#### Pastor's Message

Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. I will rebuke the locust for you, so that it will not destroy the produce of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not be barren, says the Lord of hosts. Then all nations will count you happy, for you will be a land of delight, says the Lord of hosts. -Malachi 3:10-12

In my years as a preacher I've sat through many seminars on stewardship and it has always felt to me that the common theme is trying to find ways to make people want to give an offering. I always come away from these things feeling like they're all about gimmicks. Gimmicks like finding something that will make people want to give an offering like funding Sunday school or paying the light bill. Or get people to desire giving an offering to church instead of buying a pizza. Or show people their excess and how to be generous with that excess. To me it often feels like manipulation. I know I'm an odd one but I'd rather have small-print bluntness than a sales pitch.

Giving an offering is a sacrifice. A sacrifice is giving up something you love, which will cause us hurt to some extent, that shows love and appreciation. A sacrifice brings back to us, in time, benefits, but that is not why we sacrifice, that's simply a byproduct.

The Bible is clear that everything is God's. The Bible calls us to sacrifice (give back) to God ten percent of what we make. The Bible also makes clear that that is not easy and that it's going to be painful. Which raises the question: why would we want to engage in behavior that causes us pain?

Tithing is very similar to exercise. Most don't want to start exercising. When you do start it causes pain, there seems to be no benefit at all, and most want to quit right away. But over time exercise gives you more energy, helps you feel better, reduces stress, and you get to a point where you actually get joy out of exercising and are thankful that you do it.

Sacrificing our tithe (giving ten percent of what we earn) is painful, it seems to bring no (immediate) benefit at all and most want to quit right away. But talk to anyone who tithes and they all have story after story of God taking care of their needs so miraculously that it puts joy and laughter in their hearts. Over time our sacrifices reduce stress after seeing how God has cared for us already. It makes us feel good about ourselves knowing our sacrifice is being used by God to bless others and to do good things in the world. We even get to a point where we actually *want* to sacrifice for the joy we get out of doing it.

So I don't have any gimmicks on stewardship. I do have small-print bluntness though: if you start sacrificing to God then it is going to hurt, you will probably not see an immediate benefit, it will take effort, and every part of you will want to quit immediately.

That being said, when you sacrifice to God faithfully over time you will see God do miracles that will make you happy and cause you to laugh. These miracles will cause your anxiety to decrease and you will feel better as you realize God is always helping you. Not only that, you will even get to the point where you will look forward to earning money for the joy of offering some of it back to God.

You may not believe me, you may not believe the Bible or even God, if that's the case then do as God says in Malachi: put God to the test. Test if God doesn't look out for you when you sacrifice your tithe to God and test if your life doesn't improve when you entrust your finances to God.

#### **CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM** September 13th, 2022 MEETING

with indoor needs as called upon. MM/S/C (MMC/Mike)

MMC Custodial Hiring Update - Paul shared that MMC had provided an offer, but it was declined. With interim custodian, Judy Lindvall resigning as the 15 of September, and MMC will be exploring options for the indoor position. The outdoor position will be offered to Steve Anderson with MMC providing the following motion: To hire Steve Anderson for 5 to 10 hours per week for the outdoor position, pending background check. He may also assist



- Other Paul informed the council that Lindsey Cartwright will be stepping down as MMC chair and Bill Tjentland will be filling that position.
- Council verified that Pastor Sarah will have discretionary hiring ability, at \$13.50 an hour, for custodial assistance, part time.
- Mike provided a motion from MMC and Budget/Finance MMC recommends for overtime, with Budget and Finance passing the motion (Tim Heron/Brady Mickelson), for any non-salary employee who works over 40 hours, in a 7 day work week, is entitled to over time, which must be approved by the lead pastor in advance. 

#### SHETEK BUILDING ON THE FOUNDATION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

After several Temple Talks at all worship services and written information shared with the congregation, participation in Shetek's Congregational *Building on the Foundation* Campaign has begun. We have set a goal of raising \$25,000 over the next 3 years, which will support the construction of the lodge and provide naming rights to a wing of sleeping rooms in the new lodge. The new lodge is nearing completion proving to be a beautiful and functional year-round space for camping, retreats, meetings and ministry opportunities. # There are currently challenges and limitations that stand in the way of more ministry opportunities for congregations, families and individuals:


- The cabins are more than 80 years old and do not meet the campers' (nor their parents') expectations.
- 2. Campers are uncomfortable using the current bathhouse.
- Our strategic planning process identified the need for expanding the year-round programming opportunities. That is not possible without more winterized facilities.
- 4. The water treatment system needs to be upgraded.

#### SOLUTION ONE - A New Adult/Youth Lodge

This new year-round facility will host retreats and conferences throughout the year. It will include four separate sleeping rooms with bathrooms and showers in each and the lodge will also have a large meeting and gathering space. Capacity will be 24 adults or up to 40 youth participants.


It's just a foundation in the summer of 2021 but what a great facility the new Youth/Adult Lodge will be.











Two new year-round duplex cabins will be constructed. Each will have indoor plumbing, heating and air conditioning and an indoor gathering area. Each will accommodate 20 campers.




A third duplex cabin will be constructed when the campaign challenge goal of \$2 million is reached. The Building on the Foundation campaign exceeded \$1.25 million in gifts and pledges in early 2021.

This generous response made it possible to begin construction of the Adult/Youth facility in the summer of 2021. Another \$750,000 in gifts and pledges will be needed in order to construct another new cabin and infrastructure to serve all facilities. This phase will also fund development of a new camp entrance and renovation of a current cabin into a year-round arts and crafts center

I don't usually give a title to my newsletters, but this one has a title: Connections. That was the theme of the summer for me, and many of the connections that happened this summer were with you! It was a joy to be with you, whether online or in the flesh.

I am often not as thankful for computer and internet technology as I should be, but I was very thankful to be able to use it to connect with those of who are members of American Lutheran Church in Windom, Minnesota, so that I could share with you a little of the work that we do here at the United Theological College of the West Indies in Jamaica (UTCWI). I had to be thankful for such technology when, just after arriving in Albuquerque, New Mexico, to be with those of you who are members of St. Luke's Lutheran Church, I tested positive for COVID and had to rely on the computer screen and the livestreaming technology to be able to connect, even though I was right there in the city. Nevertheless, the connection was truly live, as the community of St. Luke's stretched out to touch the churches of the Caribbean in several ways. During worship, the choir sang the Lord's Prayer in an arrangement by Father Richard Ho Lung, founder of the Missionaries of the Poor here in Jamaica. This arrangement is sung every week in many local congregations in Kingston. After worship, St. Luke's hosted a Jamaica-themed potluck and ate it surrounded by Jamaica-themed decorations.





I was able to be in person with those of you

from my home congregation, too, Trinity Lutheran Church in Madison, Wisconsin. It was my last stop before attending a large week-long gathering called the "Becoming Conference" in Chicago, which brought together all the people who work in the Service and Justice area of the ELCA, including all the missionaries. It was the first chance that we have had to connect in person since the pandemic began three years ago.

I returned to Jamaica inspired and so grateful to God for all these connections. 
