Pastor's Message

[Jesus says,] "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.

-John 15:26-27

Every year the Gideons throw a banquet for local pastors. One of the highlights of this event is when they have someone share their testimony.

This time the guy who spoke must have been about late fifties, balding, yet with a kind of mohawk, and a long goatee down to his chest; totally looked like a hardcore biker. He tells his story of his abusive dad calling him worthless ever since he was a kid. He talked about hanging out with the older rebel kids who accepted him. From there it was a downhill ride from smoking, to drinking to drugs, and, of all things, becoming a pastor in Satan's Church (yes, there are Satanic congregations in the United States, but that's a story for another time).

He told a particular story about getting so jacked on meth that his friend didn't even wake up when his mattress, being next to the radiator, caught on fire. His friend ended up burning alive.

The speaker said then that he became suicidal but found himself in prison, again, and found himself in some program that made him do Bible homework where he found a passage similar to something in the Satanic Bible. This piqued his curiosity, which caused him to read the Bible more, and, long story short, he's now a Christian pastor in Wisconsin.

We Lutherans have so many awesome things going for us but one thing that we are severely lacking is sharing our faith out loud. Personally, I'm lucky, because as a pastor I get to talk to many of you. I'm blessed that people share their faith stories with me simply because I have a fancy title. I know for a fact that many of you have incredible stories of experiencing God in your life. Those stories you have are spiritual gold and I'm going to ask you to not hoard them.

Do as Jesus says in the passage above and share your faith; your testimony is desperately needed. Sermons are helpful but let's be honest, people don't remember sermons. They're like lunch. You know you ate it, you know it's helping you now, but who knows what we actually ate.

Testimonies are like cake. You don't forget when you had cake. You remember what kind it was, who made it, and, if you're like me, you get happy later in the afternoon when you find some leftovers in your mouth that break loose and you get to remember it all over again.

Testimonies are powerful. They not only strengthen the faith of believers but they also are seeds planted in the hearts of those who don't yet have a great relationship with Jesus. There are some who worship with us who aren't that vested in Jesus. Thank God they're worshipping with us anyway, but it just might be your story that puts words and examples to something they have already experienced; you just might help get their bridge to Jesus built.

Tell your story during worship. It doesn't have to be an extreme story like the one above, every-day stories are also awesome. Talk to me and I'll set it up. I won't lie to you, you will need courage. I know right now some of you are thinking your stories will sound stupid, or crazy, or you're thinking people might think you're a weirdo, but you're wrong. People need your experiences so that they can feel comfortable sharing their own.

God needs more publicity. We don't talk enough about specific, everyday things that God actually does. Help the Church make that normal.

Dear friends and companions in ministry,

March 2023

It has been a while since I have written! That is because I am teaching several courses that are new to me this semester, and I am running all the time just to keep up. I am learning at least as much as the students are, especially about the history of the church in the Caribbean. I will share with you the most astonishing thing I have learned so far this semester.

As Christians of the twenty-first century, we pay attention to Jesus' parting words to his disciples in Matthew 28:18 -20, "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age'." I was shocked to learn this semester that European settlers in the Caribbean from Protestant countries, like the Netherlands, Great Britain, and even Lutheran Denmark, not only failed to heed these words of Jesus but actually opposed

Protestants moved to the Caribbean in the seventeenth century to run plantations, mostly of sugar, which aimed to make as much money as possible as quickly as possible. Thus, the work on the plantations was done not by paid employees but by enslaved Africans. Since the plantation owners and managers considered themselves Christian, we might expect that they would teach the enslaved Africans about Christ and have them baptized. That was, after all, what the Catholic Spanish did in their colonies. But it was not so.

Although Catholics taught that enslaved people should be catechized and baptized, Protestants held that a Christian could not hold another Christian in slavery. By this logic, if the slaves became Christian, the masters would have to liberate them. The planters refused to evangelize the Africans who worked for them if it meant that they would have to set them free. They did not want them to be equals as members of the church. So, in the Protestant colonies, slaves did not receive Christian instruction and were not baptized.


That changed in the middle of the eighteenth century, but for a century and a half Africans had lived in Protestant colonies in the Caribbean without being invited to Christian faith. During that long time, it was the Africans themselves who took the first steps toward conversion to Christianity. Church historians Dale Irvin and Scott Sunquist describe that process like this:



Africans observed the religious world of their captors, and some began to adapt their own indigenous religious worldview to that of their new social context. ... Traditional African beliefs and practices, including those revolving around spirits, spirit possession, healing practices, and ancestor veneration, were merged with Christian symbols and practices in a variety of ways (Irvin and Sunquist, *History of the World Christian Movement*, vol. 2 [Maryknoll, New York: Orbis, 2012], 229).

One of the many Caribbean churches that formed out of this merger of African traditional religion and Christianity was the Spiritual Baptist Church (also known as Shouters), the subject of a novel of historical fiction that the students and I are reading in one of my courses, *The Wine of Astonishment*, by Trinidadian author Earl Lovelace. I highly recommend it to you! The students are loving it because they can relate to the songs, spirit-possession, and struggles of the Spiritual Baptists, whose church was outlawed in Trinidad between 1917 and 1951 because it was considered too loud.

Sometimes I wonder how history might have turned out differently if the European Christians of the seventeenth century had considered Africa as a continent full of potential Christians instead of potential slaves, or if they at least had considered the enslaved Africans who worked for them as persons, not as property, and had heeded the voice of Jesus to teach and baptize more than they heeded the call of money. I imagine that emancipation would have come much sooner and that, likewise, the ongoing process of healing the scars of slavery would have started much sooner. How good it would have been if those wounds of slavery had never been suffered in the first place; they have left very deep scars that still sting. Please keep me, my students, and all the churches of the Caribbean in your prayers as we work together with you on healing those wounds.




