Pastor's Message

Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands... -Isaiah 49:15-16a

The biggest fear I have is my kids dying. I've shared before the multiple times both my children have almost died from fluke accidents from lifejacket malfunctions to swallowing a screw found on the ground.

It's a fear that makes me irrational. When Xavier was about five we were walking the dog after it rained. He was by the curb doddling and poking a stick into a huge puddle that went way out into the road. I heard a truck rev up its engine. It wasn't night but everything was dark and gray. We yelled at X to get away from the curb but he was too engrossed and we had moved too far down the sidewalk to get to him in time. This truck sped through the puddle inches away from my son, almost hitting him and I lost it.

Next thing I know I'm running down the street chasing this truck and waving my hands for it to stop. My irrational plan was to grab this person and haul them out through their window. I even had the thought, "This is going to be a two-hundred pound farmer who's going to pulverize me" but I didn't care.

Turns out it was a teenager who, when I caught up with him, had the fear of God in his eyes. I would guess because he thought I was going to murder him and also, I'm fairly certain he didn't see my son, and it was probably just hitting home how he almost killed a six-year-old.

Well, the kids' terrified eyes and his pleading calmed me down enough to not drag him out of his truck, but I had enough words where Beth was worried I might so be unemployed.

I have enough fear of my kids dying by random accidents and it only escalate when others are at fault. Like when they're at school and there's a bomb threat. Or just recently the email that went out about alleged threats at school, serious enough to get the police involved.

It's at those times when I am grateful for God, the faith God has given me, and scripture. Those are the times when I need to make a willful effort to call on God in order to keep my sanity. It's those times when I need to recall the scripture above that reminds me that even though it is impossible for me to be near my kids to protect them all the time, that that is not impossible for God. That in fact God is with my children always.

When the bomb threat occurred at our school and all the sudden the school is showing up at the doors of ALC and kids are flooding in and I didn't know where my children were, and as my overactive and vivid imagination wanted to take off along with my irrationality, I had God, faith, and scripture all chime in to tell me that one way or another my kids would be fine; that God was watching out for them. God, faith, and scripture kept me cool when my body didn't want to be cool.

A caveat here: sometimes the worst does happen. As awful as that would be, I do know, and heavily rely upon, that God, faith, and scripture would be a massive buffer for me, especially knowing that my children would then be safe in God's hands forever and that in time, I would get to see them again for eternity. I would still be upset, but it would be a fraction of what it would be without God, faith, and scripture.

Bottom line: there's a lot to give us anxiety in this world. There's a lot out there that can take our sanity. Lucky for us we have an all-powerful God who neither slumbers nor sleeps. A God who has no problem with overruling

death and having people live forever.

May you too know that God, have that faith, and be acquainted with scripture enough to give you peace in a chaotic world.

Transfiguration Sunday: This is observed on the Sunday prior to Ash Wednesday. Transfigure means to change, and Jesus changes before Peter, James and John. They were gathered high on the mountain. Matthew 17:2 states that his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. The Sunday and Seasons resource book states it best. "God is not only brilliant light, but also cloud. Although people tend to think of clouds as relating to weather conditions, in the Bible the cloud is a mysterious sign of the presence of God. It is as if God covers the earth, brings life, yet suddenly vanishes. Christians may add that, from God as cloud, the waters of baptism rain down." (2016, p. 96)







What is Lent? Lent is a church

season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. (Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because

each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" as we look forward to the Resurrection.) Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. Lent is a time to focus on our relationship with God, as we think of Jesus suffering and death and the coming glory of his resurrection.

SUMMARY

Many necessary and important improvements have been made over the last three decades – a major renovation of the dining hall, the construction and then expansion of Lakota Retreat Center and construction of the activity center. These improvements have been wonderful assets that have blessed participants of every age nearly every week of the year.

Many groups are turned away throughout the year because of space limitations especially during fall, winter and spring seasons. There is much potential to expand this ministry and reach more people throughout these seasons as well as provide more comfortable and hospitable facilities for the campers and guests during the summer months.

There are currently challenges and limitations that stand in the way of more ministry opportunities for congregations, families and individuals:

- The cabins are more than 80 years old and do not meet the camper's (or their parents') expectations.
- 2. Campers are uncomfortable using the current bathhouse.
- Our strategic planning process identified the need for expanding the year round programming opportunities. That will not be possible without more winterized facilities.
- 4. The water treatment/filtration system needs to be upgraded.

<u>CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FROM</u> January 10th, 2023 MEETING

- The tabled 6% "retirement option" was removed from the table MM/S (Mike/Kevin) and received a "no" vote.
- A motion was made to recommend the 2023 budget for the Annual Meeting.
- Two additions were made to the ALC Personnel Policies as follows:
- 5.4.1. Part time, non-salaried program staff and support staff, who regularly work at least 20 hours per week, shall be eligible for retirement benefits equal to 6% of wages paid, beginning in the tenth year of service. MM/S/C (Mike/Kevin)
- 8.1.4. To initiate vacation requests, employees eligible for vacation benefits, shall submit the request to the Lead Pastor. The Lead Pastor shall submit vacation requests to the Council President. MM/S/C (Nancy/Kevin)
- Nancy will sign the Bethany Agreement and it will be presented to Gareth Holmen, Bethany Lutheran's President for his signature. MM/S/C (Nancy/Cory)
- ALC will host the Synod's Anti-racism Training on October 26 or November 2.
- Approval of the 2023 ballot with the withdrawal of Darcy Hoffman from the Youth and Family Board. MM/S/C (Karen/Kevin)

Board Reports

Worship and Music Board – The board wonders what we would do if Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday. They are also considering a survey to see if Wednesday services should be offered in the summer.

Spiritual Life and Fellowship Board – Discussed the Lutefisk Supper and serving a Lenten supper.

Discipleship/Marketing and Stewardship Board – Will be relaunching an Authentic Manhood Bible Study.

Properties Board- Four closers are needed on the Sanctuary doors. Blinds for the classrooms should be placed on the memorial list. The parsonage will eventually need a new fence.

Budget and Finance Board – The church ended the year \$44,000 in the black. The Scholarship Fund will eventually be administered by the Trust Fund.

Christian Education Board – The 2nd Semester has begun for Sunday/Wednesday School. Girls' Night and Boys' Afternoon are being planned.

Youth and Family Board – Fifty students went to Springfield for bowling and pizza and 38 students participated in Winter Fun Day. Many activities are being planned with a BINGO fundraiser on January 22, Valentines Supper on February 5, Faith Fest in Sioux Falls, Kansas City Trip, Gustavus Leadership Day, Ash Wednesday/Lenten Suppers to mention a few.

Church In Society Board- Will once again sponsor a Lenten Challenge.


