Pastor's Message

*O LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways.
Even before a word is on my tongue,
O LORD, you know it completely. Psalm 139:1-4*

I gave a survey to teenagers and was blown away at how many are suffering from anxiety and how they're afraid to be themselves around others. I talked with a school psychologist about this who mentioned there is an increase in suicidal teens. She mentioned that they're being videotaped and have pictures taken all the time so they have to constantly be looking "good" so they don't find themselves in an embarrassing pose that might make the rounds. Bottom line: our kids feel they have to pretend to be someone they're not in order to not be embarrassed or shamed.

It occurred to me the other day that we adults are not so different, especially when we're at church. It's my experience that most Lutherans are fairly private. We don't tend to share our struggles. Many don't let us pastors know when they're in the hospital nor ask for help even in the form of prayers and I wonder if we struggle with the same things as teens: fear of being embarrassed; as if people might think we're weak or there's something wrong with us.

I'm going to burst your bubble: everyone has their struggles and no one has it all together. What I love so much about the Church in its purity is that, that is the place where we ought to be ourselves and be honest with one another.

The Church is the body of Christ, a place where we ought to be able to scrape off our whitewash and be the person whom God knows we are. The body of Christ is filled with people who have the same struggles. The Church is a place where we believe that prayer changes things. Furthermore, the Church is a place with older adults who have gone through those same experiences and have wisdom to share, and time to be supportive and pray for our younger members. But how can the body do its job when we adults behave like teenagers? How can our teenagers fully be the people God made them to be when their Christian role-models are behaving just as they are? How can the body do its job when we're terrified to talk about what's really important in our lives and just say, "I'm fine."?

I don't have the answer on how to change this. All I know is that my adult congregants are struggling with being open about their struggles and our kids are in twice as bad shape as we are. How do we teach and model for them what it looks like to bare our souls and struggles and receive support, prayer, guidance, and wisdom? We know the world is divided and that that's not good, and while the Church may not be divided, we're not fully unified as a body either.

Again, I don't have the answers. I'm open to suggestions and conversations. All I know is that God knows you through and through and you can't hide your struggles from God. I know that the body of Christ is to be a supportive, prayerful, non-judgmental place to help all children of God with their struggles and to let them know that they are not alone. I know we are of little use if we are hiding who we truly are, struggles and all.

Your pastors are here to support you with anything you are going through so come to us with anything. Know that.

May we adults model not having to hide whom we are so that we can not only get the support we need, but that our kids may see how to get the support they need. May there be no topic or struggle too controversial that we cannot come together as a unified body to help support and nurture one another. May the Church be the example to our country and world about what being unified truly looks like.

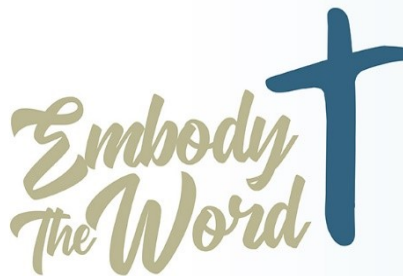

To many of you it is summertime! – better known here in Jamaica as “hurricane season”. The students have scattered from the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTCWI) to their various ministerial assignments, some as recent graduates. In the first festive in-person graduation ceremony to be held in three years, since COVID began, we celebrated the achievements of 21 graduating students, whose names, programs, denominations, and countries you can see in the photo to the right, taken from the bulletin of the valedictory service.

The break from classes gave me my first chance to be a tourist in Jamaica. I joined the Methodist students on a day trip to the famous Dunn’s River Falls, near the town of Ocho Rios on the north side of Jamaica. These falls are not a single, stunning cataract but a long series of smaller cataracts, and the thing to do is to climb up the falls. We went in a guided group, holding hands in a long human chain, such as the one that you see in the photo below. It was a lot of fun!

In August, before the next semester begins, I look forward to seeing some of you in person as I travel in the U.S. to talk with you about the work that God does through all of us as you support me at UTCWI. I will not have a chance to see each of you this time around, but if I have to miss you, perhaps we could connect electronically through an online presentation and discussion, which could take place at any time. 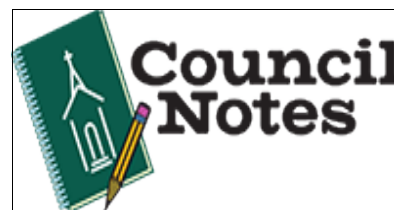

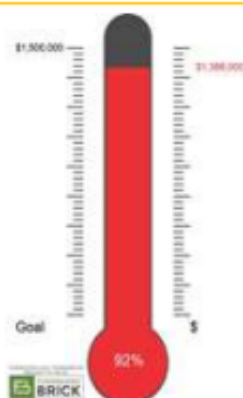
