Pastor's Message

The Sudan*
Mission
Celebrates
100 years! *
(Not the country of

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28.18

It was exactly 100 years ago this March, in the year 1923 that four Lutherans from Wisconsin, Iowa and Brooklyn boarded a ship in Bordeaux, France, bound for West Africa. Their goal was to share the Gospel in an area that had never heard it before: northern Cameroon and the Central African Republic, on the western side of Africa, a little bit north of the equator. The trip took eighteen days. There were no roads into the

interieur of the country, so they had to walk another 26 days on bush foot paths to reach their destination. In 1924 they received a warm welcome in the village of Mboula, and there they settled down. They learned the languages, shared about Jesus, baptized new believers, started some schools, ministered to the sick, and explored new territory in which to expand their work. Over the years, dozens of other missionaries from the United States, Norway and other countries followed in this endeavor which came to be known as the **Sudan Mission** (historically the word "Sudan" referred simply to "The Land of the Blacks"). Much more importantly, hundreds of African believers joined them from different people groups in the area. These people became pastors, teachers, and women's leaders of a lively and growing African church. This is how, over the course of the last one hundred years, two church bodies have formed: the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Cameroon and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Central African Republic, both members of the Lutheran World Federation, the joint membership of these two church bodies being approximately 500,000 Christians!

This is where this story, and your story, people of American Lutheran and Bethany Lutheran, cross paths. Some to those Christians you know! It was in the 1950s that a young man from southern Chad named Bernard DOUMBAYE left his country to seek his fortune to the south in the Central African Republic. He married a woman, Therese NGOUZAMI along the way, and they continued together, settling in the western part of the country near the border of Cameroon in a town called Baboua. There they farmed, did business, and raised their growing family. There were missionaries who had come to Baboua from Cameroon and who were telling the story of Jesus the Son of God who was killed, but who God had raised from the dead. They learned about forgiveness of sin, and new life through Him. They learned about the love of God for all people and God's grace which comes to whoever will receive it as a free gift, apart from human merit. The Holy Spirit was at work. They came to believe in God who sent Jesus and were baptized. Their children, all nine of them, were also baptized, and raised in the active community of faith that had formed in their town.

Meanwhile, back in the United States, I was in my senior year at the Lutheran School of the Theology in Chicago in 1992 when a group of us visited the headquarters of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America). We were on the Global Missions floor when the man overseeing mission work in French speaking Africa spoke to our class about the search for a woman to work in leadership development among the women of the church in the Central African Republic (CAR). My teacher said, "That's your position, Sarah." I came to understand that that is exactly where God was calling me to be. After a year of language learning in France, I arrived in the Central African Republic to begin ministry there. How much I would learn: how to live in a culture that was not my own, the language, how to dress, the food, and how to live among the people. Much more, I was a witness to the deep Christian faith of the people that sustained them through good times and bad. I would learn about the strength of the women, their love for laughter, song and dance, and their service to the Lord Jesus and each other.

One of the women I came to know was Rachel, the daughter of Bernard and Therese. She was studying to be a pastor at the Lutheran Seminary in Baboua. Rachel had met my family when she traveled to the North Dakota by invitation of Lutheran Women. Rachel later introduced me to her younger brother, Noel TADE. The rest is history! Noel and I were married in February of 1998. We brought our young family to the United States in 2003. God has blessed us richly all along the way. We are in awe of how God works to accomplish God's purposes!

Noel and I will join hundreds of others from the United States, Cameroon and the Central African Republic in a weekend celebration of the 100^{th} Anniversary of the Sudan Mission July 8^{th} and 9^{th} in Minneapolis. Join us in giving thanks for what God has done!





A MESSAGE FROM ALC PRESIDENT JOHN SHAMP:

For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved: Romans 10:13 News of the Shetek Conference Assembly;

I was given a chance to join the assembly in late February along with the several others from our congregation. This was very educational for me as I got to see some of the inner workings of our represented conference ahead of the Synod Assembly



that takes place in June. We got to vote on new leaders to take over for the next season of our Shetek Conference in which all positions were filled by those present. This adds some much needed strength as we move into a new year. Our own Pastor Sarah who was the Interim Dean has done a great job filling a very important roll to the assembly and now has been able to step out of that role. She reported that Shalom Hill Farm has found a new director. Shetek bible camp has gotten back into full strength coming out of the COVID era, WELCA remains strong in our area and that our friends of the Odini partnership have 2 South Africans serving at the Shetek Bible camps this past year and hopes of them coming back for the 2023 camp season. In 2023 we hope to do some fundraising to be able to invite some of the delegates of South Africa to come in 2024 for a visit. We have not seen our friends here since 2017. We also learned that there remains a large shortage of Pastors within the ELCA as several congregations struggle to find stability and pastoral care. Keep these congregations in your hearts. Remain grateful of the Pastors and thank them as you see them. They bring strength and stability to us.

If you happen to have seen the amount of youth involved in the Lenten/Easter season you would know that it was AMAZING to see all of the buzzing around. It has been so heartwarming to see these kids back and being active as they are. If you see Tera give her some praise as she brings strength to these programs and activities. 






BUILDING ON THE FOUNDATION SHETEK LUTHERAN MINISTRIES CAPITAL CAMPAIGN


