Pastor's Message

You are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God Ephesians 2.19

In my last call, there was a woman in town who was the girlfriend of one of our members. She had found a home with him, and in the small North Dakota town. He was a good man. He was raising her children. She didn't come to church so often, but this one day she did. I preached from Ephesians about how Jesus broke down the walls that divide us and makes us part of the family. Jesus hangs the welcome banner so that there is no doubt we belong. We are home! That sounded like good news to her, news she needed to hear. Who doesn't need news like that? How doesn't need to know that they have a place, are wanted and precious, and not an outsider anymore?



That is the kind of message that we get in the book of Ephesians. We were each born to a human mother and father. We each have our own experience with family. Through Christ we have been adopted as God's children! Nothing is ever the same. July 11th begins a 4 week preaching series on the book of Ephesians, and I can't wait to explore these themes with you all!

May you know that God is with you, loves you desperately, and will never leave you. May you know that in Christ, God is for you and not against you. May this knowledge open your heart to

others in news ways so that your relationships deepen, and hearts soften. May doors that were shut open. May nagging hurts be healed. May injustices that persist begin to weaken, as God's new creation takes shape.

In the meantime, I pray for rain, and that the sweetness of summertime may be yours, and that we all experience grace.

2020 Mid-Year Congregational Meeting

Sunday, July 19th during our 9:00 AM worship service.

God is on the move in our congregation. Make plans to attend. Agenda items will include:

- ◊ Financial Report
- The continued Ministry of our Congregation: results of the Council Retreat
- ♦ Synod Assembly Report
- Congregational Vote: Youth & Family Coordinator position- Motion recommended by Kevin Heggeseth and Lindsey Cartwright of budget and finance and passed by church council: "<u>Motion/2nd Sheryl Hanefeld/</u><u>Brady Mickelson passed</u>. Budget/Finance recommends that we explore looking for a Youth Coordinator shared equally with Worthington ALC. Financial compensation would be \$22,000 available from ALC Windom with matching funds from Worthington ALC. The shared position would be full time with benefits, shared 20 hours/week for each church."
 - Trust fund currently contributes \$10,000 towards the Youth & Family Coordinator position. Meaning \$12,000 would need to come out of the general fund to pay the rest of the portion. Anything that costs over \$10,000 needs a congregational vote.
 - The Trust fund committee will be meeting on July 13th to discuss keeping the contribution of \$10,000 or possibly a new amount they would like to contribute to the Youth & Family Position.

PROPERTIES UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the maintenance of the parking lot. Two years ago we requested bids for the upkeep of the parking lot. Bids ranged from \$18,773 to \$89,100. Under the financial circumstances, the Properties Board felt we would opt for the seal coat which would buy us a few more years of use before the existing surface would have to be removed. The deep holes and widest cracks have been filled and a coat of penetrating sealer applied. It doesn't look perfect, but it will get us through a few more years until our other financial obligations have been taken care of.

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM June 8th, 2021 MEETING

• Funeral Food Update - see attached Funeral Lunch Policy document; it was noted the work groups have been reorganized and when called, members will be asked to either provide financial support or volunteer to serve.



- President Michalski updated the council on the Synod Assembly
- Update on Parking Lot Fundraiser \$17,635 has been raised thus far; Linda shared they received only one bid for striping (\$1,600); motion made by Betty O to approve the bid with a second by Steve J with motion carried.
- Ad-hoc committee for hiring Youth & Family Coordinator The ad-hoc committee will meet Thursday, June 10. There is one applicant as this time. Pastor Adam is in conversation with Worthington churches discussing the possibility of sharing the position so full time with benefits may be considered. Lindsey C noted that Budget and Finance has discussed the situation and shared that the Trust Fund has money for the position, but there is a need to meet with the applicant to verify the benefits and time commitment they are requesting.
- Youth BWCA Trip Pastor Adam updated the council on the events the youth have done, and will do, to continue to raise money for this trip. The car wash raised over \$800; there will be additional car washes, hot dish sales, and coffee hours. If needed, they hope the Trust Fund and Youth and Family would support the trip financially.
- Jim Axford CPR Class Page K contacted Jim and he will be providing some possible dates for the class.

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah Tailowright updated the council on the decision to stop the Wednesday services for the remaining summer months and bring back the Saturday evening services, as there have been many requests from the congregation to have the Saturday services again. Wednesday services will return in the fall. It was noted janitorial services will then be needed Saturday evenings, which Steve J will organize. She shared that when the outdoor services are held the Saturday evening service will be recorded for the online listeners/ watchers; Lindsey C noted that there is a conversation to stream the outdoor services live. With the discussion of the fall service schedule the council again noted the work load of our pastors; Pastor Adam shared that with the open position of the Youth and Family Coordinator some pastoral care does not get completed, which is a concern. The demands of the pastor's schedules are already demanding, but with the added responsibility to complete the work of the Youth Coordinator it becomes very challenging.

Spiritual Life & Fellowship - Sharon Thompson reviewed the Father's Day and lake service treats they will provide.

Discipleship, Marketing, and Stewardship - Steve Johnson reported they did not meet.

Properties - Linda Jaakola updated the council on the electrical work that will be moved underground; they will seek bids to replace the parsonage water softener; and the basketball hoop will be replaced (Sheryl Hanefeld will research options and costs)

Budget & Finance - Keven Heggeseth reported we are at a positive position.

Christian Education - Melissa Dardis noted the VBS dates of August 1-5; they have a curriculum chosen for VBS and registration will begin soon. At their meeting they welcomed Tera Elness as the new Christian Education Coordinator.

Youth and Family - No Meeting

Church In Society - Betty Olson reviewed the success of the trash pick-up event with 24 participants and ice cream afterwards. The Banquet event will be on July 22 and the Block Party will be August 8. Fliers will be made and handed out in the church neighborhood inviting members and neighbors to attend.

GLOW - Kay Evers reported the June 15 trip/tour to Painted Vineyard has 28 women registered.

Applying Bible Principles

If you read annual reports from publicly held companies or banks, you will frequently see the word "fiduciary." Fiduciary is used as an adjective to describe something which is held in trust. It is also used as a noun to describe the one who is a trustee who must account for that which is held in trust.

For example, a bank president has a fiduciary responsibility to stockholders in the bank and to depositors who place their money in the bank. A company treasurer has a fiduciary responsibility to the owners of the company. A payroll clerk has a fiduciary responsibility to pay people what they have earned.

You may never have considered yourself a fiduciary, and you may never have acted officially in a fiduciary capacity, but in reality, you are a fiduciary. All of us are. That applies both to Christians and to those who are not part of God's family through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We who are Christians will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ. There, we will not be judged for salvation, since the penalty and judgment for sin was settled once and for all on the cross of Calvary when the Lord Jesus paid the price for our sin. Instead, when we stand before Christ, we will give an account of how we have used what God has entrusted to us.

Just as a bank president must account to stockholders and depositors on how their funds are used, we must account to Christ for how we have used what God has entrusted to us. Since everything we have rightfully belongs to Him, we will need to report on how we have managed His assets!

As you consider how you have used what God has entrusted to your care and keeping during the past few months, what kind of job have you done? And more importantly, as a "fiduciary" of what God has placed in your hands, will you stand before Him with joy, eager to report on your giving and management of His assets?
