Pastor's Message

All Saints' Day in Nov. 1 every year. We will mark that day in worship the week following. the bell will be tolled for each person who has passed from this life to the next and buried through our congregation since All Saints Day last year. Is everyone who dies a saint? Not by their own merit! It is faith in Christ Jesus that gains the believer that status and frees us from the power of the evil one, even death itself.

A pastor colleague told me a story. She had the opportunity to baptize an adult. This person had grown up as a Mormon and had felt herself condemned, never measuring up to expectations. She felt as though Satan himself had her in his grip, because she could never keep the commandments and ordinances of her faith. By chance one day she heard and evangelical speaker, who spoke to her of the love of God and the saving grace of Jesus. She heard this message that day for the first time. continued to follow the path of seeking out places that spoke the Gospel. That is how she came to be a At her baptism, she was given the opportunity to renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God. She was named a child God, sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. The pastor said to her: God will never ever let you go. "That day" she said, "I was free from the grip of Satan for the first time."

This is for real. The saving power of God in our lives is for real! It is for our living and our dying. The opposition to our life with God is real too. It's so real that many never manage to live a life with God. Maybe they were never taught, or invited, or it seemed fake, or not possible, or they just didn't care, or they were fine on their own, or they knew religious people that they couldn't stand. we were able to do something, so that more people could live a life with God? Wouldn't we want to?

There's a lot we can do! If you know someone in one of the categories above, pray for an opportunity to share what life with God means to you. Sharing the Gospel, the good news about Jesus is the work of every Christian.

DID YOU KNOW? The FUTURE CHURCH effort of the ELCA is to help the church reach new, young and more diverse people with the Gospel.

What does living life with God mean to you? Can you share that with someone who doesn't know what that life is like? Can you share what God has done for you? No one is excused. The purpose is not to grow our church, although that's a good thing too. The purpose is that people will be free! "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" Jesus in John 10.10b. I want that abundant life for everyone, don't you?

We will welcome New Members this month, remember the Saints, enjoy Holiday Fair, and celebrate Thanksgiving. We have a lot to look forward to, and opportunities to grow our faith. The vision of our congregation is "People experiencing a life-giving relationship with God" May more and more people have this experience, and may God make us bold to share our faith.

"Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace"

"Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" (1 Peter 4:10).

We are entering into our annual stewardship emphasis entitled, "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace." During the next few weeks, we will consider what it means to be a "faithful steward" and how our stewardship translates into practical Christianity.

This emphasis is built in its entirety on two concepts: First, God owns everything! As Psalm 24:1 states clearly, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." God owns it all and has never relinquished the title deed to the world. Second, our responsibility is to manage that which belongs to God which God has entrusted to us. In other words, all that we have is a blessing from God and represents that which God has loaned to us on a temporary basis.

What kinds of things belong to God? Certainly our time is a gift from our Heavenly Father that is given to everyone equally. All of us have the same amount of time — 24 hours per day. How we use our time is what makes the difference for this life and for eternity. Some will squander their time by giving priority to activities that carry little impact for eternity. Others will invest their time wisely for God's glory and for the good of others.

Our talents are also gifts on loan from God. Not everyone receives an equal amount of talents or abilities, but all of us can excel at something. Some are called to a public ministry whereby what they do is highly visible, including pastors, worship leaders, and teachers. Others are called to a less visible role in the ministry and work of the church. But all of us are given talents and abilities which can be used for God's glory and to strengthen the Gospel outreach here at American Lutheran Church.

The question is not whether we can do something for the Lord. The question is if we will use our talents and abilities to serve God. Unfortunately, many times, we offer excuses to avoid serving the Lord, excuses that often appear humorous when applied to other activities. Moody Monthly once carried an article which illustrated excuses people might use for not attending sports events. The analogy is easy to make in terms of serving the Lord.

Every time I went, they asked me for money. The people with whom I had to sit didn't seem very friendly. The seats were too hard and not comfortable. The coach never came to call on me. The referee made some decisions with which I could not agree. I was sitting with some hypocrites — they only came to see what others were wearing. Some games went into overtime, and I was late getting home. The band played numbers that I had never heard before. The games are scheduled when I want to do other things. My parents took me to too many games when I was growing up. Since I read a book on sports, I feel that I know more than the coaches anyhow. I don't want to take my children because I want them to choose for themselves which sport they like best.

On the second day of their conference at Yalta, Premier Stalin gave President Roosevelt a reason why a proposed plan would not work. Roosevelt gently reminded Stalin that this was not the same reason he had given the previous day. Stalin replied, "My dear Roosevelt, whenever you don't want to do something, one excuse is as good as another."

Stop and think about it: 80% of the work in most churches (including our church) is done by 20% of the people. The rest have made other activities a priority for their time and talents.

As one of the "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace" here at American Lutheran Church, will you go against that trend by making a commitment to the "Proprietor of the Universe" to use the time and talents that have been given to you to make a difference in the ministry and outreach of our church? Remember, as one of those to whom God has entrusted time, talents and treasure, God is counting on you. . . .

Giving has been strong, as have been expenses with the church being open with activities. Cartwright noted that the contract with Bethany is up for renewal in 2022 and should be discussed yet this year. MM/S/C to approve the treasurer's report. (Steve/Kay)



- Tabled from September Council Meeting: Mutual Ministry recommendation pertaining to custodial hiring There was no second to the motion.
- Nominating Committee President Michalski provided an update on the board numbers needing filling, and noted that the Nominating Committee is being formed.
- ELCA Insurance Plan 2022 (Gold+) Kevin Heggeseth brought forth a motion by Budget and Finance recommending the council approve the benefit package of Portico Gold+ for fulltime employees. (This is the package ALC has consistently provided) MM/S/C (Steve/Kay)
- Living Nativity Assignments President Michalski reviewed the board assignments for the December Living Nativity (December 8, 2021).
- Other A. Kevin Heggeseth, for Budget and Finance, made the motion to use up to 10 hours per week of custodial services, at a rate of \$13.50 per hour, at the discretion of Pastor Sarah, which will be evaluated at this year's end. MM/S/C (B&F/Kay) B. Linda Jaakola, of Properties, provided a list of items to the council suggested to be discarded, sold, or donated. A number of items may be used for the Holiday Fair and a Silent Auction. Kay Evers made a motion to dispose of the items at the Properties discretion. MM/S/C (Kay/Sharon)

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Kelly Kleven updated the council on Wednesday attendance (50 to 155); reviewed the Bible handouts.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Sharon Thompson reported that the Saturday evening meal was a success; they are discussing the Lutefisk event; will serve pies after the Thanksgiving service and cider at the Living Nativity.

Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship - Steve Johnson provided a review of the Welcome to Windom event (over 100 root beer floats provided); November 14 will be Stewardship Sunday; a draft of the Stewardship letter is being completed with the letter being mailed October 31; they have reviewed the volunteer forms.

Properties - Linda Jaakola noted due to harvest they did not meet this month; the water fountain on the third floor leaked causing some damage for which they are waiting for insurance to respond to; Pastor's office window to be fixed (also waiting for insurance response); waiting for snow removal bids.

Budget and Finance - Kevin Heggeseth brought forward a motion for B&F to provide up to \$1,500 for the Wednesday evening meals, to be re-evaluated at the end of this year (the funding will come from the Venture Fund) Linda Jaakola seconded the motion. MM/S/C

Christian Education - Vanessa Tjentland reviewed staffing for the Wednesday/Sunday School and noted current registrations are at 105 students; Bible distributions were completed and the Christmas Program has been chosen.

Youth and Family - Pastor Adam updated the progress for the Senior and Junior High Youth Gatherings; noted there have been no applications for the coordinator position and it is yet being posted.

Church In Society - Betty Olson discussed the challenges with data privacy and obtaining names to provide Thanksgiving meals to. Currently working Des Moines Valley and have 20 family names, but will do more if they receive suggestions from others.

GLOW - Kay Evers reported on the baking days for the Holiday Fair; 1200 rounds of lefse have been made thus far. (Bill Tjentland offered to provide taste testing)




