Pastor's Message

One in Christ

We have new wall art at The American Lutheran Church of Windom. A photo dropped into a newsletter doesn't do it justice, so check it out for yourself. It is painted on the wall outside the youth room at the bottom of the steps. The artist is member Lisa Petersen who grew up here, and has served on staff working with youth. Lisa offered to contribute some of her art to her home congregation to help point people to Jesus. Lisa can take an idea, like a passage from scripture, and paint it into a picture so that it speaks to those who see it.



The painting speaks to what the Apostle Paul wrote about, being one in Christ. Not that we always were or are. No, just like Christians in Ephesus, we come from many backgrounds and worldviews. We aren't always of one mind. Paul is writing to a community where some were born Jews and followed the Jewish law, and others were "far off", not a part of God's chosen people at all. That created a hostility between them, but the cross of Christ broke that hostility down, and made one new humanity in place of two! It is Jesus who can bring people together who have nothing in common, and who may have even been enemies, or on opposite side of the aisle. Through faith, those who were enemies have become friends, members of the same household of God, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone! The dividing wall has been broken down. He is our peace.

If you have gotten this far reading, I invite you to open your Bible to Ephesians 2:11 -22.

As you read, think of the work of Jesus in your own life. What has he done for you? Have you ever been "far off?" v. 17. When have you heard a word of peace that you desperately needed to hear? Can you speak a word of peace like that to someone else?

This passage and the wall art speak to situation of conflict and alienation. In the text, aliens has become a "citizens with the saints". There has been reconciliation. Now, look at the art. Really look at it. The lines in the opposing sides of mural are moving inward toward the cross of Jesus, and the peace that he brings. May that peace be yours, and in your relationships!

As Christians, our life together in Christ is a living witness that "He is our peace" vs.14. In places where conflict, hostility or a diving wall remain, use this month or this time of summer to work on it. Do not doubt what God can accomplish and has already done, through the blood of Christ.



The 2023 Southwestern MN Synod Assembly of

the ELCA was held June 9-10 at Gustavus Adolphus College located in St. Peter, MN around the theme *Embody the Word*. ALC was represented by Lindsey and Jane Cartwright, John Shamp, and Pastor Sarah Larsen Tadé.

5 mbody The Word

The highlight for Lindsey was opening worship. Sitting in Christ Chapel, set in the middle of Gustavus' campus, with its triangular stained glass windows pointing upwards to the roofline, provides a backdrop

filled with peace. Music filled the chapel through organ selections, Dakota Road musical selections, a soloist, but most notably, through congregational singing. Listening to worshippers of all ages joining in song, singing "Praise to the Lord", "Healer", and "All are Welcome" was very uplifting. Bishop Dee Pederson provided the message. Rev. Naomi Mahler was installed as a Synod Minister for Equipping Congregations. What a joy it was to participate in Holy Communion with all those present for the Assembly.

Jane attended the workshop provided by Dakota Road Band. As they took those attending the workshop through a "mock" worship service, Larry Olson, Karol Baer, and Rev. Hans Peterson introduced some of their newest musical selections, "The Welcome Table", "Come to the Well", I am excited to introduce some of their songs in various worship services. I have the newest copy of Dakota Road Music Anthology as a resource. Check out their music online at www.dakotaroadmusic.com. We were blessed to have Dakota Road provide musical selections during the worship service and also during breaks during the assembly.

Pastor Sarah attended the Synod South African Partnership meeting with guest Kevin Jacobson before the Assembly began on Friday morning. The Southwest MN Synod is looking forward to welcoming four guests from South Africa this fall!

She attended two workshops: Viral Hope: Coaching for Positive Change (we have 10 ministry coaches in the Synod) and Anti-Racism Workshop. One learning from this workshop was the 3 foot rule: make a difference where you are.

Bishop Dee Pederson thanked all gathered for the way that we embody the word, the love of Jesus. She reported that there were thirteen ordinations in the Southwest MN Synod in 2022, thanks be to God! She thanked us for opening scripture together in our congregations, as Jesus "opened scripture" to the two he walked with on the road to Emmaus. Luke 24.27

Kevin Jacobson from the ELCA also brought a report, assuring us that the state of the ELCA is strong. He spoke of our history sending missionaries throughout the world. We are now a church that accompanies other church bodies, while continuing to send missionaries.

The Assembly received a video greeting from Bishop Meeaga from the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Southern Africa, the Southeastern Diocese.

Matt Bloom was the keynote speaker on the topic of Well Being. He has done research and writing on flourishing in life and ministry. He reminded us that small steps add up over time to big changes in our well being. Think small and regular. John Shamp appreciated the presentation and found it very applicable to his own life and work.

Actions taken by the Assembly included passing the SWMN Budget for fiscal year 2025, electing new leaders, and passing the 2024 Southwestern Minnesota Synod Compensation and Benefits Guidelines for Ministers of Word and Sacrament, Ministers of Word and Service, and Non-Rostered Lay Church Staff.



Letter from Carolyn, Our Missionary

Dear friends and partners in ministry,

May 2023

Greetings to you at this moment of the church year when the seasons change from Easter, when we bask in the message of new life in Christ, to Pentecost, when we are sent out in the power of the Holy Spirit to share that reality with the world. Here in Jamaica, my work during the month of May has reflected that very same movement from resurrection to sending, as you will see.



From May 1 to 4, in the middle of the Easter season, I was the facilitator of a retreat for Anglican clergy who serve western Jamaica. This year, the Anglican church in Jamaica is emphasizing baptism, so I chose as my theme, "The Risen Life of the Baptized". In an evening session at the retreat I gave the participants a slide show of the remains of a third-century Syrian house church in the town of Dura-Europos, and I focused on the little room upstairs containing a baptismal pool and wonderful paintings all over the walls and ceiling that give us a clue to how this church understood baptism. We imagined together what it would be like to enter the room as people about to be baptized: We would make our way toward the baptismal pool accompanied by ten women painted on the wall, each carrying a light and a jar and heading toward some kind of structure painted at the edge of the baptismal pool. Are they the ten wise virgins with their lamps and oil running to the wedding banquet (Matthew 25:1-13), or are they the women with their lights and jars of spices going to Jesus' tomb, only to find it empty (Luke 23:55-24:3)?

Either way, as those about to be baptized we would have the thrill of knowing that we were walking into a new life with Jesus that would last forever. I hope that the active engagement of the participants was a sign that thinking about these things was as refreshing for them as it was for me.

After one day at home, I was off to my next delightful gathering, this time with the delegates to the annual convention of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG), a country on the northeastern coast of South America, right next to Suriname. Since the ELCA has close relationships with the Lutheran churches of Guyana and Suriname, I attended the convention of the ELCG as a living representative of that relationship, along with Hellen Rios-Carrillo, the Regional Representative of the ELCA in the Caribbean.

The theme of the convention was "A Waiting World, a Willing Church, a Gracious God". In her report, the Secretary of the ELCG, Ms. Elocia Smith, reversed that order to start with "A Gracious God" because, as she wrote, the "good news that in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit God heals and saves" is what moves us to a world "groaning under severe burdens, waiting for God's grace which offers release and freedom."

This step from receiving to sharing, from learning to practicing, was taken this May by Rafael van Ommeren, who has been the resident Lutheran student under my care at the United Theological College of the West Indies. You may remember him from previous newsletters. He has now finished his Master's program and has just returned with his wife, Lucille, to Suriname, where he will serve as a congregational intern for a year before he is ordained as a pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Suriname (ELKS). Even though I will miss his jovial company, I am glad for him and for his church that he has taken this exciting step, and, of course, I plan to visit him, Lucille, and the church in Suriname when they are able to invite me. I will surely fill you in on the experience.

And so, the month has had an Easter-to-Pentecost shape for me. It has moved from a focus on receiving the risen life of Christ in baptism to a celebration of how that risen life is shared with the world through the impulse of the Holy Spirit. I am grateful that you make these moves with me as we accompany one another in our congregational, local, regional, national, and global ministries.
