## **Pastor's Message**

#### Walking Together in the Call Process

As of the time of this writing, American Lutheran Church of Windom is about to take an important step in our life together. Presumably by the time this newsletter goes out, you will have elected a Call Committee. These siblings in Christ have accepted the responsibility of discerning, with the whole congregation, who God may be calling to serve as our next pastor. Their willingness to serve is a gift, and I encourage you to thank them personally when you have the chance.

Before their work begins in earnest, there are a few steps still to come. The Call Committee will receive orientation and training from Pastor Heather Culuris at the synod office. This training ensures that our process is consistent with the wider church, transparent, and grounded in prayer. It also provides guidance for the committee members about how to carry out their work faithfully and wisely, both in listening to the congregation and in interviewing candidates. This means there will be a short pause between now and when the committee begins its official work. That pause is not wasted time—it's an opportunity for the whole congregation to prepare our hearts.

A few months ago, I invited you into intentional prayer for this season. I want to reiterate and renew that call. The call process is not only about résumés and interviews; it is about discerning God's movement among us. That means prayer is essential. We pray not only for the Call Committee, but for the candidates who may one day become part of our lives, for the leadership of our congregation, and for the Spirit's guidance in the life of this whole church.


I encourage you to set aside a regular time each week to pray for the call process. Maybe it's during your morning devotion, or as you drive to work, or when you sit down at the dinner table. You don't need elaborate words. Something as simple as, "Lord, guide our Call Committee and prepare the pastor you are sending," is enough. Over time, these prayers knit us together as a congregation that trusts in God's leading.

The call process can sometimes feel slow, especially in these early stages when much of the work is preparation. But let us remember that waiting on the Lord is also an act of faith. The psalmist reminds us: "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!" (Psalm 27:14). Our waiting is not passive; it is a time to strengthen our life together, to encourage one another, and to trust that God is indeed at work.

In the months ahead, you will hear updates as the Call Committee begins its work. For now, let us commit ourselves again to prayer, gratitude for those who serve, and patient trust in God's timing. Together, we place our hope in the One who has called us already to be his people.




