Pastor's Message

Are you ready for a change in 2022? Big changes start small. Fold your hands. Now switch the underneath thumb to the top. *How's that?* Feels strange, doesn't it?

A spiritual writer Rick Lawrence suggests a "Jesus Reset" to begin the year (see image of his 365 devotional book below). What he has in mind is the opposite of the perennial *New Year's Resolution*. The "resolution" is based on setting goals in areas of our life where we want or need improvement, and we're resolving to change our ways, form new habits and do better. That is admirable, well and good, and perhaps you've had some success with it in past years. In my own life I've maybe made a little progress in some areas over the time, but in other areas, I only seem to be going backwards! So much for progress, and self-determination...

Stay joined to me, and I will stay joined to you. Just as a branch cannot produce fruit unless it stays joined to the vine, you cannot produce fruit unless you stay joined to me. I am the vine, and you are the branches. If you stay joined to me, and I stay joined to you, then you will produce lots of fruit. But you cannot do anything without me. If you don't stay joined to me, you will be thrown away. You will be like dry branches that are gathered up and burned in a fire. John 15.1 -6 Contemporary English Version



I've been thinking about the vine wood carving above the cross in the ALC worship sanctuary. It has a very central location in the church. Did the church planners and the art committee that brought our building in being in 1950 have in mind the invitation that Jesus gives: *Stay joined to me, and I will stay joined to you. Then you will produce lots of fruit.*" What in invitation for the New Year!

Rather than aiming to improve in all kinds of ways in the coming year, what if we simply found a way to join ourselves more firmly to Jesus, and then see what happens? Will there be lots of fruit? I'm thinking there might be. It also sounds a lot less exhausting than the rat race of self-improvement that depends on me. Being reminded that I can't do anything without him makes me breathe

a sigh of relief. Instead of *trying* to achieve all the things that I'm resolving to do, *relying* on Jesus as the source of my strength will bring far greater results,

including peace and joy! Whew! Again, what a sigh of relief. It doesn't depend on me. Or you. Jesus is the true vine, and we are the branches. Here's the invitation: *Stay joined to Him!* And let's see what happens. I'm looking forward to it.








It's in the Library!!


WINDOM AREA SCHOOLS BACKPACK PROGRAM: We're

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM December 14th, 2021 MEETING

- Memorial Board Lindsey shared the status of the Memorial Board and some of the items noted on it; i.e. bibles, new signage, music for choirs, parking lot. Also discussed was the suggestion from Church In Society to reinstall the lighted cross that was over the south doors.
- COVID Recommendations With the Covid Committee recommending masks and social distancing for the Christmas programs and services, discussion on the topic determined the wording to the congregation and public should include a "recommendation to wear masks and social distance". Second by Steve. MM/S/C
- 2022 Budget Treasurer Cartwright provided a printed proposal of the 2022 budget, with an explanation of the staff
 cost increases based on inflation, Cost of Living, MMC job reviews, and the current difficulty of hiring staff. The
 wages/benefits of Region 8 were also used as an indicator of wage and benefit standards. The council was asked to
 review the budget and address the approval of it at the January 2022 council meeting.
- Clergy Housing Expense Designation Pastor Sarah asked for a \$3,000 designation within her wages to be set aside for housing allowance. This does not affect wages but allows a tax deduction for expenses she has related to housing. MM/ S/C (John/Steve)
- St Luke's church of Western ND synod requests permission to use ALC's sermons at their worship services Pastor Adam explained that the church he served in the past had a pulpit shortage due to a blizzard, so they streamed one of his sermons for their service. Synod notes that a pastor is to cut ties with a church they leave so it is not an approved process at this time. Discussion also addressed copyright, plagiarism, and possible royalty issues.
- Budget Auditors Lou Masters, Donna Gravley and Kathy Hiley were approved as auditors. MM/S/C (Mike/Betty)
- Trust Fund Representative Pastor Sarah will be the Trust Fund representative, replacing Pastor Adam. This change is based on the job description.
- Other Mike W shared the Shetek Conference Assembly date of Feb 20, 2022 and the need for a couple representatives. Mike also shared the possibility of creating a "Columbarium Burial", which holds cremation ashes. He will obtain additional information and report back to the council.

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Sarah T updated the council on the options they are considering for the electronic drum set (donate or sell).

Spiritual Life and Fellowship - Betty reported for Sharon that they discussed the combining of the boards (SL&F with Church In Society), which they approved of, and suggested keeping the board membership at 7 once combined.

Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship - Steve noted that his board felt they could go to 5 members if needed; he reviewed the results of Stewardship Sunday (43 pledge cards returned) and shared the idea of creating a picture collage of ALC events to include with the personal financial statements. Steve will visit with Gina concerning the collage.

Properties - Linda provided information on the replacement of 2 vacuums with commercial grade updates (\$799 and \$470) with an old one being fixed. She also shared the success of the donation/sell list they had compiled when Craig Zimmerman collected remaining items and placed them. A thank you will be provided to Craig.

Budget and Finance - Mike noted they have reviewed the current and proposed budgets, and suggest any overage from 2021 be used to replace used funds from the Venture Ministry Fund and the Emergency Fund. They will be reactivating the Zoom account (\$15 per month) and hope to be able to pay off the Renovation Fund early.

Christian Education - Linda read the written report provided to the council by the Christian Education board, which reviewed the children's participation in the Thanksgiving service and Living Nativity, the upcoming Christmas program, and the packing of the goodie bags for the Christmas programs.

Youth and Family - John noted that the youth have been very active with successful responses to Living Nativity, Holiday Fair, and the Youth Gathering.

Church In Society - Betty reported the success of their food drives. Thanks to all for their generosity!

GLOW - Linda read the report provided by Kay Evers, sharing the Bible Study times, Christmas Dinner with 54 attendees, their collecting for Lutheran World Relief and the dates for quilting and kit making.
