



<u>CHANGING THE CONSTITUTION</u> UPDATES:

- Council has voted to take the last three words off of the by-law C23.01.01 which reads: While the buildings of the congregation shall be open to all people to share in its worship, instruction, pastoral care, and fellowship, the congregation rejects all fellowship with organizations, secret or open, which are avowedly and religiously racist or violent or which practice forms of religion contrary to the Word of God and Lutheran Confessions. The change would make it possible for congregations of other Christian denominations to use our congregation for worship. This will be voted on at our annual meeting in January and needs a majority to pass it.
- Council has approved updating the constitution to the ELCA Churchwide standards. This will need a majority vote at our next annual meeting. The specific changes are in a document in the narthex. We can also email you that document if you wish, simply let the office know.



BUILDING ON THE FOUNDATION

Shetek Lutheran Ministries Capital Campaign

A new adult/youth lodge and year-round cabins – that's what this Campaign is all about! There comes a time when buildings don't function anymore and people's expectations change. Water, sewer and power infrastructures have been updated. The lodge is completed and will host retreats and conferences throughout the year. It includes four separate sleeping rooms with bathrooms and showers in each along with a large meeting and gathering space. Heat and air conditioning makes this a very functional year-round facility for years to come. The next step of Phase 1 will be two new year-round duplex cabins. Each will have indoor plumbing, heating and air conditioning and an indoor gathering area. Each will house two summer camp cabin groups. A third duplex cabin will be constructed if the campaign challenge goal is reached.

Have you been a camper at Shetek? Have you been a camper at another Bible Camp? Do you remember the joy of learning more about Jesus and making new friends? Have your children gone to Shetek camp or will they someday? With all of the new buildings and improvements, it will be the place to be this summer and years to come. CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FROM

December 13th, 2022 MEETING via Zoom (due to Weather)

(written minutes to be approved at the next Council meeting)

- Budget and Finance Mike W reported that the church's personnel policy does not provide for the 6% retirement option to non-salaried employees so they will meet with MMC to discuss and obtain a recommendation which will be brought to the council. The motion remains tabled until this is completed. Kevin noted any changes do need to consider future employee status and Pastor Sarah added this is an effort to align with the compensation recommendations of the Synod.
- Living Nativity Discussion on the weather situation's possible effect on Living Nativity with decision to wait until the afternoon to make any decisions. It was agreed that the Executive Officers will make the final decision.
- Housing Expense Designation Pastor Sarah explained the tax purpose of this designation and requested \$1,500 of her salary be designated, for 2023, as Housing Expense. MM/S/C (Steve/Mike)
- Clergy Vacation Request Pastor Sarah has 2 unused 2022 vacation days which she requested to be carried over to 2023. MM/S/C (Mike/Linda)
- 2023 Budget Yet to be finalized and will be presented at the January council meeting.
- Removed "Unapproved' Minutes in Messenger" item from agenda. This item was resolved by staff.
- Nominating Committee Update President Michalski updated the council on the status of filling the boards/ballot. Continuing to search for a president and secretary.

Board Reports

Worship and Music - Nancy provided the report via Karen's information; reviewed Living Nativity and the holiday service schedule.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship – Did not meet due to weather, No report

Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship - No meeting; Steve updated the council on the Shetek Campaign which has received approximately \$18,000 thus far.

Properties - Linda reported they will be working on the cross over the south door and the church outdoor sign.

Budget and Finance - Mike shared a request from Tera Elness to take the confirmation students to a Shetek Retreat which will be brought to Trust Fund to see if they would help cover costs through the Shetek Campership Fund. There is a federal program for an Employee Retention Credit (COVID related) which they will be researching with an accounting firm.

Christian Education - Bri reviewed their activities including the Thanksgiving and Christmas singing, monthly Girl's Night (26 attendees) with discussion for a Boy's Night, Ash Wednesday singing and Winter Women's Ministry. The board recommends removing the "Superintendent" from their board and adding another board member to which Pastor Adam noted the staff has discussed the current constitution and by February council hope to have wording corrections; meanwhile Tera is seeking a temporary superintendent. The motion was tabled to February by motion from Kevin and second by Bri. MM/S/C

Youth and Family - Cory discussed the many activities they have had and are planning, including 44 youth attending the Junior/Senior High Christmas Party, Living Nativity, the success of the November youth gathering, upcoming FaithFest at Augustana University in February and Youth Ministry Work in Kansas City in July 2023.


