Pastor's Message

[Jesus] said to them, "When I sent you out without a purse, bag, or sandals, did you lack anything?" They said, "No, not a thing." -Luke 22:35

I've been cynical for many years now. I say I'm a cynical optimist because, while I have little faith in humanity to do good, I have a lot of faith in God to do good despite us.

I used to have faith in humanity. There was a time when I was sure that we, as a species, through logic and love, could create a world in which there was no more poverty or hunger. A world in which all people had enough to be healthy and live good lives. Through my college and seminary years I was a social justice warrior and was involved in community organizing and would meet with my representatives and advocate for change.

Eventually, though, I moved out and the real world hit me like a Mack truck. I was overwhelmed by how much greed and selfishness saturated all systems of the world. It occurred to me that unless someone has an insane amount of wealth, that there'd be no way to fight the system because it was so corrupt in so many places; that there was no way to fix it unless/until God steps in. Until then I've just figured do what you can, when you can, with what you have, and try not to get too worked up about the bigger picture since I can't do anything about it.

Despite being a cynical optimist I find that I love graduations, especially the speeches made by kids. As cynical as I can be sometimes, those speeches are so hope-filled that they even get through to me. After graduation I leave there thinking, "Yeah, maybe this is the generation to do it. Maybe this is the group that will overrun the system, right it, and finally make the world the great place it can be!"

In Luke 10 Jesus sends out seventy of his followers two-by-two to tell about what God's kingdom is like, to heal, and to cast out demons. He tells them to take nothing; no wallet, no extra clothes, not even food. Just go. Go out into the world and tell them what God's kingdom is like and behave like you're already a part of that kingdom. Heal people. Help people. Don't be motivated by a paycheck, or popularity, don't even be motivated by a desire to survive. Just go. Tell people about God's kingdom. Behave like you already live there and God will cover the rest.

And by golly, in the same chapter those seventy return and none of them starved or died due to being homeless and poor! God worked through them and they were successful.

When I went out on my own I thought (and still do if I'm honest) that you need massive amounts of wealth to actually change things for the better. Yet, scripture (and history) proves that the opposite is true.

In this season we're blessed with energetic youth who are filled with hope and the belief that they can change the world for the better. Instead of giving into cynicism which says, "Just wait till you move out," how do we embrace God's ability to do life changing things through people who have no home, money, or food? How do we rally, stand behind, and stoke the fires of passion that our youth have as they go out to take on the world?

Luke 10 tells about the seventy going out and coming back and their successful return is brought up again by Jesus twelve chapters later and I would imagine the reason is that we sometimes forget what God has done and what God can do. We need to be reminded that God can take seventy people with no home, money, or food and make the world a greater place. And, if we believe that, then let's not only use that to fight our cynicism, but let us make sure we raise our kids in the faith so that they know of God's kingdom, what behaving like they're actually living in it looks like, and then empower them to lead, even us, with their faith, hope, and their energy.






Reminder: Saturday Chapel service on Saturday, June 14th will be at 4:30pm due to the Riverfest parade!

Good to Know

ALC is now in a time between pastors, but what is a pastor called to do really? When we extend a call as a congregation what do we pledge to do? Here is how the Letter of Call reads:

"We call you to exercise among us the ministry of Word and Sacrament which God has established and which the Holy Spirit empowers: to preach and teach the Word of God in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions; to administer Holy Baptism and Holy Communion; to lead us in worship; to proclaim the forgiveness of sins; to provide pastoral care; to speak for justice on behalf of the poor and oppressed; to encourage persons to prepare for the ministry of the gospel; to impart knowledge of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and it's wider ministry; to endeavor to increase support given by our congregation to the work of our whole church; to equip us for witness and service; and guide us in proclaiming God's love through Word and deed.

In accepting this call, you hereby promise to fulfill this pastoral ministry in accordance with the standards and policies for ordained ministers of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Therefore, be diligent in the study of Holy Scripture, in use of the means of grace, in prayer, in faithful service, and in Holy living.

With this call, we pledge our prayers, love, esteem, and personal support for the sake of the ministry entrusted to you by God and for our ministry together in Christ's name. Specific responsibilities, compensation, benefits, and conditions of this call are contained in a document related to this call."

Signed by the President, Secretary, and attested by the Bishop of the Synod.

As we move forward, pray for this process and the candidate of God's choosing. May leaders for the ministry of Christ's church be raised up from this congregation. Speak of the vocation of pastoral ministry to children, youth and people of all ages. It has been said "Pastors don't grow on trees". Trust that God provides, as God has in the past. Know that it may come in ways that you weren't expecting or that may ask you to evolve and grow. "See, I make all things new." Revelations 21.5

The ministry of the congregation continues even as leadership changes. Look forward to the new season with hope and expectation!

UPDATE FROM THE CHURCH COUNCILON OUR PASTORAL SEARCH

As of Tuesday, May 27th, Pastor Steven Rye has come to visit with staff and with Council President John Shamp. He indicated while talking with John, that he was not ready to sign the contract to be hired as interim just yet as he confirms with his own family that this is the best fit for them. We are hopeful that he will choose our congregation, but we do not have the final word on that yet. We will certainly let everyone know when we do have an official answer on this.

This will be listed on the ELCA Website for viewing by pastors looking for a call. Once that is listed and live, our search for a full-time pastor begins!


Please continue to pray for guidance for the MSP committee and the church council!
