Pastor's Message

The Gift of Remembering

Each November, the church invites us to do something that the world rarely slows down enough to do: remember.

All Saints Sunday and Reformation Sunday sit side by side in this season — one reaching back to the courage of reformers who trusted the Spirit to renew the church, the other calling us to remember the faithful saints who have shaped our lives. Together, they remind us that memory itself is a gift — a holy act that keeps us grounded in who we are and whose we are.

When I was a child, I remember sitting in church during the All Saints service, watching as names were read aloud and candles were lit in memory of those who had died. I didn't know most of those names. But I remember feeling the weight and beauty of that moment — the flickering light, the sadness, the sense that somehow these people were still part of us. Even as a child, I sensed that remembering was more than just looking back. It was a way of saying: *Their story continues in us.*

That sense of connection has deepened for me over the years, especially as I've had the privilege of serving here in southwestern Minnesota — not far from where my own ancestors first settled. My great-great grandparents came from the Rjukan area of Norway and arrived in Rock County in 1874. They built a sod home on the prairie, and before they even had a permanent house of their own, they joined with their neighbors to build a wooden church. The church was completed before their permanent, wooden home was.

That story—about their "church first" priorities—has always inspired me. It tells me that from the very beginning, faith for them was not just about survival, it was about community, worship, and gratitude. Their first priority was to build a place where God would be remembered and praised. Every time I drive across these rolling fields or see the spire of a country church rise against the horizon, I think about that legacy.

As we enter this season of remembering, I'm reminded that God's Spirit is still reforming and renewing us. The Reformation wasn't a one-time event in the 1500s, it's a continuing movement of grace that calls the church to be faithful in every generation. To remember is to be re-formed: shaped again by the stories of faith, courage, and love that have brought us this far.

So this November, I invite you to remember with gratitude the saints who have blessed your life, the faith that has shaped our congregation, and the God who continues to make all things new. Light a candle, tell a story, visit a gravesite, or give thanks for the church that still gathers, even in changing times, to proclaim that Christ is Lord of both the living and the dead.

May the gift of remembering fill us with gratitude for the past and hope for the future. For the same Spirit who inspired our ancestors is at work among us still.

Dear friends and partners in ministry,

October 2025

Greetings from Guyana, where I am serving to help the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG) strengthen its leadership development so that its congregations and ministries may flourish. In its focus on leadership development, the church echoes the efforts of the government of Guyana itself, which was elected just last month. Some of you may remember from my previous newsletters that I asked you to join your prayers to those of the church here that the election take place peacefully. During the campaign season, there was anxiety that the same scenes of violence that followed the election of five years ago might be repeated this time. Therefore, the church was taking seriously the urging of 1 Timothy 2:1-2 to pray "for all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life." On September 1, the previous government was re-elected for another five-year term, and I am happy to report that the process was peaceful.

Guyana has a parliamentary system of government, now led by the People's Progressive Party/Civic (PPP/C), with Mohamed Irfaan Ali as President. This government is overseeing what is currently the fastest-growing economy in the world (37%), as a result of significant oil production that began in 2019. Some of the ways that the oil revenue is being spent seem likely to have a positive effect not only on the country as a whole but also on the Lutheran church in particular.

For years, the ELCG has suffered the impact of migration, as many of its members and leaders have moved to countries with higher standards of living. The congregations have shrunk and so has the number of clergy. The Lutheran Lay Academy that I help to coordinate aims to build up a larger leadership base for the church, just at the same time as the government is taking measures to build up a larger base of educated leaders for the country. One of its initiatives, begun in January of this year, is to cover the cost of education for every student accepted at the University of Guyana in any program. When they graduate, these students must remain in Guyana and repay the country for their free education by working for 3-5 years in salaried positions with the Ministry of Public Service in whatever field they have studied. After that, they may work anywhere.

Several of our students in the Lutheran Lay Academy are benefiting from this government initiative. Veronica Sawh-Crandon and Marika Grimmond are completing their studies in nursing and are now working in the hospital, Nathan Balak has completed his studies in communication and has just been given a position in the Office of the Prime Minister, and Adiola Bruce is currently studying science.

With the upturn in economic prospects, some church members who have migrated are returning to Guyana, and there is a positive momentum. One good sign of it is the revival of the Lutheran Men's Ministry of the church, which had been dormant for some time. In the photo, you see the men gathered for their first National Men's Assembly in years, ready to get going again.

With thanksgiving for all of these things, I share with you part of a prayer for the government, from the ELCG's Service Book and Hymnal. Please pray it with us, for this country and for your own. "Good Lord, preserve our nation in justice and honour and continue your blessings to us as a people that we may live together with integrity. Grant health and wisdom to all who bear office in our land... Help them to strive for justice and peace according to your holy will."
