Pastor's Message

"A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

Matthew 2:18

I have heard many people make the claim that a Christian needs to support Israel no matter what; support meaning to endorse whatever they do without question. The biblical arguments I have heard from this are from Genesis 12 when God promises Abraham that his descendants will be a great nation, Deuteronomy 30 and Ezekiel 20 where God says Israel will always be gathered if they have been spread abroad and they will be restored, 2 Samuel 7 when God promises King David that his children will have a throne, and some Psalms and words of the prophets proclaiming God's love for Israel as God's child.

I fully agree that God loves Israel and they are God's special people. The Old Testament is story after story, book after book, of God bending over backwards to help and bless the Hebrews. If you want a love story about a parent who will keep chasing after their child, then go read the Old Testament's story about God's love for Israel.

But for anyone to claim that God endorses everything that Israel does is 100% against scripture. In most of the passages listed above you will find God's strict warnings about what happens if a nation/people/person turns from God's ways.

Deuteronomy 30 has God saying God is going to always bring Israel home and raise them back up, but let's not forget verses seventeen and eighteen which say if their hearts turn away from God then they will perish and lose the land. Ezekiel 20 explains why Israel was punished back then in the first place, because they turned away from God. 2 Samuel 7 has God saying David's kids will be on the throne so long as they follow God, but they didn't, and they were invaded and destroyed.


Therefore Christians cannot fully support the Israeli government's reckless assault on Gaza; reckless meaning there are 4,000 children dead in one month, and hospitals are being attacked and not getting power nor supplies.

Just looking at the Old Testament one could claim that God would support this course of action especially in light of Psalm 137, 1 Samuel 15, or even the end of 2 Kings 2, very hard passages to read, but I would argue that even the Old Testament is more in favor of protecting innocents than killing them. Also, if you add on the Gospels and the New Testament, a Christian has very little ground to stand on when it comes to supporting any nation that indiscriminately has killed 4,000 children in one month.

Hamas is evil and must be stopped. Antisemitism is evil and must be stopped. God bless the Jews. God bless those grieving their dead and those fearing for the hostages. The whole situation is absolutely awful. But I will stake my career as a pastor that God does not support the wanton warfare that has killed so many kids. I will stake my career that God is fully against it. And I can't imagine anyone wanting to worship a god that would be for it.

We follow Jesus who, even if you want to throw out what he says about loving our enemies, is one hundred percent for, and with, the suffering of any nation, race, or religion. Jesus never could walk past someone suffering who was powerless. Neither, therefore, can any Christian simply ignore the plight of 4,000 plus powerless innocents being slaughtered.

Therefore, let us not use evil to fight evil, but let us speak against such evil means. Furthermore, let us find a different way to bring down Hamas' evil while caring for the innocents, even if that makes our job more difficult and dangerous (for biblical examples about what this looks like, read Joshua 6 and Genesis 18 & 19).

We have entered our 2nd year of the 3-year pledge to the Shetek Capital Campaign. Thank you to those who gave a one-time gift. Thank you to those of you who made a 3-year pledge. You should soon be receiving in the mail a reminder from Shetek. You can mail your payment directly to Shetek with ALC Windom in the memo line. Director Marv Nysetvold, has provided an update of how the campaign is going:

"Our new total for the campaign is \$1,613,000 so we have met our phase 1 goal of \$1,500,000 but with the increased costs to build the new lodge, we are not able to do everything we had hoped for in phase 1. We have updated the water treatment system and have put in new water lines to almost all of the camp, along with planning for future development. The new lodge is done and we have had several groups use it, from scrapbookers to Scouts and the feedback has been wonderful. The Property Committee and the Board are working on plans for the first new cabin which we hope to start construction in the spring. Along with ALC - Windom, we have had 6 other congregations so far that have held a campaign in their congregation for the "Building on the Foundation" campaign. All together to date, well over \$100,000 has been raised just from our partner congregations. We are striving for our challenge goal of \$2,000,000 in order to do as much of our phase 1 plan as possible."

ALC should feel very good about our cheerful giving. I know many individuals and groups from ALC who participated before the ALC challenge directly and will continue to support the Shetek Capital Campaign with additional gifts in the future. It warms Jean and my hearts for your generosity. Thank you. Steve Johnson

Constitution Changes

ALC has been in the process of updating the constitution. To be updated, the constitution must be voted through twice. We have already done this once at our last annual meeting. Here is a review of what is changing and what we will be voting on at the next annual meeting. If you have any questions please contact Pastor Adam.

C10.06.02. Shetek Lutheran Bible Camp representatives – At its first regular meeting the congregation shall elect two representatives as well as one alternate to the Lake Shetek Bible Camp Association to serve for the ensuing year. Shetek Lutheran Ministries (SLM) representatives – At its annual meeting the congregation shall elect two representatives as well as one alternate to serve for the ensuing year and to represent American Lutheran Church at SLM's annual meeting to conduct business for the association of member congregations.

C21.01.06. DISCIPLESHIP, MARKETING, AND STEWARDSHIP BOARD The Discipleship, Marketing, and Stewardship Board and Stewardship Board shall promote faith in Christ and the Good News of our Savior by welcoming all, and through our work together within the church, the community and beyond. Duties shall include but not be limited to: new members, promote and market the church, and work with the missions both locally and globally. They shall also lead the congregation to be Biblical stewards through the proportionate giving of their time, abilities, and money as they have been given. It shall be made up of seven persons elected by the congregation.

C13.05. Scholarship Committee consisting of five members of the congregation at large shall be appointed by the Congregation Council. A pastor and an appointed parent of a current ELCA college student shall be ex-officio members of the Scholarship Committee. The purpose of the committee is to provide financial and informational support concerning ELCA colleges to students of the congregation and their parents.

C11.02. The congregation shall elect its officers and they shall be the officers of this congregation. The officers shall be elected by <u>voice vote</u> or written ballot and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. Their terms shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.

<u>C21.01.02</u>. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD shall plan and administer the total Christian Education programs of the congregation including Sunday school, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, Bible Classes and other educational opportunities. It shall be made up of <u>five seven</u> persons elected by the congregation plus an additional voting member; the Sunday school superintendent. The Christian Education Coordinator shall be an ex-officio member of the board.

C12.01. The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the officers of this congregation, the chairperson of each board with alternates being the vice chairperson or board's designate, <u>and</u> the chairperson of the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Gals Living Our Witness (GLOW), and the president of the Lutheran Men in Mission. A member's place on the Congregation Council shall be declared vacant if the member a) ceases to be a voting member of this congregation or b) is absent from four successive regular meetings of the Congregation Council without cause. Consistent with the laws of the state in which this congregation is incorporated, this congregation may adopt procedures for the removal of a member of the Congregation Council in other circumstances.

C21.02.02. Terms for parish boards begin and end at the conclusion of the annual meeting.

C12.04.01. Shetek Conference delegates - The Congregation Council shall select voting members to all Shetek conference assemblies.

C14.01.02 Lutheran Men in Mission (LMM) is the men's auxiliary of American Lutheran Church of Windom. It is organized and operates based upon its Constitution and bylaws. Its purpose is to nurture the men of the church in the Word of God so as to grow in faith and hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the exercise of their Christian calling, and to use the gifts of the Spirit for their life together and for their calling in the world.

C14.01.01.Women of the ELCA (WELCA) Gals Living Our Witness (GLOW) is the women's auxiliary of the American Lutheran Church of Windom. It is organized and operates based on its Constitution and bylaws. As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, they commit themselves to grow in faith, affirm their gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society and the world.



Dear friends and partners in ministry,

November 2023

Jamaicans like to say about their country, "We likkle but we tallawa" (We're little but we stand tall), especially with reference to the performance of Jamaican athletes on the world stage. I find that saying applicable also to the Lutheran community at the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTCWI), the ecumenical institution where I work, where Lutherans are small in number, but we make a splash. We did it again this semester.

The first to splash was Rev. Danielle Dokman, the pastor from Suriname whom I introduced in my last newsletter. She is an alumna of UTCWI and is back for one semester as part of her PhD program at Luther Seminary in Minnesota. Rev. Dokman was chosen to be the preacher for the opening worship service of the Thirteenth Assembly of the Lutheran World Federation in Krakow, Poland, September 13-19. The theme of the Assembly was "One Body, One Spirit, One Hope" from Ephesians 4:4. I encourage you to watch the opening service for a beautiful glimpse of global Lutheranism in action. Our second splash was in the last week of October, when the Lutheran community had responsibility for leading daily worship in the chapel. We invited people to reflect on what we, as Christians, are freed from and what we are freed for, using Martin Luther's paradox, "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none; a Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all" (The Freedom of a Christian, in Martin Luther: Three Treatises [Minneapolis: Fortress, 1970], 277). It sounds contradictory, doesn't it? What do you think it means?

The last Lutheran splash of the semester was made by me, as the result of a bellyflop, you might say. Annually, the Student Association of UTCWI organizes a "mini-Olympics" of serious and silly athletic competitions between four "rooms" composed of students, faculty, and staff. I was in room B, which won fourth place! (Sometimes you have to put a positive spin on things.) I did my best for the team, but I am not one of Jamaica's finest athletes.

Another type of thing altogether happened this semester that will mark a big



change in my life and work. The ELCA, in consultation with me, with UTCWI, and with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG), will be relocating me in February to Guyana to work with the

ELCG as it seeks to revitalize its ministerial and lay leadership training programs. Not only will it be a new place of work for me, but it will be a new kind of work for me, too. So, I ask you to accompany me during this time of transition with your prayers that God would give me a calm heart, keen attention, energy to adjust, and, as always, grace and mercy for the mistakes I will surely make.
