Pastor's Message

He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they?"

-Luke 17:16-17

Often enough Pastor Sarah and I get called to help people who are not members of the congregation. Since January of this year we have presided at at least six funerals for non-members. We have people in our nursing homes and on our home visitation lists who are not members. We have complete strangers stopping at the church or calling us at night who need help from the Helping Hands fund, whether that's gas, food, or a place to stay. Sometimes we just happen to be in the right spot at the right time for a stranger who needs our shoulder or ear, not to mention people who just want to have their kids baptized who really don't plan on ever worshipping here.

When I was a younger pastor I would always think that maybe that act of ministry would bring them to worship and grow the congregation and it would excite and motivate me. I remember being called to a young man's house who was in his twenties who was completely trashed and mourning for his stillborn son and as I was leaving he was telling me how he really needed to get his life in shape and back to church and he'd be there to worship in the morning and I never saw that kid again.

I look at our budget in which it takes over a half a million dollars to keep this place running every year and I think about how you all offer your hard-earned money and sometimes I wonder how upset y'all might be to find out how much ministry is done with non-members, especially when most of the time it will not get them in the pews nor will it get them giving an offering.

It makes me think of the time Jesus healed those ten lepers and nine ran off and never thanked him and he never saw them again. I would like to say that I wonder if Jesus would have still healed them knowing that they wouldn't even acknowledge him but I know he would have anyway.

Archbishop William Temple said: "The Church is the only institution that exists primarily for the benefit of those who are not its members." I believe that statement is true. That statement goes against our nature because we tend to assume the help we give will be, in some way, reciprocated. But, that is what Christ does to a person. Baptism kills our old way of living and Christ changes our hearts to look outward compassionately; looking to help anyone in need.

We become like Jesus who heals ten people, nine of whom don't return to say thank you. But just because we don't hear anything more about those healed lepers doesn't mean that they don't show up in someone else's life. We plant seeds in people to change other people's lives that they meet, just like people don't plant tree seeds for themselves, but for future generations. We may never directly benefit from being compassionate and helpful to strangers and non-members, but I am certain that those strangers and non-members will benefit others on down the road.

Imagine if the whole world acted the way this congregation does, helping non-members and strangers to benefit others. We would then have a world filled with people loaded with blessings to deliver.

The world won't change for the better if we only care about us and our own, that's why I'm proud you all for giving compassionately to strangers in order to send God's blessings away from us and into the world.







• Memorial and Honorarium Board - Lindsey Cartwright shared that Budget and Finance were developing a Memorial/Honorarium Board which will be placed in the Sky Light Court. The board will provide opportunities for donations towards items of interest to the donator. Boards were asked to discuss donation ideas and share them with Prov

 Youth and Family motion Pastor Adam shared the motion on the hiring for a temporary position to coordinate events for the 2022 Youth Gathering. Melanie Shamp is willing to fill this position. MM/S/C
- MMC recommendation to B&F on custodial position Budget and Finance motions to table the recommendation for one month to see if personnel and current job description are met, with supervision of lead pastor and Properties Board. The Budget and Finance Board also requested a copy of the current job descriptions prior to making their recommendation. Bill Tjentland reviewed MMC's discussion and financial input on the topic. Steve Johnson, who has coordinated the summer custodial weekend volunteers, reviewed how that had worked and was pleased with its success.

Applying Bible Principles

"... if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away ... everything has become new" (2 Cor. 5:17). Christians should have a different outlook on life, including money and material possessions. They realize that they own nothing, that everything they have belongs to God, and that they are only managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to them. Because of that, Christians should have a different attitude towards "things."

That attitude demonstrates itself in many different ways. For example, Christians show mercy and give, in contrast to those who borrow and do not repay (Psalm 37:21). Christians should hold possessions with an open hand, and "refresh" others with their bounty (Proverbs 11:24-25). They are honest and demonstrate their faith by their work and integrity (1 Thes. 4:11-12). They give to those in need and thereby demonstrate to a watching world the love of God (1 John 3:17).

When this kind of lifestyle is present in our lives, Jesus said that people will see our good works — our different attitude and perspective — and will glorify our heavenly Father (Matt. 5:16). And as we seek His kingdom first and foremost, we have His promise that He will provide what we need (Matt. 6:33).

As others observe you and your lifestyle, do they see any difference because of your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ? As they observe your relationship to "things," especially to money, do they realize you are a manager, a steward, and not an owner? Or stated another way, is the manner in which you handle money and material possessions a testimony to your faith in Christ?
