Pastor's Message

In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God.

-Colossians 1:3-6

Since early January we have been actively searching for another pastor and for months the synod has had zero interims available and zero pastors looking for a call in our area. Then, all of the sudden recently, we've received four applicants.

The process is that I talk to them first, then the call committee does a zoom meeting, and if all that goes well we invite them out for an in-person interview and show them around.

When I give them a call I have a handful of objectives. The ELCA can be fairly diverse theologically (LGBTQ and Universalism being the most disagreed upon) and I want to make sure that whenever one of us preaches, the other isn't going to preach the opposite the next week.

I also want to make sure that we don't have someone who's going to constantly stir the hornet's nest by either being ultra-conservative or a social justice warrior. Issues of the day need to be talked, preached, and prayed about, but there is a line where it becomes hostile.

The last part of the weeding process is to make sure they get a sense of how our congregations work, in that, it's not a pastor telling everyone what to do, but instead, we have many gifted leaders and workers who need to be free to lead and work without interference; who instead need support and uplifting. I believe we need a pastor who's going to rally us, encourage us, offer new insights, call us out when needed, hold us accountable, and also, have a vision of their own on how they might plug in; not top down, but side by side.

The last part of the call is the easiest: bragging our congregations up. Yes, I say, these congregations will work you harder than most congregations out there, but the beauty is they both work just as hard. You'll be coming into a place with an excellent and experienced staff that cares deeply and is great at their jobs. Some of the biggest perks most calls don't have is a worship coordinator and a Youth & Family Coordinator.

You'll be walking into a place that has good problems, like finding out we have kids about to be confirmed who've never been baptized because they came here as older youth or teens because of friends and the great events we have going on here.

Whereas rural ELCA congregations are predominantly heavily conservative, our congregations are spread all over the middle; few being far left or right. Furthermore, we have an atmosphere where people do disagree theologically on some issues, but still love those they disagree with and are happy they're here.

You're going to a place where there's a variety of worship styles and both places have the sweet sound of kids making noises. Both places have worshippers of all ages. You'll be entering a town that has a heart for immigrants and back-breaking endurance to help in times of need (flood, pork plant closing, etc.).

And, I'm sure this isn't helpful in the least, but these are the only congregations I've been at that pay guidelines every year (most hire you at guidelines and you won't get a raise for a couple of years).

Bethany and ALC, you're rocking it, you're in a great position to attract great pastors, may God continue to give us patience and endurance while we wait.

Dear Friends and Partners in Ministry,

April 2026

As we said in church today, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" – and we rise in him from whatever dark places have held us. That is a promise from God, who always keeps promises. Just yesterday, Holy Saturday, I heard two of the students of the Lutheran Lay Academy of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG) preaching this promise at a memorial service of thanksgiving for the life of the late Rev. Leroy Nicholson. Since my primary responsibility here in Guyana is to strengthen the ELCG's Lay Academy in order to prepare more people more thoroughly for leadership in the congregations, their fine and faithful leadership made me thank God that the work is bearing fruit!

I celebrated Easter Sunday with two congregations of the ELCG: St. Luke, in the small town of Philippi; and St. James, in the equally small town of Whim. Both congregations are part of St. Michael parish, where the parish council is led by

Since there are presently not enough leaders to minister to all the congregations in all thirteen of the church's parishes, I have recently been given responsibility for preaching and administering the Lord's Supper in four parishes, rotating between them on the first, third, and fifth Sundays of the month. I am in St. Michael parish on the first Sunday, traveling to St. Barnabas, St.

Luke, and St. James congregations, one after the other. I am in St. Matthew and Ascension parishes on the third Sunday, where I start at Holy Communion congregation (in St. Matthew parish) and then alternate between King of Glory and Ascension congregations (in Ascension parish). Whenever there is a fifth Sunday in the month, I am at St. John parish, which contains the three congregations of St. Peter, St. Bartholomew, and St. John. (While I normally keep my newsletters to two pages, I have added a third page this time, with a map of all the Lutheran congregations in Guyana in 1969, highlighting the ones I visit as a supply preacher. Some of the congregations on the map have closed since 1969.)

I will introduce you to just a couple of the congregations that I visit as supply preacher. The last time I was at Holy Communion church, it was Lent, and in this photo, you see a faithful member preparing the sanctuary for worship that day. Holy Communion is in the village of Victoria, a suburb of the capital city, Georgetown. The village was established just after the emancipation of the enslaved Africans in 1838, when a community of formerly enslaved people pooled their hard-won resources and bought the land in order to start their own small businesses. It must have taken enormous courage and industry.



Every other month on the third Sunday, I rush out of Holy Communion after worship to make it (always late!) to King of Glory, about 50 minutes away. I am thankful for a new highway that enables me to avoid driving through Georgetown to get to the new high-span bridge over the Demerara River that takes me to West Coast Demerara, where King of Glory is located.



There are times at King of Glory when no adults come to the service, but there are always three committed teens there, cleaning the church building and setting up for worship, just in case. If no adults come, we have Sunday School together. Here they are: Emily, Ashton, and Ethan, on the day when we studied the story about Jesus teaching his disciples to serve one another instead of competing with one another for glory. I told them that I think cleaning the church, as they do, is a good example of such service.

While I cannot introduce you to all the congregations, I hope this sampling gives you a glimpse into the life of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana, your brothers and sisters in the risen Christ.
