

The Gathering is a faith formation event with tens of thousands of youths and their leaders from across the ELCA coming together for worship, interactive learning, Bible study, service and fellowship. We stay in hotels, do activities, and discover the city during the day, and in the evening, everyone gathers in the Superdome for a high energy event of worship, music, and speakers. We will have some fun along the way, meeting new friends, seeing new places, and eating new food!

There are five themes for the five days of the event. We have been meeting once a month since January to prepare and get acquainted with each other and these themes! These themes can help shape your life as a follower of Jesus too. To learn with our youth, I invite you to take one theme a day, lean into it, and see where you land.

New Orleans has a history of disruptors. On 11.19/1960 at age 6, Ruby Bridges became a civil rights leader by taking the first step toward desegregating Willam Frantz Elementary School, escorted federal marshals. As Lutherans, we belong to a long movement of reform – a history that began over 500 years ago when Martin Luther, a small-town priest, disrupted an entire religious, economic and political landscape with the truth of Gospel.

<u>DISCIPLES We</u> are CREATED TO BE DISIPLES to be sent into the world to love our neighbor, just as we are loved by God.

Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest? Jesus said to the lawyer, "you shall love the lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind. Theis is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Matthew

22.36-40

Bethlehem Lutheran Church has been in the city of New Orleans since 1884. During segregation, it offered a school for African-descent people as their schools were defunded. After Hurricane Katrina, Bethlehem lost half its membership, yet today it feeds over 200 neighbors twice a week through the Community Table. This is one way this community lives its discipleship.

You will be hearing more about the Gathering in the months to come. Our youth will have things to teach us when they return! Thank you for being lifelong learners, always being transformed by the Good News that we have in Jesus.
