Pastor's Message

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12.1-2

This fall Noel and I attended the Friday night opening of the Pow Wow in Mankato. There was great food and colorful native consuming all around. There was an opening ceremony where dignitaries and dancers came into the circle, and opening dances. Then there was something that we were not expecting: an acknowledgement that some who are here are in mourning. Dear ones have died since this time last year. The announcer invited those who had lost loved ones to come forward. Their loss was acknowledged. Then others came to greet them in their sorrow and offer them peace. A prayer was prayed as the loss was observed. Only after this observance could the Pow Wow continue. This was meaningful for us looking on. We've lost loved ones too.

In the church we have an event like that. It's called All Saints' Day. On this day we remember those who have gone before us in faith, and who have died since this time last year. We name their names and toll a bell, for while they are no longer physically with us, they are a part of us. We are not the same without them. As we name their names, we claim the victory won for them by our Lord Jesus Christ, raised from the dead. It is a moment where we can entrust our own living and our eventual dying into the hands of Jesus.

"We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live ore whether we die we are the Lord's." Romans 14.7-8

When I hear the names, I draw inspiration. Many of them I knew, or I got to know of them in death. It is a holy thing to remember and give thanks. Hearing the names, we may recall something of the struggles, joys and accomplishments in the lives of those whose names are read. All that for them is now over, and it remains for us to keep the faith, and with hearts of courage, run the race that is set before us.

I thank you for the privilege of being among you not only as new babies are born into your families, but also as you say goodbye to those for whom death is drawing near. We surround them with God's promise in Christ who is the resurrection and the life. We pray that sins may be forgiven and that this one may go home in peace. Imagine the joy in

heaven when that one joins the saints who have gone before! May All Saints' Day refresh our own faith in Christ Jesus though the memories of those who have gone before us.

All Saints' Day

I listen for it tolling from steeples in the sky.

The bells stir the air between here and heartache.

For a moment, the mystery satisfies, and we are all together.

I hang onto memories and promises with my fingernails just barely—

Not because I am certain, but because it is all that's left. Because if I let go, I will fall and break apart.

Perhaps someone will speak of my Beloved today and then I will not be so alone.

Hearing the name aloud makes it real, shares the weight like a new song I think I've always known.

There are candles to light the quiet resistance of remembering.





Monument and was Akhona's host for the Fall Theological Conference. Pastor Adam asked how the Council felt about ex-convicts becoming members of the American Lutheran Church.

- a. Pastor Sarah provided a template of what the pamphlet will potentially look like which will be sent out to all members.
- b. In the pamphlet, would be a commitment card of which ALC is encouraging members to sign. The verbiage on the card would read: "I/We commit to financially support the ministry of this congregation so that these programs will be fully funded for 2024.
- c. President John Shamp encouraged Council members to speak and greet during the Stewardship month campaign. A sign up sheet for different church services was passed around for Council members to sign up to fulfill this role.
