# **Pastor's Message**



Our Partners in the Lutheran Church in Southern Africa have a *watchword* for the year. In 2023 it was *the God who sees me*, based on Genesis chapter 16 where Hagar the Egyptian slave, who was running away from her mistress Saria was seen by God. God saw her distress. God saw her predicament and helped her.

It's not a small thing to be seen – to know that somebody notices what you're experiencing. And how much more if that somebody is God, the maker of the universe?! This verse has brought encouragement to our Partners, and to us if we take it to heart.

What kind of *watchword* might orient us in 2024? As the new year opens, there are so many opportunities before us. If you're like me, you're hoping this time around to get it right The things that didn't go well last year we hope to leave behind. The unrealized hopes and intentions we go after with renewed fervor

Who can help us? What tools will keep us accountable?

There was a time when Jesus was teaching about the bread that you can eat and be hungry again, and then bread that lasts. Then he said, "I am the bread of life". He was saying that it is he Jesus, that is the bread that we need! Not everybody liked the claims he was making, especially when he said "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them." They said, "This teaching is difficult' who can accept it?" John 6.60 Many left and no longer went about with him, so Jesus asked his twelve disciples "Do you also wish to go away?" Simon Peter answered him, "Lord to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God." John 6.58

Peter understood. He didn't always, but in that moment, Peter understood in whose presence he was standing. He wasn't going anywhere that would take him away from Jesus, the one who meant to him life as God intended it, whether in heaven or on earth.

What is this *eternal life?* Eternal life means life with God that starts now and can't be taken from you even by death - or unemployment, or addiction, or debt, or health problems, or climate change or relationship troubles or any of the other problems that afflict us on a personal or global scale. We find this eternal life in Jesus. In him we have the bread that we need. We're not going anywhere either!

I just had a conversation with a community member who spoke about all the good things we have going right here in our community, especially compared to so many other places. I agreed saying "We do have it good. Now if we could just get to bottom of our human problem with sin." Without hesitation he said, "That's what we've got Jesus for." Of course, it is!! Where else would we go? Jesus is the one who speaks life to us, and promise.

Let's make it our aim to not go anywhere, except where Jesus leads us. Happy New Year, 2024!




#### Men's Bible Study:





# Good to Know

#### **Equipping Congregations Report from Pastor Sarah**

Equipping Congregations "Living in the Word Today"

On Saturday, December 2nd the Southwestern MN Synod hosted the Equipping Congregations Day at Vinje Lutheran Church in Willmar. Noel and Pastor Sarah Tadé were in attendance.

Professor Rolf Jacobson from Luther Seminary was the keynote speaker. His message was that the Holy Spirit (the shy member of the Trinity) is loose in the world, meaning that the Spirit is doing things, inside and outside the church. Our primary Spiritual Practice should be discerning what the Spirit is up to, and getting on board! As we discern what the Spirit is doing and name it, we are bound to sometimes get it wrong given our sinful nature, and our own self interest, but we look for signs, remembering that the will of the Triune God is **life**, **redemption and salvation**. The Spirit works toward this intent. We test what we are discerning by reading the Bible. Ralph also talked about spiritual gifts. What your spiritual gifts are now does not mean that God can't give you new ones to face new circumstances.

Sarah attended two workshops:

Fostering Accompaniment: 2023 SW MN synod - SouthEastern Diocese of the Lutheran Church in Southern Africa Visitor Exchange. Pr. Janet Adams (Trinity Lutheran Church, Madelia) and Lindsey Scheid (Green Lake Bible Camp) reported on their trip in November visiting our partners in South Africa.

**Loving your Neighbor - Practical Things We Can Do** Jenny Groen a Willmar native and a Christian along with Fatuma Yussuf, a native of Somalia and a Moslem told the story of how they became friends and eventually came to work together in the non-prophet Arrive Ministries which provides welcome and services for newly arrived immigrants to their community.

Noel attended two workshops:

Insights to Better Understand Farming Culture and Mental Health led by Ted Matthews, <a href="www.farmcounseling.org">www.farmcounseling.org</a>, a mental health practitioner with over 30 years in mental health. He named a challenge of farming as being that farmers work by themselves, and don't easily share the personal obstacles that they are facing. They can find themselves isolated, and it takes a long time for them to seek help, if they are facing a mental health crisis. He sees some improvement as women are becoming more involved in farming, and the pressure for the man to provide everything is less than it was before.

**QPR stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer - the 3 simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide.** Forrest Rice, www.woodlandscenters.com shared how he lost a child. For two weeks people were great surrounding him and his family, but after that he was alone. He was inches from taking his own life, when a text message came up on his phone from a friend reaching out, which stopped him from pulling the trigger. He now offers training on how to be in relationship to help people in crisis.

Equipping Congregations is a chance to learn new things, and meet people from across the Synod. It's a time to exchange stories, experiences and ideas to bring back to your own congregation. Consider attending next year!

#### 2023 Augustana University Association Meeting

Lindsey and Jane Cartwright, delegates elected from the SWMN Shetek Conference, attended the Augustana Association Annual Meeting on Fri-

day, December 1, 2023. There were several highlights of the day. During the opening worship service in the Chapel of Reconciliation, Julie Radtke, a Biology and Environmental Studies major, from Northfield, MN provided the message. Afterwards, we assembled to hear about how Augustana educates students for service in a diverse world, and through many exchange programs, how students develop an understanding and connection to diverse communities. Three students shared their experiences as they utilized Augustana's "study away" opportunities. Each shared how their faith communities have grown, developed, and expanded during these adventures.

President, Stephanie Herseth Sandlin, provided highlights of Augustana's 100 years as an Educational Institution, from Homecoming events to the launching of the Augustana Hockey program. Augustana had the largest fall enrollment, 2,158 students, in four decades. 454 students were incoming First-year students. The student body is quite diverse; 214 students (11.2%) represent 57 countries. She believes having a plan designed with excellence leads to building leaders with excellence. There are many experiential learning opportunities, intercultural engagements, and new academic programs. Augustana announced this fall, the Buntrock Scholarship Program for students who are from Midwest ELCA churches. Thirty students will be selected, from applications, to receive a sizable portion of their tuition paid. It would be wise to encourage students to explore this scholarship and many others that are offered through Augustana.

The evening highlight was Christmas Vespers. . . and a Little Child Shall Lead Them. The School of Music production included seven choral and instrumental ensembles sharing wonderful Christmas selections.

Greetings from your camp - Shetek Lutheran Ministries!

This summer we served 770 total campers, which includes our youth campers, cross-generational campers and our SOS campers. We are close to serving as many campers as before the pandemic. 2023 was a 24% increase in camper numbers over 2022 and about 94% of the campers we had in 2019. One of our greatest challenges continues to be finding young adults who are willing to serve for the summer. Our summer ministry team of 20 young adults served faithfully this summer and grew in their faith and in their leadership skills. We were blessed with 7 international counselors this past summer from the United Kingdom, Jamaica, Zambia, Mexico, Zimbabwe and two from South Africa. Shetek will be inviting several international counselors in 2024 also.

Our "Building on the Foundation" capital campaign continues with primarily the congregational phase. Several congregations have run successful campaigns in their congregations so far. We will be contacting all our 100 member congregations to give them the opportunity to participate. We continue to visit with prospective major donors, those who give or pledge \$5,000 or more for the campaign. We have met our phase 1 goal of \$1,500,000 and our total so far in cash and pledges is about \$1,613,000 as we work towards our challenge goal of \$2,000,000. The new lodge is done and is being used by a variety of different groups from scrapbooking groups, Scout groups, family gatherings and college students. The Property Committee and Board are working on plans for the first new cabin and we hope to begin construction in the spring.

Some improvements in 2023 – we upgraded the sound system in the chapel, replaced the reverse osmosis system in the Dining Hall, had to replace the motor on the pontoon, repaired the east wall of the chapel and painted it, painted 3 cabins along with the office, and removed several trees.

I am thankful for our year round staff who continue to work as a team to serve our guests and campers and provide great hospitality. Shetek welcomed Gaelyn Gernentz in March to our Housekeeping team, Deb Ness in June to our Summer Food Service, Joe Koenigs in June to our Maintenance team, and Alexandra Cowell began in September on our Housekeeping team.

We are so grateful for the many campers and guests that came this year. Shetek has impacted so many lives over the years. One of our Counselors in Training (CIT) had this to say about last summer.

"I feel closest to God when I am at camp. I consider camp to be my second home during the summer. This summer, I felt called and was able to have the opportunity to spend about 6 weeks volunteering at camp and I learned a lot. I learned how to respond to stressful situations better, I was able to make, renew, and grow friendships, and I strengthened my leadership skills by helping lead activities like games, worship, reading scripture, and more. I feel that I grow in my faith on a deeper level and grow closer to God everyday there."

Shetek continues to receive estate gifts periodically, which we are very thankful for. Over the years, these thoughtful gifts have really benefitted the ministry at Shetek.
