be paid out to the charities upon your death. Keep in mind, you always own the account during your lifetime and the beneficiaries have no control or knowledge of your account. As the owner, you also have the power to change the beneficiaries at any time.

Charitable beneficiaries work on any type of account that you own, whether they are bank CD's, mutual funds, stocks or retirement plans (IRAs, etc.). Accounts set up with beneficiaries also avoid probate. Another benefit is that the charities don't pay any income taxes on the dollars received from any account because they are considered non-profits.

There is no cost to set up or change beneficiaries, so it is easy and economical. If you have any questions on charitable giving via the use of beneficiaries, you should consult with your banker, financial advisor or lawyer. Feel free to ask me as well. Any questions will be held in strict confidence.
