Pastor's Message

Then Noah built an altar to the Lord and took of every clean animal and of every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar.

-Genesis 8:20

One of the awesome things about God, and one of the frustrating things about God, is that God does everything and, while we can participate in what God does, pretty much no matter how you cut it, in the end, God still does everything while we are not needed, nor can we add an iota to anything God is doing or has done.

We Lutherans get a lot of heat for that. We're deemed slackers because if we can do nothing, and if God does everything, then why bother with anything?

The answer is that we bother because we love God.

We see this with Noah. God rescues him from the flood. God gives him the vision, intelligence, strength, and knowhow to build an ark. It is God who tells Noah when to go in. It is God who shuts the door. The ark is a rudderless boat with no propulsion so it is God who steers it. When it lands on a mountain everyone stays on an extra couple of weeks until God says it's safe to come out.

Noah lived in a world that was so thoroughly evil that God was going to wipe out humanity but amidst the ocean of evil, God noticed the few droplets of good that were Noah and his family and God saw them, remembered them, and saved them.

After months of what must have been heck in that ark, Noah steps out into a new world and what can you do for the awesome God who does everything and needs nothing? Noah builds an altar and sacrifices the most precious things he has: living animals that survived (for the record there were seven pairs of clean animals, check out Genesis 7). On a planet with no wildlife, this is a way to show God how much Noah loved God even though God doesn't need it.

Pastors are to attend a theological conference every year and the speaker this year, Professor Powell, talked about his favorite parts of worship. First off, he mentioned that the word worship means the corporate love of something, or, to be more specific, a group of people showing up to love Jesus. He noted that even in worship God hogs most of the action. It is God who forgives us during confession, the scripture readings are lessons *for us*, the sermon is telling us where we're going wrong and how God loves us anyway, it is God who answers prayers, God who comes to us physically and forgives us in communion, and it's God's blessing on us before we leave. God, God, God (Marsha, Marsha, Marsha).

But there are two places in worship, he mentioned, where we creatures get to *do* something. One of them is singing the hymns. That's our way of singing to God our thanks and our love for God. The other part is the offering. Powell talked about the joy he has of being able to give God a present (even though God gave it to him first). The option, like Noah, to say, "I really need this to survive, but I realize that, without you God, I would have never been conceived, let alone survived today, because it is you who gives me everything. It is you who cares for me and knows me. Even if the rest of the world is evil; you still notice me among the billions of others. Therefore, it isn't much Lord, but I love you a lot. I realize how much you do for me every day, and I want to sacrifice something that is costly to me, as Noah did with the few animals left on the planet, to show how much I love you and appreciate you. Thank you God."

All this to say: pay attention to what God is doing in your life. Your home, heat, skills, job, abilities, energy, life, paycheck, friends, every single one of them is a gift to you from God. Every day God sees you, knows you, loves you, and provides for you. May your heart be as joyful as Noah's and Professor Powell's.


Save the Date!

The secretary's report for October was reviewed and approved. MM/S/C (Karen/Keith)

Old Business

- 1. Constitution updates nothing to report
- 2. Holiday Fair Recap the lack of chairperson and committee was felt by ALC staff, the snow was a bit of a hindrance, the meal and sale went well, thankful for the volunteers just could've used more
- 3. 20 year ALC fire anniversary celebration Sunday, January 4, 2026 at service, contact with Pastor Steve Norby will happen via Pastor Steven and if he is not available could he send a recording, form a committee, a brunch or meal, invite the Windom FD to service and brunch, possibly Temple Talk from someone who experienced the fire.

New Business

- 1. 2026 budget work will continue on this to be ready for December Council meeting
- 2. Set dates for annual and mid year meetings 2026 Annual Meeting dates January 18, 2026 with January 25, 2026 as backup, Mid-Year Meeting date July 19, 2026
- 3. Nominating committee update progress is being made filling positions and 11 spots are still needed to be filled
- 4. Living Nativity flyers need to be printed
- 5. Pastor Adam's Housing allowance A motion was made and approved to designate a housing allowance of \$43,120 for Pastor Adam Roberts from his current compensation for IRS purposes. MM/S/C (Kevin/Brandon)
- 6. Other Call Committee is done with training and is actively starting the search/interview process for ALC's open lead pastor position

- 3. <u>Discipleship/Marketing & Stewardship</u> discussed 2026 budget, global mission opportunities, flyers to hand out during Living Nativity, dementia care speakers moved to 11/23/25, baked and sent out cookies to past graduates, reviewed a letter from Carolyn Schneider in Guyana
- 4. Budget & Finance salary adjustments were approved, 12/2/2025 will meet to create the upcoming 2026 budget
- 5. Properties tree removal occurred, van checklist was made for longer trips, Living Nativity needs were reviewed
- 6. Christian Education recapped all the youth October events, Living Nativity staff shifts reviewed, Christmas program prepping is well underway
- 7. Youth & Family recapped the youth led event for October, October Boo Bingo was successful, Holiday Fair raised \$1600 for the youth via the nearly new sale, quilting for graduates continues, 21 youth signed up to attend the Junior High Youth Gathering in Willmar on November 21st, a team is reviewing/updating the Child Protection Policy for insurance
- 8. <u>Church in Society</u> reviewed Holiday Fair in which \$1179 was made, planning and prepping for the Sogge Home Donation Tree which will be live on Nov. 22, trick-or-treating went well with 86 kids stopping for treats
- 9. GLOW Bible study Thursday at 2 PM, planning for upcoming charity donations

The council has voted to update the constitution to the newest model at the upcoming annual meeting. The changes are listed below. Words with a strikethrough are taken out and underlined words are added. None of the changes affects how ALC works. Most are grammatical or structural.

- C1.02. For the purpose of this constitution and the accompanying bylaws [and continuing resolutions], the congregation of __(insert.full legal name)_ is hereinafter designated as "this congregation."
- *C5.04. This congregation or the Congregation Council shall elect from among its the voting members of the congregation laypersons to serve as voting members of the Synod Assembly as well as persons to represent it at meetings of any conference, cluster, coalition, or other area subdivision of which it is a member. The number of persons to be elected by this congregation and other qualifications shall be as prescribed in guidelines established by the (busert name of synod) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- *C7.03. If the voting members of this congregation present at a legally called and conducted special meeting of this congregation vote to relate transfer to another Lutheran church body, title to property shall continue to reside in this congregation, provided the process for termination of relationship in *C6.05. has been followed. Before this congregation takes action to relate transfer to another Lutheran church body, it shall consult with representatives of the linsert name of symod).
- *C9.02. Only This congregation may call as a pastor only:
 - a member of the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
 - a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament who has been recommended for this
 congregation by the synod bishop.

may be called as a pastor of this congregation.

- *C9.03. Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America,
 - Every minister of Word and Sacrament shall:
 - 8) speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, <u>proclaiming God's love for the world</u>, advocating dignity, justice, and equity for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among the nations, caring for the marginalized, and embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse populations.
- *C9.06. At a time of pastoral vacancy, an interim pastor <u>shall-may</u> be appointed by the bishop of the synod with the consent of this congregation or the Congregation Council.
- *C9.15. Under special circumstances, subject to the approval of the synod bishop and the concurrence of this congregation, a minister of Word and Sacrament of a church body with which the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America officially has established a relationship of full communion may serve temporarily as pastor of this congregation under a contract between this congregation and the pastor in a form proposed by the synod bishop and approved by this congregation.
- *C9.22. Only This congregation may call as a deacon only.
 - a member of the roster of Ministers of Word and Service of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
 - b. a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Service who has been recommended for this congregation by the synod bishop.

may be called as a deacon of this congregation.

- *C9.23. Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, every minister of Word and Service shall:
 - Speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, <u>proclaiming God's love for</u> the world, advocating dignity, justice, and equity for all people, working for peace and reconciliation

among the nations, caring for the marginalized, and embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse nonulations:


- C10.02. A special Congregation Meeting may be called by the [senior] pastor, the Congregation Council, or the president of this congregation, and shall be called by the president of this congregation upon the written request of [mimber] [percent] of the voting members. The president of the Congregation Council shall call a special meeting upon request of the synod bishop. The call for each special meeting shall specify the purpose for which it is to be held, and no other business shall be transacted.
- *C15.01. Persistent and public denial of the Christian faith, willful or criminal conduct grossly unbecoming a member of the Church of Christ, continual and intentional interference with the ministry of this congregation, or willful and repeated harassment or defamation of member(s) of this congregation is sufficient cause for discipline of a member. Prior to disciplinary action, reconciliation and repentance will be attempted following Matthew 18:15-17, proceeding through these successive steps, as necessary:
 - a). private counsel and admonition by the pastor.
 - b) censure and admonition by the pastor in the presence of two or three witnesses,
 - c). written referral of the matter by the Congregation Council to the vice president of the synod, who will refer it to a consultation panel drawn from the Consultation Committee of the symod, and
 - d>_ written referral of the matter by the consultation panel to the Committee on Discipline of the synod. If, for any reason, the pastor is unable to administer the admonitions required by paragraphs a. and b. hereof, those steps may be performed by another pastor chosen by the Executive Committee of the Congregation Council.
- *C15.11. When there is disagreement between or among factions within this congregation on a substantive issue which cannot be resolved by the parties, members of this congregation may petition the synod bishop for consultation after informing the president [vice president] of this congregation of their intent to do so. The synod bishop shall seek a timely resolution of the dispute. If the issue relates directly to the pastor, the bishop may begin the process in #814.18 *C9.05.d. In all other matters, if the bishop's consultation fails to resolve the issue, the bishop shall refer the matter to the Consultation Committee of the synod, which shall undertake efforts to find an appropriate solution. If the Consultation Committee's efforts fail to resolve the dispute, the entire matter shall be referred to the Synod Council for adjudication by whatever process the Council deems necessary. The Synod Council's decision shall be final.
- *C16.02. An amendment to this constitution, proposed under *C16.01., shall:
 - a. be approved at any legally called meeting of this congregation by a majority vote of those voting members present and voting; and
 - b. be ratified without change unchanged at the next regular meeting of this congregation by a twothirds vote of those voting members present and voting.
- *C'20.04. Any one of the congregations of the parish may terminate their relationship with the pastor as provided in #\$14.18 *C9.05 d. of the synod constitution of the synod named in *C6.01. In such case, the other congregation(s) of the same parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.
- *C'20.05 Any one of the congregations of the parish may terminate their relationship with a minister of Word and Service as provided in #814.43-*C9.25.d. of the synod constitution of the synod named in *C6.01. In such case, the other congregation(s) of the same parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.

If the paster is the president of the congregation, the congregation may consider giving the vice president the authority to call a special meeting.
