# **Pastor's Message**

Today I took advantage of unseasonably warm temperatures and walked my dog down by the river in Island Park. We curved around toward the dog park. There was a dog in there who had noticed us. He wasn't interested in playing with his owner anymore. He was interested in my dog, but the fence prevented him from getting close. He ran up and down the side of the fence trying to get closer to us. We wandered over, and the dogs greeted one another, thrilled to have found another of their own kind. Even dogs want to know they belong!

How does someone come to faith? My experience is that it is most often begins with *belonging* before *believing*.

As a young adult I worked at Christikon, a Lutheran Bible camp in the Rocky Mountains of Montana. My faith grew a lot at camp, and so did my ability to talk about it, but before all that, I loved camp *because I belonged*. I was part of a group, the staff that laughed and played together, sang and worshipped together, hiked and prayed together. Our faith was formed in the rhythms of our shared life, where the story of Jesus was woven into everything we did.

Our congregations are a bit like that. We learn from each other in relationships, like an 8<sup>th</sup> grade boy running sound for a worship service along side the adult who has been doing it for years. Or youth flipping pancakes alongside parents of their friends for the Fat Tuesday fundraiser. Or an aunt bringing her niece to worship. Now she is coming regularly. Women who gather to quilt share the stories of their day to day lives and imagine those who will receive what they are piecing together. *May whoever receives this somehow know that they are remembered, provided for and LOVED by other humans, and by God!* Others are delivering Meals on Wheels. As they ring the doorbell, they deliver not just the noon meal, but human contact with the one who opens the door. It's powerful what we do! Can we be an *evangelizing community,* a place where the story of Jesus is woven into all that we do?

One writer describes the church as "a safe and inviting place where outsiders to faith can come to figure out their spirituality in a Christian context." p. 40 Evangelism for "Normal" People, John P. Bowen. Not that any of us have it all figured out. Don't be afraid to ask what is on your heart or mind! We are on the road together as we learn to follow Jesus.

There is a danger in our congregations, when we become too comfortable with our belonging. We can weave a tight web in our own relationships that becomes difficult for others to penetrate and learn the story of Jesus. We must be an "open community, where outsiders can come in and explore the reality of faith" p. 43 Evangelism for "Normal" People, John P. Bowen.

Think of how the tax collector Levi came to faith: <sup>27</sup> After this [Jesus] went out and saw a tax collector named Levi sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, "Follow me." <sup>28</sup> And he got up, left everything, and followed him. <sup>29</sup> Then Levi gave a great banquet for him in his house, and there was a large crowd of tax collectors and others sitting at the table with them.

Jesus first asked Levi to follow, even *belong*. Levi was so pleased, even surprised at being invited and included that he threw a party and invited all his friends to meet Jesus! What better way to get acquainted than around food. May we be open and generous as we widen our communities to others so together, we can know the story of Jesus more deeply, gaining new life in community.
