Pastor's Message

God is our refuge and strength. A very present help in trouble.

Psalm 46:1

One morning in early January I found myself full of anxiety. A lot of things hit me all at once from the news concerning the national debt, to people talking about The Fall of Minneapolis video and me watching some of it, to the start of the presidential campaigns with both parties saying the other party is going to destroy America, to the anniversary of January sixth, to the school shootings so close, and by ten a.m. that particular morning my mind was convinced that America will be destroyed within five years.

As my anxiety was overloading I'm thankful for my German roots that need schedules, because it was then time for my daily Bible reading. I'm in the Psalms at the moment and it was Palm 46 for that day. I quoted some of it above but I'd invite you to stop reading this and go read Psalm 46 and then come back. Don't worry, it's short.

I can't push enough daily Bible reading. Go straight through the Bible and read a chapter a day. We believe it is God's word. It is one way God speaks directly to us.

Ironically verse six (the one about nations in an uproar) wasn't the one that grabbed me and made me feel like God was talking to me, but it was the opening verse followed by being told specifically to not fear anything period, even though the earth should change, or mountains quake and tumble, or the sea roars and foams; powerfully destructive things that I have absolutely no control over I was told not to fear.

I hope I'm wrong, but I have a feeling this next year is going to be hard like last year was hard. I have a feeling the country is going to be tested and stretched deep into the red line. Often I feel like I should be doing more to fix what's going on and I immediately feel powerless. How do I fix the hate? The debt? The school shootings? The overwhelming anxiety Americans have? The division? The willful isolation of so many individuals?

Of course there are things we can do like talking to our representatives, voting, trying to be more engaged with our neighbors and community, finding ways to make bridges, finding ways to make peace locally, but even with all that the country is so large that it feels like we can't even scratch the surface.

Then comes verse ten: Cease striving and know that I am God. A dangerous verse to be sure. It does not mean do nothing and let God do all the work. But it does mean giving up your anxiety thinking everything depends on you because it doesn't. It is God who breaks the bow, cuts the spear, and makes wars to cease, not you/me.

Martin Luther says in the Large Catechism that when we pray "thy will be done" we're praying and asking God that we may get to participate with God. We know that God is going to do what God is going to do and nothing can stop it. We know too that all things in this world are not permanent, not even nations. Will the US last five days or another two-hundred years? Who knows. What I do know is that God is forever, that God wins, and that God watches over those who love and serve God no matter what happens in the world.

Therefore, place your anxiety on God's shoulders. Let God be your refuge and help. No matter what comes, God will see you through. In the meantime, let us do as Martin Luther says and find all the ways possible we work with God in this world of ours. Talk to your representatives. Get to know your neighbors. Break down the walls that divide us and find common ground. Love your enemies and those you disagree with. And if the mountain topple, the sea roars, and the nations totter, have no fear, because God is with us and God is our refuge.




