# Pastor's Message

Lord, let my heart be good soil, open to the seed of your word. ELW 512



I love to learn. Each passing day, month and year bring added discovery. Thank you for all the ways that you teach me! The men's table at Bethany just explained to me over coffee about the large white pile that I've been wondering about on the left side of the road just outside of Windom as I drive southeast on Hwy 71: its lime. It comes from ground limestone from points south of here. Some farmers spread it on the earth this time of year to replenish the soil.

Katie Chapman, the Environmental Education Director from Shetek visited ALC in October, sharing how essential are insects are to *everything*. I just learned that its better not to clear out all your garden in the fall, because insects need plant debris to survive the winter. "So be lazy and don't worry about cleanup until the weather is in the 50s come spring." OK! Good tip!

Noel continues to teach me about gardening. Some of what he knows he learned working the rich soil of his native Central Africa, and some he learned from my father, also an avid gardener. We are blessed with squash, and vegetables, canned and frozen, to take us through the winter.

Our Synod is providing learning for us for the field of God's kingdom work. We want the best knowledge and tools possible for the essential work of tending the soil! Check out the Equipping Congregations Roadshow coming to our neighborhood: Saturday Nov 5<sup>th</sup> @ First Lutheran, Marshall or Monday, Nov. 7<sup>th</sup> at American Lutheran in Worthington. (see flyer in this Newsletter). It would be wonderful if many of us could go.

Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good but in not, you can cut it down. Luke 12.13.8

Jesus tells a parable about a frustrated landowner who had planted a fig tree, but year after year it produced no figs. "This tree is wasting soil! Cut it down" he told his gardener. The gardener persuaded him to be patient, hang on to hope, and invest a little in the tree. Give it some Tender Loving Care, and a scoop or two of hog manure. Then see if it won't do better!

Aren't you glad that God is patient with us? God is the gardener in the parable, tending the soil of our lives to make it more productive and good.

That's why we can count ourselves and each other among the "saints" (We celebrate All Saints' Sunday on 11/06/22). Not because we are super-Christians, but because we are sinners who have received the forgiveness of God. When we look at ourselves in the mirror, we see the reflection of sinners, but when God looks at us, he sees those who belong to Christ, and whose sin is covered by Christ's righteousness. Wow, is that good news, because if it were all resting on me, the axe would fall in a hurry!

So, sinners and saints, I wish you a wonderful month of November as Autumn fades. May it be a rich time for our hearts that God the good gardener is tending, even as temperatures fall. Things will yet grow. Be patient with each other, as God is with us.



### **CHANGING THE CONSTITUTION UPDATES:**

- Council has voted to take the last three words off of the by-law C23.01.01 which reads: While the buildings of the congregation shall be open to all people to share in its worship, instruction, pastoral care, and fellowship, the congregation rejects all fellowship with organizations, secret or open, which are avowedly and religiously racist or violent or which practice forms of religion contrary to the Word of God and Lutheran Confessions. The change would make it possible for congregations of other Christian denominations to use our congregation for worship. This will be voted on at our annual meeting in January and needs a majority to pass it.
- Council has approved updating the constitution to the ELCA Churchwide standards. This will need a majority vote at our next annual meeting. The specific changes are in a document in the narthex. We can also email you that document if you wish, simply let the office know.

# <u>STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY NOVEMBER 13TH , 2022 "BEE GENEROUS"</u> (WED. NOV 9TH & SAT. NOV. 12TH)

Be on the lookout for ALC's Stewardship Letter (with more information) and pledge card in the mail! Stewardship Sunday helps bring awareness to all the activities, ministries, expenditures, staffing, utilities, and overall everything it takes ALC to

obtain our mission, vision, and goals towards Gods work! In the Bible it talks about tithing. A tither is someone who commits to giving 10 percent their of income to God's ministries—it is a biblical standard for giving that many Christians and churches set as a goal, an ideal, a benchmark.

To "BEE GENEROUS" makes me think of the scripture of how "Jesus looked up and saw rich people putting their gifts into the treasury; he also saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them; for all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:1-4).

Remembering the story of the widow's mite, we understand that some people may not be able to afford to tithe, or tithe right away. Some may wish to build up to it, or simply advance their giving as much as they can. Yet others may be able to exceed a tithe. Some people tally up all the charities they give to and count it as tithing, not just the church. Others give in many different other ways! Whatever you decide, may God bless you and fill

### FOUR STEPS TOWARD TITHING

For those who don't know where to start with tithing, here are four steps to help get you there.

**Step 1:** After prayer and discernment, set tithing as a goal. Celebrate with family and friends.

**Step 2:** Figure your current percentage of giving by using your 2021 church giving statement and 2021 tax return. Find your percentage giving by dividing your church offering by total income (best to start with after-tax, or net income), then multiply that amount by 100. For example, if a family had \$50,000 in income and offered the church \$1,200, the percentage giving would be 2.4 percent  $(1,200 \square 50,000 = 0.024$ , times 100 = 2.4 percent).

**Step 3:** Commit to stepping up your giving by an additional percentage amount (1 percent, 2 percent, 3 percent—whatever you think is right) every year until you have reached a full tithe.



# CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES FROM October 11th, 2022 MEETING



- Nominating Committee President Michalski reviewed the constitutional requirements for the Nominating Committee. Board chairs are asked to inquire within their boards as to which members will remain and which will be terminating their positions.
- ELCA Insurance Plan 2023 Mike W updated the council on the health insurance plan cost changes, with Budget and Finance supporting the "Gold" plan, as used previously. This will result in approximately a 3% premium increase, but is comparable to the other offered plans. MM/S/C to approve the "Gold" plan (Mike W/Sharon T)
- Living Nativity The date has been set for December 14 and board assignments for the event have been provided.
- Other Mark Brodin has resigned from the Technology Committee, feeling that they are able to now provide services without his oversight; he remains available for questions. The Council thanks Mark for his service to this committee and ALC in this capacity!
- Pastor Adam provided Synod Churchwide Constitution updates with a motion from Linda J and second by Kevin H to adopt those updates (MM/S/C)
- Cory Pohlman brought forth a motion to approve Abby Grove as a Youth and Family Board member to fill an open position until the ballot in January to with MM/S/C (Kevin H/Mike W)
- Mike W brought forward the information on the Synod Guidelines for rostered staff (Clergy). This would mean an increase of about 6 ½ to 8% in salary with the step-up (years of service). Motion by Mike W and second by Steve J to follow the Synod Guidelines. MM/S/C. Pastor Sarah and Pastor Adam both spoke to their comfort with their current salaries and appreciate ALC's support.

### **Board Reports**

**Worship and Music** - Karen S noted the many events they have had and will have including the Bishop's visit, the Youth Service, Wednesday Service's Praise Band, results to the Usher/Greeter, volunteer survey resulted in only 15 responses, they are organizing music for Living Nativity, and will have one member leaving their board with an additional position still needing to be filled.

**Spiritual Life and Fellowship** - While they did not have a quorum Sharon reported on an upcoming baptism, the Saturday evening meal was well received, Lutefisk meal will be January 7, 2023; the new round tables have arrived and been paid for from their budget with any additional donations replacing those dollars in their budget. They will provide Thanksgiving Eve service pies again and apple cider at Living Nativity.

**Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship** - Steve J shared that Stewardship Sunday will be November 13 and they are planning an adult forum after the service; new members will receive information on the various boards; updated the council on the Shetek Capital Campaign with ALC's donations being about \$10,000 thus far.

**Properties** - Linda J provided an update on the engineer's review of the drainage issue suggesting drainage to the Prospect Ave storm sewer and a rain garden. They will be applying for a grant which may provide up to \$5,000 for the project.

**Budget and Finance** - Mike W reminded the boards to complete and return their 2023 budget worksheets. They will have one open board position to fill.

**Christian Education -** Vanessa T reviewed the Girl's Night Out events, the success of the BEE day for Wednesday/ Sunday School, confirmation, the youth will be singing at Thanksgiving Eve service and participating in Living Nativity, this week's Teacher Appreciation meals, and the upcoming Christmas program.

**Youth and Family** - Cory P shared information on the numerous activities they are involved with. Teacher's Appreciation meals, numerous summer trips, Junior High Youth Gathering in November, FaithFest in February, the selfie park outing, summer work programs, and providing the soup meal at Living Nativity.

**Church In Society -** Adam provided an update on the renewed Lunch Buddies program and the need for assistance at Shalom Hill Farms for maintenance.

GLOW - Kathy H brought forward a motion from GLOW saying, "The Work Units of American Lutheran want to propose a change to the way we serve the funerals. It is our recommendation that we send a letter to all members of ALC in January asking for two things. One, are you willing to be on a worker list and two, if not will you please donate \$20 a year, or what you can afford, to cover costs related to the funeral lunch. The Unit Chairs will only have to call the workers. This will help them as they call so many people and the money they ask for does not always cover their costs. The Work Unit is going to ask the Funeral Directors for a \$3.00 donation per plate from the families instead of the \$2.00 they receive now. Costs have gone up." MM/S/C (Kathy H/Sharon T) The ice cream social at Michelson Manor was well received. The "Church Basement Ladies" event has 38 registrations. Their sewing days have packed 117 backpacks, 7 quilts which will be given to the local Christmas Cheer Box and December 1 they will be having their Christmas party.

# **Shetek Capital Campaign**

# There are currently challenges and limitations that stand in the way of more ministry opportunities for congregations, families and individuals:


- The cabins are more than 80 years old and do not meet the campers' (nor their parents') expectations.
- 2. Campers are uncomfortable using the current bathhouse.
- Our strategic planning process identified the need for expanding the year-round programming opportunities. That is not possible without more winterized facilities.
- 4. The water treatment system needs to be upgraded.

### SOLUTION ONE - A New Adult/Youth Lodge

This new year-round facility will host retreats and conferences throughout the year. It will include four separate sleeping rooms with bathrooms and showers in each and the lodge will also have a large meeting and gathering space. Capacity will be 24 adults or up to 40 youth participants.


It's just a foundation in the summer of 2021 but what a great facility the new Youth/Adult Lodge will be.











Two new year-round duplex cabins will be constructed. Each will have indoor plumbing, heating and air conditioning and an indoor gathering area. Each will accommodate 20 campers.

### CHALLENGE GOAL - \$2 Million

A third duplex cabin will be constructed when the campaign challenge goal of \$2 million is reached. The Building on the Foundation campaign exceeded \$1.25 million in gifts and pledges in early 2021.


This generous response made it possible to begin construction of the Adult/Youth facility in the summer of 2021. Another \$750,000 in gifts and pledges will be needed in order to construct another new cabin and infrastructure to serve all facilities. This phase will also fund development of a new camp entrance and renovation of a current cabin into a year-round arts and crafts center
