# **Pastor's Message**

"Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you..." 1 Peter 3:15b

Every year Luther Seminary brings some students to southwest Minnesota to get a taste of rural ministry since most seminarians, like me, are city folk. They were down the other week and we had a conversation which was all over the place from farming practices, inheritances, corporate farming, organic farming etc. While we were eating lunch, though, the conversation hit a completely random topic that has stuck with me.

One of the students is in a PhD program and is a member of an Assembly of God (AG) congregation. He mentioned a weird event that happened to him at Luther. He said a bunch of the Lutheran students invited him to dinner. They went in an uber, all of them from across the country, and the driver kept asking how they knew each other. This AG student was going to answer when one of the Lutherans changed the subject. This happened multiple times to cause him to wonder why these people wouldn't just say they were seminary students training to become pastors.

He said that and I felt convicted. More than once Beth has noticed that I too do the same thing. If a stranger asks me what I do for a living I find ways to *not* say that I'm a pastor. I've told Beth that the reason is because everything changes when that's thrown out there.

For example, when we went to Scotland and were touring on a small bus I finally let it out I was a preacher and the dynamics changed. When we went out for dinner and if I had a couple of beers or a dram you could tell I was being watched and there were a handful of playful, but slightly pointed, comments about my alcohol consumption and being a pastor.

There was an Australian on the trip and I found multiple times when we were touring some place that he'd swing by to have serious, in-depth conversations about God and religion and, feel free to judge me, but I just wanted to be a "regular person" on vacation and to leave the seriousness and heaviness of the Church behind. I wanted to have a beer without being held to a higher standard (judged) and I didn't want to shoulder spiritual burdens while I was on vacation.

Up until the conversation with the AG student I felt justified in my behavior but now I have found this topic heavy on my mind. It is true, as the AG student noticed, that my behavior is typical of Lutheran clergy. I've been since wondering if that's ok. Do we get to take a break from serving Jesus? Do we get to "turn off" our Christianity so we can have a breather?

The Bible has passages of Jesus leaving everyone to be alone to pray, most prophets find themselves alone quite a bit, but there are enough passages that ring clear that, for servants of Jesus, we are called to always be ready to testify, meaning, to tell others about Jesus. Jesus tells this to his disciples after telling them that the world will hate them, or, in my case, when they judge you with a higher standard in (what I feel) the hopes that you'll be brought low and also to assail you with questions to try and prove how God either doesn't exist, or is a terrible god.

I think most of us don't want to be in those positions, yet, they are prime opportunities to speak about Jesus. More often than not non-Christians keep their door to talking about religion closed. When they finally do open, even if they're opened for not-so-friendly purposes, Jesus has given us an opportunity to share about why he is so awesome, even if we're on vacation, even if we really just want to enjoy touring an awesome castle in Scotland.

My track record is terrible in this category, but, thanks to God placing an AG Christian in my path to open my heart, I'm going to try harder to witness to Christ more. I hope you'll join me in this.







# **Meet the Pastor**

Pastor Steven Rye started as our interim pastor on June 18th. Here is a little bit about Pastor Steven to help us get to know him better!

I grew up in a northeastern lowa town, not too different from Windom. My father was a Lutheran pastor, and I attended Luther College in Decorah, lowa. Throughout my high school, college, and a year after college, I spent eight summers at Bible camps. I then pursued my theological studies at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, lowa.

While at Wartburg, I married Suzanne, an occupational therapist. She's the daughter of a Swedish Lutheran pastor (Augustana Synod). We met in college outside the door of the intern pastor, not a place known for finding a girlfriend.

We got married during our seminary years, and she accompanied me to my internship in campus ministry at the University of Nebraska in Lincoln.

I was ordained in April 1994.

My ministry career began with serving as the associate pastor in International Falls, Minnesota. Later, I moved to Strawberry Point, Iowa, where I served as a parish pastor in a small rural town. (The entire county had no stoplights.) My campus ministry connections led me to Purdue University, where I served as a campus pastor for 12 years.

As my time in campus ministry came to an end, I began to consider the family cabin near Two Harbors in Minnesota. I felt a strong call to ministry in the Northeastern Minnesota synod.

I've been serving in the Lord of Life Lutheran Church congregation of 800 active members for the past 10 years. In October of last year, I resigned my call there and took a six-month sabbatical.






