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## Pastor's Message



**Embody the Word** was the theme for the Churchwide Assembly in Columbus. Thanks for the opportunity to attend, as a voting member from the Southwestern MN Synod!

When the resurrected Jesus showed up to those walking on the road to Emmaus, things happened! When he (Jesus) was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him, and he

vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us, while he was talking to us on the road,

while he was opening the scripture to us?" Luke 24.30 - 31

Who *embodies the Word*? Jesus, of course! It's Jesus in the incarnation, who was God's living Word in the flesh. We understand that the Word is not only God's Son, Jesus, but it is also the living Word of God that acts in our hearts through the words of the Bible. We listen to God's Word through preaching and teaching. To *embody the word* means literally that God's Word through scripture and through our faith in Jesus gets into us, into our bodies! It gets lived out in our lives.

Here are some highlights of the Assembly:

**Really great music!** Lutherans tend to do music well. I came home with a copy of "All Creation Sings" a supplement to our red *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*.

**Lots of Lutherans!** We were over 800 voting members gathered from the 65 Synods of the ELCA.

500 years since Martin Luther completed his translation of the New Testament into German in 1522. Luther devoted himself to this task based on his belief that it is the Word of God that become the means by which God's grace comes to us. It needs to be in the hands of the people, read, and heard!

The election of Imran Siddiqui as Vice President of the ELCA. The Vice President chairs the Church Council of the ELCA and is the highest office of a lay person in this church. Mr. Siddiqui grew up Muslim and has been a Lutheran 11 years, bringing a fresh voice. He currently serves as Vice President of the Southeastern Synod in Georgia. He brings the experience of consensus-based decision making and commends it to the church as a way of deeply listening to each other and building unity.

An apology to the congregation Santa María Peregrina. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton apologized to representatives from the Latino congregation from Stockton, CA for the removal of their pastor by their synodical bishop on the Feast Day of the Virgen of Guadalupe which for Hispanic Christians is a very important festival. The action had overtones of racism. The synodical bishop has since resigned. The apology was accepted by the representatives who spoke about the hurt caused while offering words of forgiveness. This was a model of how to practice reconciliation.

A move to restructure the Governance of the ELCA The ELCA is now 35 years old, and a very different organization, living in a very different time than when it began from the three predecessor church bodies in 1987. The Assembly directed the ELCA Church Council to establish a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church to reconsider the principles of the denomination's organizational structure and the statements of purpose for its churches, synods and the churchwide organization, with particular attention to our shared commitment to dismantle racism.

Presentation of the Declaration of the ELCA to American Indian and Alaska Native People. Copies of the document, which refutes the 15th century Doctrine of Discovery, were placed on tables. Voting Members also passed a resolution encouraging ELCA entities to use land acknowledgements at their gatherings and to educate themselves about Indigenous peoples, and to deepen relationships with Indigenous peoples and tribal nations, while considering how, in the spirit of restorative justice, land could be returned to the appropriate Native American nations when selling or transferring property. A beautiful worship service was led by Indigenous leaders, including a drumming group from St. Paul, MN.

**Authorization to review "Human Sexuality, Gift and Trust** the social statement from 2009, which would "reflect current church understanding, church policy, civil law, and public acceptance of same-gender and gender non-conforming couples." An exploration of reconsideration of the four stated positions of "bound conscience" was also approved.

A lot happens at a churchwide assembly! It is important work, and I was glad to have had the opportunity to participate. The work, ministry and call to follow Jesus continues. Whether we do God's work in our congregation, synod, at the church-wide level or around the world, may we *Embody the Word* while doing it!







## **Shetek Capital Campaign**



When our children were young, we weren't fortunate enough to know someone who had a lake cabin. They would look forward to going to Shetek Bible Camp for a week. They would enjoy the swimming, games and worshipping out in nature. What they did not enjoy was the hot, humid conditions in the sleeping cabins, the orange hair from the showers, or the lack of electrical outlets. Starting in September, our congregation will participate in Shetek's Congregational Building on the Foundation campaign. We will have a goal of raising \$25,000 over the next 3 years, which will provide the naming rights to a wing of sleeping rooms in the new lodge. Steve and Jean Johnson are leading the campaign. They will be providing Temple Talks at all services sharing more information about Shetek Lutheran Ministries as well as guidance about how to fill out the Campaign pledge cards. ALC has a long tradition of supporting Shetek with campers, counselors and funds. Shetek has been there for ALC with staff for VBS and programming for our children. Let us be there for them on their 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary with funds to upgrade their water system and lodging!

## There are currently challenges and limitations that stand in the way of more ministry opportunities for congregations, families and individuals:

- 1. The cabins are more than 80 years old and do not meet the campers' (nor their parents') expectations.
- 2. Campers are uncomfortable using the current bathhouse.
- 3. Our strategic planning process identified the need for expanding the year-round programming opportunities. That is not possible without more winterized facilities.
- 4. The water treatment system needs to be upgraded.

#### SOLUTION ONE - A New Adult/Youth Lodge

This new year-round facility will host retreats and conferences throughout the year. It will include four separate sleeping rooms with bathrooms and showers in each and the lodge will also have a large meeting and gathering space. Capacity will be 24 adults or up to 40 youth participants.

It's just a foundation in the summer of 2021 but what a great facility the new Youth/Adult Lodge will be.









## **SOLUTION TWO - Duplex Lodges**

Two new year-round duplex cabins will be constructed. Each will have indoor plumbing, heating and air conditioning and an indoor gathering area. Each will accommodate 20 campers.

#### CHALLENGE GOAL - \$2 Million

A third duplex cabin will be constructed when the campaign challenge goal of \$2 million is reached. The Building on the Foundation campaign exceeded \$1.25 million in gifts and pledges in early 2021.

This generous response made it possible to begin construction of the Adult/Youth facility in the summer of 2021. Another \$750,000 in gifts and pledges will be needed in order to construct another new cabin and infrastructure to serve all facilities. This phase will also fund development of a new camp entrance and renovation of a current cabin into a year-round arts and crafts center

Your family's partnership and generosity is needed. Each family is urged to participate in this effort through a one-time gift or a three-year "statement of intent" (pledge).

As illustrated below, even relatively modest monthly or quarterly contributions will result in a generous and most helpful gift.

#### God's Work Our Hands Sunday

- Other Lindsey and Chris presented information on updating the router, firewall and camera controller. Technology Committee requests the upgrade as the current equipment is outdated, and the cameras will provide needed security. Lindsey has spoken with the Trust Fund and they have a technology fund for such expenses, and will provide up to \$3,000 for this upgrade. - Hiring Melanie Shamp as Wednesday Night Meal Coordinator MM/S/C to hire Melanie as agreed in previous meeting (Linda J/Kay E)
- Custodial Hiring Update MMC continues negotiations
- Changing ALC's Constitutional By-Law concerning groups who request the use of our congregational property Pastor Adam explained the current wording for C23.01.01 and C23.01.02 and the council's ability to alter the wording since it is a By-Law and not an amendment. Discussion on striking the last 3 words to provide more flexibility to the council in an effort to support future community needs. Motion by Paul J to strike the last 3 words; 2nd by Linda J. MM/S/C




