


#### **WORSHIP AT THE LAKE!**

## Synod Assembly Report

#### **INTRODUCTION / THEME:**

The Southwestern MN Synod Assembly, 2024 was held June 7-8th, at Gustavus Adolphus, St. Peter, MN. The theme this year was "one body in Christ", Romans 12:5. Assembly delegates had the option of attending in person or using online technology, ZOOM, to follow along with all the activities and voting. After the opening worship, other segments of the assembly included networking with other individuals, displays of various opportunities within our synod, keynote speakers, items which required a vote, synod elections, and approval of the budget. A highlight for me was making reconnections with clergy and acquaintances. (Lindsey Cartwright)

Saturday offered an opportunity to hear from Rev. Dr. Aaron S. Folkerds, Synod Minister for Mental Health & Wellness. Folkerds is an ordained Lutheran pastor, and assistant professor of counseling at MSU- Moorhead, and works with the Moorhead Police Department. "Tools for Finding Connections in a Fragmented World" was his keynote message. These "11 Tools" make connections between Mental Health, Spiritual Health, and Relationships. 1) Connections help us to deal with suffering, 2) Be in Awe! Reconnect with self and see the beauty around you, 3) Mentionable is manageable, 4) Be an illuminator, not a diminisher, 5) Laugh in Life, 6) Sleep & Exercise reduce depression and anxiety, 7) Gratitude! 8) Phone management skills. 9) Reframe & Resilience. 10) Forgiveness. 11) Jesus Binds Us Together. These 11 tools were based on scripture passages and examples from life stories. I enjoyed his message, as it applied to everyone at the assembly, we are "One in the body of Christ" and need to support one another. (Jane Cartwright)

**RESOLUTIONS** There were three resolutions presented to the Synod Assembly.

24.01 - CLARIFYING QUESTION REGARDING HOMOSEXUAL RELATIONSHIPS

24.02 - REGARDING REVISIONS TO HUMAN SEXUALITY: GIFT AND TRUST

24.03 - REGARDING BYLAW CHANGES TO THE SYNOD CONSTITUTION

Resolution 24.01 was authored by Pastor Adam Roberts of ALC of Windom, and basically was asking that the ELCA clarify whether homosexual relationships are considered sinful or not. The ELCA "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust" which was adopted in 2009 does not present a unified answer to this question, which leaves its interpretation open to individual congregations. The Resolution review committee sent it to the floor with a recommendation to not adopt. At the assembly and prior to a vote, Pastor Adam Roberts withdrew his resolution for consideration.

Resolution 24.02 was authored by Pastor Ted Carnahan of Our Savior's, Jackson, MN. His resolution was urging the ELCA to not change any part of the previously (2009) adopted "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust," especially as it relates to the four positions of bound conscience. The Resolution review committee sent it to the floor with no recommendation. There were several comments from the floor both in support and opposition to the resolution. The question was called and passed. The voting resulted in not sending the resolution forward.

Resolution 24.03 was presented by the Synod Council to remove three boards from the bylaws of the SWMN Synod, as they are no longer functioning, and also to allow members of the Synod Council serve a second consecutive term. There were some comments from the floor, but the resolution passed. (Bob Johnson)

**OTHER BUSINESS** In other actions, the 2025 Compensation and Benefits Guidelines passed, with a recommended increase of 3% for clergy salaries. The synod proposed a budget that's -\$200K but they say that's ok, they got money to take a hit, and in 2-3 years it will be balanced. (Adam Roberts)

**SYNOD PARTNERSHIP GUESTS** In attendance at the 2024 Synod Assembly were two members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa (ELCSA): Bishop NkosiNathi Myaka Bishop of the South Eastern Diocese of ELCASA and Mr. Mkhize, a singer and respected member of the Diocese.

Bishop Myaka was our speaker at the Friday night session. He gave us an overview of the five countries that make up ELCSA, highlighting the main population centers, and explaining how the South Eastern Diocese fits with the Southwestern Minnesota Synod of the ELCA.

The impact of the Lutheran missionaries in Southern Africa has greatly shaped the country as they spread from Durban on the coast of South Africa into the Kwa-Zulu Natal region and further north and west. The early missionaries' focus on education is felt yet today in many ways. Most interesting to us is that although Lutherans make up only one percent of South Africa's population, they make up over twenty percent of the elected government officials.

South Africa today is still plagued by health issues that started with the AIDS/HIV epidemic and continues today as they fight COVID. Our Lutheran partners have been active in health issues and our help in supplying health products is greatly appreciated.

Few realize the sheer size of the African continent. Africa is over three times the size of the United States. With a population of over 1.216 billion, compared to China's 1.412 billion and the U.S.'s 333 million.

BREAKOUT SESSIONS I also attended a breakout session where the main topic was pastors and the reopening of the seminary. ELCSA has been without a seminary for many years and is planning to reopen the seminary later this year. Currently, Lutheran pastoral candidates have had to attend seminary at non-Lutheran seminaries. It was hoped that they would be able to grow slowly into a viable seminary, but the enrollment for this next year has almost completely filled available housing. Currently, all housing for Women is filled and almost all of the hosing available for men.

The breakout session was mainly filled by those who had already been to ELCSA. Those who had not yet been to ELCSA were encouraged to make the trip. (Michael Wojahn)

Another breakout session was "Building a Culture of Generosity" by Rev. Peter Reuss, CFRE (Certified Fund Raiser Executive). He shared that as humans, we are wired to get behind what we are passionate about and give of our means toward it. That is a joyful experience! Especially when we can see the difference our giving makes.

**CONCLUSION** There were 134 Rostered Leaders, 211 Lay leaders and 11 retired leaders in attendance, constituting a quorum. We worshipped and shared Holy Communion in Christ Chapel, celebrating our unity in Christ. (Sarah Tadé)



Dear friends and partners in ministry,

June 2024

"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (Ephesians 4:4). This verse has set the theme of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG) this year, as the church works to strengthen its own unity and celebrates its connections with the wider, global church, including its connection with you. In doing this, it is following the lead of the Lutheran World Federation (LWF), which chose "One Body, One Spirit, One Hope" as the theme of its thirteenth assembly, meeting in Poland in 2023. Last month the ELCG held its annual convention, something like a Synod Assembly, under this theme as they worshiped together, studied the reports of the various committees, elected officers, and discussed the administrative work of the church. A few weeks later, the national group of the Evangelical Lutheran Church Women took up the same theme for its annual gathering.

For me, the highlight of the ELCG's convention was the greeting from the LWF's Regional Secretary for Latin America and the Caribbean, Rev. Sonia Skupch from Argentina, who was present as a guest. In the midst of discussions about the sometimes disheartening statistics and challenges faced by the ELCG, Rev. Skupch's presentation electrified the room as she talked about the work of the Lutheran World Federation and the part that the ELCG plays in it. She noted not only that the Assembly in Poland elected the ELCG's treasurer, Mr. Michael Davy Ram, to serve as chairperson of the finance subcommittee of the executive committee of the LWF Council, but also that the ELCG has played a leadership role in the LWF since its beginning in 1947. The convention hall got loud and happy as Rev. Skupch reminded the delegates that the ELCG had sent delegates to the very first assembly of the LWF, held in 1947 in Sweden. Knowing that the ELCG has been participating in this expression of global Lutheranism from the ground floor up and that it is still contributing leadership in that body filled the convention delegates with joy and pride in their church, small as it is.
